As a national, public institution, the East-West Center (Center) works in partnership each year with more than 700 organizations throughout the United States and in the Asia and the Pacific region. In 2009, President Barack Obama announced the selection of Hawai'i as the United States site to host the November 2011 Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Leaders Meeting. The Center collaborated with the APEC Hawai'i Host Committee to host the agenda-setting conference with academic and government officials and others in preparation for the APEC 2011 Hawai'i Conference and provided offices as well as served as facilitator for the Host Committee The Center provides collaborative research, education, seminars and outreach, and other programs, that bring together Americans and counterparts from Asia and the Pacific to work together in an atmosphere of academic freedom on issues of mutual importance. The exchange and dialogue programs of the Center are typically multi-country, region-wide activities involving Americans as full participants. This past year, approximately 4,066 participants took part in Center activities throughout the region. The following is a highlight of the program activities during the year. RESEARCH PROGRAM. The multidisciplinary Research Program addresses issues of contemporary policy significance in a comparative context, focusing on challenges of common concern to the Asia Pacific region and the U.S. The Program is a source of rigorous and critical analysis and regional expertise in support of all the Center's programs. The Center's collaborative research and policy analysis promotes better relations and understanding among the nations of the region and the U.S. and contributes to both capacity and institution building. The Program is policy focused and aimed at providing timely information for decision makers. It addresses critical environmental issues, decision making under conditions of uncertainty, critical health issues such as HIV/AIDS and emerging infectious disease, trade and economic development, and governance and human rights issues Computer software models developed by the Program are improved and modified to continue to enable national health programs throughout the region and beyond to analyze their local HIV/AIDS epidemics and develop effective policy responses. Studies conducted with colleagues are trying to determine whether highly pathogenic avian influenza caused by the H5N1 virus, as measured in terms of poultry deaths, can be associated with transitions that occur as societies evolve from one relative state of development to new states. Other Program activities included the Annual Summer Institute in International Humanitarian Law and Human Rights to train international law professionals from the region on women's and children's rights, training for judges, police, and prosecutors in Papua New Guinea, continued monitoring and reporting on the proceedings of the United Nations Khmer Rouge Tribunal in Cambodia a follow-up project to the successful "Facing Justice" weekly television series of Cambodian reports about the proceedings in the second Khmer Rouge trial which garnered up to 3 million viewers each week or 20 percent of Cambodia's population, and the Pacific Regional Integrated Science and Assessment program to help Pacific communities cope with climate change and policy makers to understand real-world climate impacts and the need for usable climate information

EDUCATION PROGRAM The Center offers educational opportunities for future leaders in the Asia Pacific region and the U.S. in an era of increased social, economic and technological interdependence. Graduate degree scholarships and certificate programs prepare students and professionals to address the challenges and complexities of the world's most dynamic region. Undergraduate degree scholarships build and strengthen the base of future leaders in East Timor and the South Pacific. The Program also provided professional development programs for educators to strengthen the capacity of individuals and institutions to cultivate in their students an appreciation and understanding of the histories, cultures, and contemporary issues of the Asia Pacific The Program accomplishments include continued training of future leaders in the Asia Pacific Leadership Program (APLP), college educators through the Asian Studies Development Program (ASDP), and K-12 teachers through the AsiaPacificEd Program. In FY 2011, 587 students from 63 countries participated in the Center's undergraduate and graduate training and scholarship program that is unlike individual scholarship programs, since these students are instilled with a common learning experience centered on U.S.-Asia Pacific issues and community service. The APLP staff organized an environmental leadership program developed largely for undergraduate students from Asia and the Pacific islands, the program provided a rich introduction in how U.S. society grapples at the national and local level with the complex issues related to environmental stewardship The ASDP launched an Undergraduate International Studies and Foreign Language demonstration project on Chinese language and culture together with colleagues from American colleges and universities. The Student for Leaders on Global Environmental Issues (SUSI) project develops young leaders from the Pacific, Southeast Asia, and the Middle East with the ability to build and maintain resilient communities in light of global environmental challenges. The inaugural China-U S Education Exchange was launched with the goal of elevating elementary and secondary (K-12) school leadership and teaching in both countries through a cross-cultural investigation of best-practice teaching and learning. Developed in cooperation with the Chinese Ministry of Education, these international professional development and exchange opportunities reflect that country's effort to improve K-12 teaching and learning and equalize access to quality education in China

SEMINARS AND OUTREACH PROGRAMS The Center has developed the most extensive program of trans-Pacific journalist and editor exchanges in the region, with exchanges for the Asia Pacific region as a whole (Jefferson Fellows), for Islamic journalists and American journalists (the Senior Journalist Seminar), health journalists, and bilateral programs with Japanese, Korean, and Chinese journalists. The Center also offers short-term policy seminars where senior and emerging leaders and business people from a variety of sectors focus on issues of regional concern. The program is developed around a thematic focus and provides participants with an opportunity to strengthen their understanding of Asia Pacific-U.S. developments and challenges, build a regional network and to become leaders with a more international perspective. Thirteen journalists from Pakistan and America visited each other's country as part of the East-West Center's inaugural Pakistan-U.S. Journalists Exchange. The journalists participated in focused discussions surrounding the complex U.S.-Pakistan relationship and issues facing the media in both countries. East-West Center in Washington supports the Center's overall mission through direct work with U.S. policymakers and opinion leaders in the nation's capital. It facilitates understanding of the U.S. policy process by Asia Pacific participants through direct interaction with U.S. policymakers. The successful Asia Matters for America/America Matters for Asia initiative to organize and disseminate information, data, and analysis on the US-Asia interactions added four publications covering ASEAN, Japan, Korea, and Australia

It organized the "State of the Pacific Dialogue" the first U.S.-based regional track 1.5 meeting for the Pacific that brought together senior representatives from government, academia, and civil society. Participants undertook a review of regional development across Oceania and analysis of emerging trends likely to shape the policy environment in the region with a goal to improve understanding of the contemporary regional dynamics while examining ideas that may help manage differences. Auxiliary enterprises provide conference facilities and dormitory housing for students and conference participants that participate in the East-West Center's programs.
