Attachment to Article II

The purposes of this Corporation shall be:

(i) to acquire, hold, own, lease, manage and use real and personal property in support of providing educational opportunities to individuals in Massachusetts;

(ii) to assist individuals enhance their lives through educational programs by providing scholarship assistance to such individuals;

(iii) to raise funds to provide scholarships, grants and other support to individuals or organizations to enhance professional development and entrepreneurial and business skills;

(iv) to fund leadership institutes and entrepreneurial programs for the benefit of individuals in Massachusetts;

(v) create scholarship funds to provide annual awards to fund both scholarship and educational projects related to professional development and entrepreneurial/business skills on individuals in Massachusetts; and

(vi) to perform all other educational and charitable activities as are permitted by corporations organized under Chapter 180 of the General Laws of The Commonwealth of Massachusetts and as are permitted by corporations which qualify for exemption from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States internal revenue law)(hereinafter the "Internal Revenue Code") and contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2), 2055 (a)(2) and 2522 (a)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, including the making of distributions for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes to organizations which are exempt from federal income tax.

Attachment to Article IV

The by-laws of the corporation have been duly adopted and the initial directors, president, treasurer and clerk or other presiding, financial or recording officers, whose names are set out in these Articles, have been duly elected.

Other lawful provisions for the conduct and regulation of the business and affairs of the corporation, for its voluntary dissolution, or for limiting, defining, or regulating the powers of the corporation, or of its directors are as follows:

(a) **Powers.** Subject to all the limitations set forth in, or referred to by, other provisions of these Articles, this corporation shall have, and may exercise in furtherance of its corporate purposes, (1) all of the powers specified in Section 6 of Chapter 180 and Section 3.02 of Chapter 156D of the Massachusetts General Laws as amended from time to time, except those powers referred to in paragraph (5) of Section (a) which do not apply to charitable corporations, and (2) all other lawful powers necessary or convenient to affect any or all of the purposes for which the Corporation was formed; provided always that no such power shall be exercised in a manner inconsistent with (i) Chapter 180 or any other Chapter of the Massachusetts General Laws, and (ii) the exemption from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Internal Revenue Code").

(b) **Tax Exemption.** No part of the assets or net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to any director or officer of the corporation or any other private individual, or any organization organized and operated for a profit (except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes as stated above); no substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, except to the extent permitted by Section 501(h) of the Internal Revenue Code; and the corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office. It is intended that the corporation shall be entitled to exemption from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

(c) **Private Foundation Restrictions.** If at any time, and for so long as, the corporation is a private foundation (as that term is defined in Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code), and notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles or the By-laws of the corporation, the following provisions shall apply:

(1) The income of the corporation for each taxable year shall be distributed at such time and in such manner as not to subject the

corporation to the tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code; and

(2) The corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing (as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code), nor retain any excess business holdings (as defined in section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code), nor make any investments in such manner as to subject the corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code, nor make any taxable expenditures (as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code).

(d) *Term of Corporation and Dissolution.* The corporation shall continue forever, unless (a) terminated by unanimous vote of the Directors, or (b) at such time as the Directors determine that the public support for its charitable purpose has declined to the level where the administrative burden of sustaining the Corporation is no longer viable.

Upon the liquidation or dissolution of the corporation, as provided above, after payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation or due provision therefore, all of the assets of the corporation shall be distributed pursuant to Chapter 180, Section 11A, to such one or more charitable organizations with an exempt purpose within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or if it did not then so qualify, to one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or to any one or more corporations, trusts, community chests, funds and foundations created or organized in the United States or in any possession thereof or under the laws of the United States or of any state or territory, the District of Columbia, or any possession of the United States, which are organized and operated exclusively for charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes, no part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual, and no substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and which do not participate or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office, and which are recognized as exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

(e) *Non-Discrimination.* In administering its programs and activities, the corporation shall not discriminate on the basis of sex, race, or religion.

(f) *Successor Provisions.* All references (1) to the Internal Revenue Code shall be deemed to refer to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now in force or hereafter amended; (2) to the General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, or any Chapter thereof, shall be deemed to refer to such General Laws or Chapter as now in force or hereafter amended; and (3) the particular sections of the Internal Revenue Code or such General Laws shall be deemed to refer to similar or successor provisions hereafter adopted.

(g) *Indemnification.* Except as otherwise provided below, the corporation shall, to the extent legally permissible, and only to the extent that the status of the corporation as an organization exempt under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code is not adversely affected thereby, indemnify each person who is, or shall have been, a director or officer of the

corporation, or who serves at its request as a director or officer of another organization or in a capacity with respect to any employee benefit plan (each such person being herein called a "Person"), against all liabilities and expenses (including judgments, fines, penalties and reasonable attorneys' fees and all amounts paid, other than to the corporation, in compromise or settlement) imposed upon or incurred by such Person in connection with the defense or disposition of any action, suit or other proceeding, whether civil or criminal, in which he may be a defendant or with which he may be threatened or otherwise involved, directly or indirectly, by reason of his being or having been such a Person.

The corporation shall provide no indemnification with respect to any matter as to which such Person shall be finally adjudicated in any action, suit or proceeding not to have acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that his action was in the best interests of the corporation. Any Person who at the request of the corporation serves another organization or employee benefit plan in one or more of the above indicated capacities and who shall be finally adjudicated not to have acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that his action was in the best interest of such other organization or in the best interest of the participants or beneficiaries of such employee benefit plan shall be deemed not to have acted in such manner with respect to the corporation. The corporation shall provide no indemnification with respect to any matter settled or compromised, pursuant to a consent decree or otherwise, unless such settlement or compromise shall have been approved as in the best interests of the corporation, after notice that indemnification is involved, by (1) a disinterested majority of the Board of Directors or (2) if there are no disinterested directors, by independent legal counsel representing the corporation and appointed by a majority of the directors then in office.

Indemnification may include payment by the corporation of expenses in defending a civil or criminal action or proceeding in advance of the final disposition of such action or proceeding upon receipt of an undertaking by such Person to repay such payment if it is ultimately determined that such person is not entitled to indemnification under Section 6 of Chapter 180 of the Massachusetts General Laws or pursuant to the provisions of the preceding paragraph. Such an undertaking may be accepted without reference to the financial ability of such Person to make repayment.

As used in this Article 4(g) the terms "director" and "officer" include their respective heirs, executors, administrators and legal representatives, and an "interested" director or officer is one against whom in such capacity the proceeding in question or another proceeding on the same or similar grounds is then pending.

The right of indemnification provided in this Article 4(g) shall not be exclusive of or affect any other rights to which any director or officer may be entitled under any agreement, statute or otherwise. The corporation's obligation to provide indemnification under this Article shall be offset to the extent of any other source of indemnification or any otherwise applicable insurance coverage under a policy maintained by the corporation or any other person. Nothing contained in this Article 4(g) shall affect any rights to which corporate personnel other than directors or officers may be entitled by contract or otherwise.

(h) ***Interested Directors and Officers.*** The directors shall have the power to fix their compensation from time to time. No contract or transaction between the corporation and one or more of its directors or officers, or between the corporation and any other corporation, partnership, association, or other organization in which one or more of its directors or officers are directors or officers, or have a financial or other interest, shall be void or voidable solely for this reason, or solely because such director or officer is present at or participates in the meeting of the Board of Directors or committee thereof which authorizes the contract or transaction, or solely because his or their votes are counted for such purpose, nor shall any director or officer be under any liability to the corporation on account of any such contract or transaction if:

- (1) the material facts as to his relationship or interest as to the contract or transaction are disclosed or are known to the Board of Directors or the committee, and the Board or committee authorized the contract or transaction by the affirmative votes of a majority of the disinterested directors, even though the disinterested directors be less than a quorum; or
- (2) the contract or transaction is fair as to the corporation as of the time it is authorized, approved or ratified, by the Board of Directors, a committee of the Board, or otherwise by the corporation.

(i) ***Exculpation; No Personal Liability.*** No director or officer shall be personally liable to the corporation for monetary damages for breach of fiduciary duty as a director or officer notwithstanding any provision of law imposing such liability; provided, however, that the liability of a director or officer, to the extent that such liability is imposed by applicable law, shall not be eliminated (1) for any breach of the director's or officer's duty of loyalty to the corporation, (2) for acts or omissions not in good faith or which involve intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of law, or (3) for any transaction from which the director or officer derived an improper personal benefit. The directors and the officers of the corporation shall not be personally liable for any debt, liability or obligation of the corporation. All persons, corporations or other entities extending credit to, contracting with, or having any claim against, the corporation, may look only to the funds and property of the corporation for the payment of any such contract or claim, or for the payment of any debt, damages, judgment or decree, or of any money that may otherwise become due or payable to them from the corporation. No amendment or repeal shall deprive a director or officer of this benefit for acts or omissions prior to amendment.


