

## **Grantmaking Priorities (2012)**

### **What the Thorpe Foundation supports**

The Thorpe Foundation supports 501c3 non-profit organizations located in and serving the Minneapolis and the western Minneapolis metro suburbs of the Twin Cities. The Foundation is interested in supporting organizations or programs or projects which address the following populations and community needs:

#### **Youth**

The Thorpe Foundation seeks to create opportunities for youth ages 8-18 to achieve more productive lives. Special consideration will be given to those organizations that serve economically disadvantaged youth.

#### **The Foundation supports organizations and programs that:**

- **Engage Youth In The Arts** including organizations and programs which expose youth to the arts and enhance the creative process;
- **Encourage Character Development** including organizations and programs committed to teaching the values of trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship;
- **Support Academic And Social Development** including academic support programs for middle school students that provide core academic services, scholarships and school based academic and social support services and out-of-school time enrichment opportunities that provide a variety of academic and non-academic learning opportunities for youth outside of the regular school day;
- **Provide Safety And Support To Youth** including short term community based counseling services and child abuse prevention and intervention programs.

#### **Elderly**

The Thorpe Foundation fosters the vital aging of seniors through support of services which help them to live independently. The Foundation will give special consideration to services which address the needs of economically disadvantaged seniors, immigrant seniors and the frail elderly.

#### **The Foundation supports organizations and programs that:**

- **Provide Transportation Services** including door to door services;
- **Assist seniors in remaining in their own homes** including nutrition programs that deliver meals or groceries to the home, chore assistance, home visiting to reduce social isolation, and in-home health care options;

- **Educate seniors about housing options** including affordable housing and assisted living options;
- **Provide social and recreational opportunities for seniors** including programs offered by senior centers and other community organizations and arts organizations that help seniors connect with others and continue life long learning.

**Note:** In 2012, the Thorpe Foundation will continue a change made in 2011 to accept versus invite proposals for elder funding. Proposals must be received by the September 1, 2012 deadline.

**Where Does the Thorpe Foundation Make Grants?**

The Thorpe Foundation makes grants to organizations and programs serving the Minneapolis metro area and the western Minneapolis metro suburbs.

**What Types of Grants Does the Thorpe Foundation Make?**

The Thorpe Foundation is most likely to make general operating or program support grants.

**What the Thorpe Foundation Does Not Support**

**The Foundation does not:**

1. Make multi-year grants or fund individuals;
2. Make grants in the east metro area, greater Minnesota, or outside the State of Minnesota;
3. Make grants through fiscal agents;
4. Support endowment drives, conferences, seminars, tours, or fundraising events;
5. Support organizations with operating budgets over \$2 million;
6. Support organizations with no paid staff.

## **Application Procedures & Deadlines for 2012**

### **Procedures**

#### **Requirements for All Applicants**

- Applications for **Youth funding** are accepted from organizations that fall within the current grant guidelines and meet all other requirements;
- Applications for **Elderly funding** are accepted from organizations that fall within the current grant guidelines and meet all other requirements;
- The Thorpe Foundation will only accept one proposal annually from any organization;
- Applications will only be considered from organizations that have annual operating budgets of \$2 million or less and have at least one paid employee;
- Proposals must be postmarked, hand delivered or e-mailed ([application@jamesrthorpefoundation.org](mailto:application@jamesrthorpefoundation.org)) by the deadline (listed below) and include the following::
  1. The Thorpe Foundation application cover form.
  2. A proposal narrative of seven pages or less which describes the organization, including its purpose, services to the community, size and make up of its constituency, and staff qualifications.
  3. List of your board of directors with affiliations.
  4. Operating budget for the organization's current fiscal year, **including sources of revenue and expenses**.
  5. If seeking project or program support, a budget for the project, **including sources of revenue and expenses**.
  6. Year-to-date financials.
  7. A list of **secured and pending** foundation and corporate contributors with amounts for the current fiscal year and a list of secured sources for the most recently completed fiscal year.
  8. An audited financial statement or 990 for the mostly recently completed fiscal year.
  9. A copy of your IRS 501c3 tax exempt letter.
  10. If you received funding in 2011, a final report on your grant

#### **Proposal Format**

The James R. Thorpe accepts the Minnesota Common Grant Application Form, however all applicants must submit the James R. Thorpe Foundation Application Cover Form.

Please submit one, unbound copy of the proposal. Applications are accepted by e-mail. Please submit electronic applications as a single PDF.

### **Deadlines**

In 2012, the applications deadlines will be:

- **Youth funding proposals: March 1, 2012**
- **Elderly funding proposals: September 1, 2012**

Funding requests **must be postmarked on or before the respective funding area proposal deadline**. Applications delivered or postmarked after March 1 will not be considered.

Proposals will be accepted by regular mail, hand delivery or e-mail. Hand delivered or e-mailed proposals must be received in the Foundation's office by 4:30 PM on the day of the application deadline.

In 2012, the September 1 deadline falls on a Saturday. This will not change the Foundation's procedures. Applications will need to be postmarked or received by e-mail or delivered to the office by September 1, 2012 to receive consideration.

### **Board Meeting Schedule and Decision-making Timelines**

The Thorpe Foundation Board of Directors will meet in May to consider Youth proposals and November to consider Elderly proposals. Applicants will be notified within four weeks of the Board meeting of the Foundation's decision.
