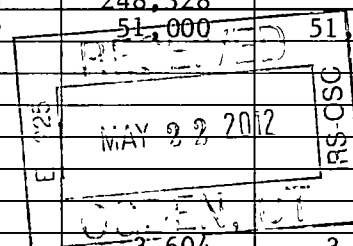

Foreign Catholic charities have submitted letters attesting to the fact they are Catholic organizations. Since all the organizations are Roman Roman Catholic charities, the donations to them fulfilled the terms of the Trust. None of the organizations are in any related to the original Donor of the Trust. It is the belief of the Trustees that the funds were in fact used for the purposes for which they were donated. the Trustees requested and received from each donee organizations a letter stating that they would in fact use the funds for which they were requested.
