Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of Activities

The objective and purpose of the Association are to promote the general welfare of the Specialty Advertising Industry and the membership by providing educational services, statistics and standards, and research programs, by encouraging and striving for improved service to the public; by disseminating information about the Industry, by stimulating interest in and demand for the products and services of the Industry; by providing an open and accessible forum to its members; and by engaging in such other lawful trade association activities as the Board of Directors may determine.

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards, ("Financial Statements of Not-For-Profit Organizations.") The Association is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets:

Unrestricted Net Assets – are free of donor-imposed restrictions and include all revenues, expenses, gains and losses that are not subject to donor restrictions.

Temporarily Restricted Net Assets – include gifts, grants, income, gains, and pledges for which donor-imposed restrictions have not yet been met.

Permanently Restricted Net Assets – are those contributed with donor stipulations that they are held in perpetuity with use of income for unrestricted or temporarily restricted purposes. As of December 31, 2011, the Association had no permanently restricted net assets.

Net assets are released from donor restrictions when expenses are incurred to satisfy the restricted purposes or by occurrence of other events as specified by donors. Donor restricted gifts that are received and expended within the same year are reported as restricted revenues.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates...

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2011

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Concentrations of Credit Risk

Financial instruments that potentially subject the Association to concentrations of credit risk consist principally of temporary cash balances and investments. The Association places its cash balances with financial institutions and investment money market accounts. Cash balances in Massachusetts banks are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation up to \$250,000 each. Cash balances in investment money market accounts are uninsured. As of December 31, 2011, the Association's concentration of credit risk with respect to temporary cash balances was limited to its investment money market account balances totaling \$7,364.

Investments and Investment Income

Investments in marketable equity securities and mutual funds are carried at quoted market values for the investments at the statement of financial position dates. Investment in government and corporate obligations are carried at amortized cost, which approximates market value.

Investment income or loss (including realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments, interest and dividends) are reported as non-operating gains (losses) in the statements of activities as investment return.

Investments are subject to the normal market fluctuations of publicly traded securities. Credit risk with respect to its investments in these securities is limited due to the Securities Investors Protection Corporation program and the diverse portfolio of quality investments maintained by the Association. The Association annually reviews its investments, if the market value is substantially below cost and the decline is considered to be "other than temporary," an adjustment is recorded as a realized loss.

Unearned Dues

Unearned dues include membership dues received in the current fiscal year for the subsequent fiscal years. The Association recognizes membership dues revenue in the year to which it relates.

Income Taxes

The Association qualifies as a tax-exempt organization under Section 501 (c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, has no provision for income taxes.

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Fair Value

The following methods and assumptions were used to estimate the fair value of each class of financial instruments:

<u>Cash and Equivalents</u>: The carrying amounts reported in the statement of financial position approximate fair values because of the short maturities of those investments.

Promotional Costs

The Association expenses promotional costs as incurred.

Fair Value

The Association reports its qualifying assets and liabilities in accordance with the *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures Standards* under U.S. GAAP. These standards define fair value, establish a framework for measuring fair value, and expand disclosures about fair value measurements. This policy establishes a fair value framework that prioritizes the inputs and assumptions used to measure fair value.

The three levels of the fair value framework are as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs that reflect unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities at the measurement date.
- Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets that are observable for the asset either directly or indirectly, including inputs in markets that are not considered to be active.
- Level 3 Inputs that are observable.

A qualifying asset or liability's level within the framework is based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Association's qualifying assets and liabilities are recorded at fair value using Level 1 inputs.

Investments

The Association holds their investments in one brokerage account. Investments are stated at fair value. At December 31, 2011, investments consist of various publicly traded mutual funds. A breakdown of investments at December 31, 2011 is as follows:

Uncertainty in Income Taxes

The Association adopted the new standards for Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes, which required the Association to report any uncertain tax positions and to adjust its financial statements for the impact thereof. As of December 31, 2011, the Association determined that it had no tax positions that did not meet the "more likely than not" threshold of being sustained by the applicable tax authority. The Association files tax and information returns in the United States Federal and Massachusetts state jurisdictions. There returns are generally subject to examination by tax authorities for the last three years.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through May 1, 2012, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no subsequent events that require adjustment or disclosure in the financial statements.
