- A **STATEMENT** from the head of the organization submitting the proposal indicating approval of the project. Any other required letters of support or approval for your project should be placed after this statement.
- A **PROPOSAL not to exceed four pages** in length that details the following:
 1. A statement of why the grant is needed in this region.
 2. A description of what the grant will be used to accomplish.
 - ③ 3. A time-line outlining the beginning and completion of major project activities and descriptions of each.
 4. A list of the individuals who will implement and manage the grant along with a brief description of their qualifications relating to this project. (No resumes, please.)
 5. A description of how the grant relates to your organization's long-range planning and priorities.
 6. An explanation of how the effectiveness of the grant will be evaluated, and the name and address of the evaluator.
