1. THE 200 CLUB STORY:

The story of the 200 Clubs began back in 1950 when Detroit Patrolman Andreas Mellert was shot in the back as he escorted a charge to a patrol car. He left a young widow, who was shortly due to go to the hospital for her first child. As a widow, she would receive \$4,000 and a pension of \$170 a month.

William Packer, who had helped other policemen's families, decided to write to 100 of his friends urging them to donate to a fund for the policeman's wife. Andreas Mellert had been killed November 17, 1950. His posthumous child, Kathleen, was born New Year's Eve. By this time his widow, Esther, left the hospital; Packer, Detroit News columnist Jack Carlisle and Police Commissioner George Boos presented her a bankbook with \$7,800. Later, the 200 Club set up a scholarship fund of \$1000 for Kathleen.

Other widows were helped, but Packer began to question why a permanent club wasn't formed with a standing treasury, rather than individual efforts each time a crisis arose. Such a club was incorporated in the summer of 1952 with dues of \$200 a year earmarked solely for widows and dependents. The first membership list of 100 began to grow to 200, 250, and more Now there are over 500 members.

Other clubs have sprung up across the nation Some are known by other names: 200 Clubs, Shield Clubs, Bluecoats, Backstoppers and the like; but all share the same common goal of providing benefits to widows and children of slain officers. A number of clubs give awards to officers who exhibit exemplary action in the course of their duties and today the work of the 200 Club continues to expand



Superintendent of the New Jersey State Police

On Monday June 2, 2003, Colonel Joseph R Fuentes was selected by Governor James McGreevey to become the 14th Superintendent of the New Jersey State Police

Superintendent Fuentes enlisted in the State Police in January 1978, as a member of the 93A Class. He has served the Division of State Police throughout the state, including assignments as a general road duty Trooper in Central and Southern New Jersey, and an instructor at the Sea Girt Academy. He also was a supervisor with the FBI/NJSP Joint Terrorism Task Force, Narcotics. Units, and the Street Gang Unit. Prior to being named Acting Superintendent, he was assigned as the Chief of the Intelligence Bureau, overseeing nine units within the Intelligence Section.

The recipient of numerous awards, Superintendent Fuentes has been recognized by the U.S. Justice Department, Drug Enforcement Administration, and in 1993 was a co-recipient of the New Jersey State Police Trooper of the Year award.

Superintendent Fuentes earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Kean College of New Jersey in 1977, a Master of Arts in Criminal Justice from John Jay College of Criminal Justice, New York in 1992, and a Doctorate of Philosophy in Criminal Justice from City University of New York in 1998 in 2006, Colonel Fuentes was appointed General Chair of the State and Provincial Division of the IACP

Superintendent Fuentes resides in Bergen County with his wife, Eileen.

On January 25th, 2010 at 3.55 am the Branchburg Police received a call from an employee of the Quick Chek located on Route 22. The employee reported that there was an individual inside the store acting in a suspicious manner. The employee described the individual as black male approximately 6.1" wearing a inthigh sylep jacket and black cap Officer Sloven Conce was the first officer to arrive on the scene. Upon his arrival, Officer Cronce, wisely parked his potrol vehicle at the rear of the building and approached on foot. This procedure allowed him to view what was taking place inside the store and possibly prevent a hostage. situation

Officer Crance observed the individual, later identified as Lloyd Woodson, picking up items and putting them back on the shelf Officer Crance subsequently entered the Quick Chek and walked past Mr. Woodson. Once inside the store Officer Crance observed a large bulge under Mr Woodson's jacket which gave the appearance he was armed and possibly wearing a

At his point Officer Cronce decided to let Mr Woodson think his presence in the Quick Chek was routine. This quick thinking kept Mr Woodson from panicking and causing potential narm to the civilians present

Differe Concernoved toward the coffee area in an effort to keep some type of cover between him and Mr Woodson. This also would allow Mr. Woodson a free exit path from the store and possibly remove the threat from the civilians. During this time Officer Cronce was oble to speck briefly with the store manager to ascertain if anyone else was with Mr. Woodson At this point, Mr. Woodson ran out of the store. Officer Cronce was unable to detect Mr. Woodson's direction of travel and did not know if he fled in an awaining vehicle. Officer Cronce radioed Officer Robert Farrigan and Officer Robert Stober, who were responding as back up, that the suspect fled the store and that he appeared armed and wearing a bulletproof vest

The three officers began to search the immediate area on foot in an effort to locate the suspect Several minutes later Officer Cronce observed Mr. Woodson lying in the hedges near the Regency Taller Park He drew his service weapon and ordered Mr. Woodson to show his hands. Mr. Woodson would not comply add after several commands he still did not comply had mistractions of Officer's Cronce, Faringan and Staber, Mr. Woodson rose to his feet He was ordered to the ground and would not comply. Mr. Woodson then ran with the officers in pushed in the foot pursuit for thirty yards officer Faringan was able to tip Mr. Woodson causing him to fall to the ground Mr. Woodson continued to fight the officers. During the struggle they observed a rifle under his jacket in an attempt to control Mr. Woodson. Officer Stober and Officer Cronce sprayed him with OC pepper spray This had minimal effect on him and he continued to fight. After several minutes of struggling with Mr. Woodson the officers were able to secure him in handcuffs.




