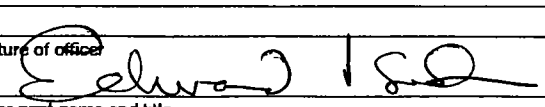

The purposes for which said corporation is formed are the following: (a) of rendering pecuniary aid to its members, their families and beneficiaries of members and their families; (b) of rendering mutual aid and assistance to its sick, disabled and needy members and their families; (c) of promoting social and intellectual intercourse among its members and their families; and (d) of promoting and conducting educational, charitable, religious, social welfare, war relief and welfare, and public relief work.

The organization is covered by a its by laws which states the charter for which the organization was founded and the governing rules.

Within this charter the by laws include how the governing body, elected officials and board of directors, are determined.

The Board of Directors are elected by the membership. They have executive authority and general supervision responsibility to faithfully execute and administer all activities associated with operation of the organization. They have full executive authority to make, alter and and regulations for the government, management, discipline and control of the Scituate Knights of Columbus.

The board of directors on an annual basis make recommendations to the membership as to the officers for the upcoming fraternal year. The membership can make further motions to for additional candidates for consideration. Elections are held in June of each each with the terms starting on July 1st and continuing through June 30th.

The grand knight is the highest ranking elected officer of his council and is responsible for observing the laws of the Order and his council.

The office of grand knight is one that is rich in opportunities to serve his fellow Knights and to lead his council in service to family, Church and community. The grand knight is primarily responsible for the successful conduct of his council. The grand knight is also the chairman of the board of trustees of the council, and as such he should make absolutely certain that the records and accounts of the council are audited semi-annually by the trustees, as required by the laws of the Order. Laws of the Order requires that the grand knight and the trustee audit the accounts of the financial secretary and treasurer at least every six months, and in January and July report thereon to their council district deputy, state deputy and the supreme secretary on forms approved by the board of directors and furnished by the Supreme Council.

Based upon financial statements reviewed by board of Directors a Form 990 is developed by a trustee and submitted to outside auditor for independent review prior to submittal.

The Grand Knight has responsibility to appoint various committees including the Charity committee.

The Charity Committee is responsible for identifying, evaluating, and recommending requests for financial charitable gifts that advance the mission of the Knights of Columbus. All requests are considered on an individual basis. No donations are considered automatic annual donations and must be reevaluated annually based upon needs and finances. Consideration is given to those individuals and organizations

that are within the communities we serve however consideration is given to global demands as well. Attached is a sample of these grants.
