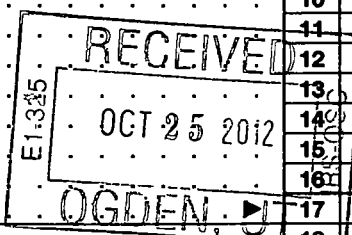

PART V, Question 35:

The Rachel Corrie Foundation for Peace and Justice holds public forums, lectures, and conferences from time to time and also periodically attends the functions of other groups to educate the public on peace and justice issues. At these events the foundation often has a table with brochures and other literature about the Foundation and about various peace and justice issues. In addition, to educate the public about the economy of the Middle East and to attract people to our table for the free information, at these tables we often sell olive oil made by small farmers in the Middle East and distributed in the U.S. on a fair trade basis. We also carry several books related to peace and justice issues, the most expensive of which is about \$14, but we do ask that the public pay for these more expensive items, as the foundation does not have the resources to give them away. Sales are made away from the foundation's office by unpaid volunteers. While the gross profit from this activity (\$3,300) is above \$1,000, the activity is exempt from tax both because it is related to the foundation's exempt purpose and because the sales are done by unpaid volunteers. "An unrelated trade or business does not include a trade or business: 1. In which substantially all the work is done for the organization without compensation..."
