Jennings American Legion Hospital, Inc. is a not for profit hospital which provides inpatient, outpatient, and emergency care services to the general public. The Hospital is located in Jennings, Louisiana and provides services primarily for residents of Southwestern Louisiana. Admitting physicians are primarily practitioners in the local area.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- A. Basis of Accounting The records of the hospital are maintained on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with American Hospital Association recommendations.
- B. Allowance for uncollectibles Estimated uncollectible patient accounts receivable are based on the hospitals prior experience with bad debts and estimated contractual allowances and managed care discounts in account receivable balances.
- C. Inventories Inventories are valued at the lower of cost or market (on the first-in, first out method).
- D. Property, Plant and Equipment These assets are stated at cost. The plant and equipment are depreciated on the straight-line method over their estimated useful lives. Capital expenditures above \$ 1,000 are capitalized. The following is a schedule of activity in the major classifications:

- E. Use of estimates The preparation of Jennings American Legion Hospital's financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.
- F. Investments are carried at fair market value.

2. RECEIVABLES

- A. Patient Accounts Receivable Patient accounts receivable reflect total amounts due from individuals and third parties.
 - Trade receivables are normally written off when they are commercial insurance accounts over 120 days or are considered non active private pay status and over 120 days old.
- B. Estimated third-party payor settlements (Medicare and Medicaid) During the billing cycle Medicare and Medicaid patients are billed at normal rates. Each month an estimate is made as to the actual amounts due from the third party based on expected Medicare and Medicaid reimbursements. As payments are received patient accounts are credited and adjustments to amounts in allowance for uncollectibles are recorded. After current cost reports are completed and pay schedules updated, differences in estimates are settled. Amounts in this asset account reflect estimated settlement due to the hospital.

4. CAPITAL

The hospital is a non-profit corporation, organized under the laws of the State of Louisiana, without any capital stock.

5. INCOME TAXES

The hospital is exempt from Federal Income Tax under Section 501(c) 3 of the 1954 Internal Revenue Code.

6. COSTODIAL RISK

Deposits and investments that are uninsured and unregistered, with securities held by the counterparty, or by its trust department or agent, but not in the Hospital's name are considered to have custodial risk.

The Hospital also had deposits in excess of FDIC insurance limits in the amount of \$1,825,226 at November 30, 2011 and \$2,885,411 at November 30, 2010.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

7. COMPENSATED ABSENCES

Vested paid time off time is accrued at current pay rates. The amount accrued at November 30, 2011 and November 30, 2010 respectively was \$ 615,075 and \$ 557,706.

8. NET PATIENT REVENUE

Patient revenues on the financial statements at November 30, 2011 and November 30, 2010 are stated net of estimated third party contractual adjustments and other discounts and allowances.

9. EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

The hospital offers its employees a cafeteria plan under IRC section 125 and purchased annuities under reduced salary agreements under IRC section 403(b). The Hospital has a safe harbor 401K plan for which it matches 100% of the first 3 % of deferred compensation plus 50% of the next 2% of deferred compensation. The 401k matching contribution expense for the year ended November 30, 2011 and November 30, 2010 respectively was \$ 330,546 and \$ 352,718.

10. ESTIMATED THIRD-PARTY PAYOR SETTLEMENTS

MEDICARE & MEDICAID

Estimated third-party payor settlements (Medicare and Medicaid) - During the billing cycle Medicare and Medicaid patients are billed at normal rates. Each month an estimate is made as to the actual amounts due from the third party based on expected Medicare and Medicaid reimbursements. As payments are received patient accounts are credited and adjustments to amounts in allowance for uncollectibles are recorded. After current cost reports are completed and pay schedules updated, differences in estimates are settled. Amounts in the resulting asset or liability account reflect estimated settlement due to/from the hospital. The amounts of these estimates are significant and it is possible that actual results could differ from those estimated in the near future.

11. CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT RISK

The Hospital is located in Jennings, Louisiana. The Hospital grants credit without collateral to its patients, most of who are local residents and are insured under third-party payor agreements.

As disclosed in note 6 the Hospital had deposits in major financial institutions that exceeded Federal Depository Insurance limits. These financial institutions have a strong credit rating and management believes that credit risk related to these deposits is minimal.

12. CONTINGENCIES

Provision For Possible Overpayments – During the year ended November 30, 2011 and November 30, 2010 the Hospital received Disproportionate Share Payments for unreimbursed cost based on the States fiscal year, which does not coincide with the Hospital's fiscal year. These disbursements are normally based on prior year cost reports. The Hospital has set this provision for possible future refund demands due to the method prescribe for the allocation of such funds.

19. OTHER OFF BALANCE SHEET RISK

The hospital purchases commercial insurance to reduce the risk of loss due to liability claims and loss due to physical damage to fixed assets should they occur.

20. <u>LITIGATION</u>

Jennings American Legion Flospital, Inc. has been named in several medical malpractice claims. Management believes that these claims, if found to be valid, will fall completely under the coverage of their insurance.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

21. SFAS NO. 133, "ACCOUNTING FOR DERIVATIVE INSTRUMENTS AND HEDGING ACTIVITIES"

Effective December 1, 2000, Jennings American Legion Hospital, Inc. adopted SFAS 133, and its corresponding amendments under SFAS 138. SFAS 133 requires the Hospital to measure all derivatives, including certain derivatives embedded in other contracts, at fair value and to recognize them in the Balance Sheet as an asset or liability, depending on the Hospital's rights or obligations under the applicable derivative contract. For derivatives designated as fair value hedges, the changes in the fair value of both the derivative instrument and the hedged item are recorded in the appropriate expense or income account (net). For derivatives designated as cash flow hedges, the effective portions of changes in fair value of the derivative are reported in other comprehensive income (loss) and are subsequently reclassified into the appropriate expense or income account when the hedged item affects such account. Changes in fair value of derivative instruments not designated as hedging instruments and ineffective portions of hedges are recognized in other income (expense)-net in the period incurred.

During the year ended November 30, 2001 the Hospital designated an interest rate swap as a cash flow hedge. The swap was entered into to fix rates on a variable rate loan at 5.78%. The hedge was active until June 1, 2011.

22. CHARITY CARE

Jennings American Legion Hospital, Inc. provides services to patients who meet the criteria of its charity care policy at amounts less than its established rates. The criteria for charity care consider family income, family size, and other sources of expected payments. Patient accounts were reduced by \$ 844,752 in 2011 and \$ 600,470 in 2010 for charges for services identified as charity care. Current policy requires patients to apply and provide information to enable the Hospital to determine charity status. Patients who may qualify are not identified unless they apply, and as such are stated as non-collectible rather than charity care.

23. KEY EMPLOYEE INSURANCE

The Hospital maintains key employee insurance on executive officers in the approximate amount of \$ 500,000. The cash surrender values of this policy is reported as dedicated funds.

25. DEFERRED CHARGES

The deferred charges included in Assets Whose Use Is Limited are expenses for retaining physicians which are associated future hospital revenues. They will be amortized over the applicable contract periods.

25. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Hospital evaluated its records as of March 15, 2012 for subsequent events through this date and the Hospital is not aware of any subsequent events which would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.
