Deadlines have changed! Concept Letters are due December 1st, 2011 - please read below

Types of Support: Generally the foundation makes only restricted grants, favoring requests supporting specific projects and programs. The foundation will on rare occasions provide seed money and operating support to smaller organizations. An average one-year grant ranges from \$10,000 to \$25,000. Requests for multi-year grants are considered and strongly encouraged from previous grant recipients.

Geographical Limitations: The foundation funds in Massachusetts, Maine, New Hampshire, New York and Vermont.

<u>Program Limitations</u> Grants are not made to individuals, or for endowments, annual or capital campaigns, museums, religious programs, any religion-affiliated organization, conference participation/travel unrelated to current foundation grant, scholarships, fellowships, building projects, equipment needs, or film and video projects. Loans are not made. Please see Program Area Guidelines (also available from the foundation) for further program limitations specific to the individual program areas.

Application Process: Please email a one-page Concept Letter describing your organization and its history, your project title, goal, means for accomplishing goal, and expected result. You can assume that the foundation is generally familiar with the subject areas that it funds and need not provide general background into the problem. Please include three figures: the total organization budget, the total project budget and the amount requested from the foundation. Please check that the letter includes a contact name, address, phone number, email address, organizational web site address, and EIN number. Organizations previously funded by the foundation must also submit a Concept Letter for new or continuing projects.

Concept Letter Deadline: Concept Letters are due on December 1st, 2011. Please do not expect a response to your Concept Letter until several weeks after the deadline. The following Concept Letter deadline is December 1st, 2012. There is only one Concept Letter deadline per year. This letter MUST be submitted via email to orchard@maine.rr.com, either as a Word attachment, or a PDF document.

If a Proposal is Invited: Should the foundation be interested, a proposal (with supplemental material) will be due on March 1st. Grant awards are made in May. The proposal must include a problem statement (however, see above about assuming our general familiarity with the problems in the areas the foundation funds), the goals of the project, a plan of action, the qualifications of the organization to fulfill the plan and a method of evaluation. Please include the three top measurable results that your organization expects to accomplish if it receives a grant. The entire proposal body should be no longer than four pages. Supplemental materials needed are a one-

page project budget and a one-page operating budget. If available at your website please include direct web links to a board member list, a copy of the last annual financial statement, an annual report, and a list of foundation and corporate supporters for current and most recent fiscal years in your email cover note. If any of these are NOT available at your website, please send with the proposal and budgets. All materials MUST be submitted via email to orchard@maine.rr.com either as a Word attachment, a PDF document, or an Excel attachment. Please submit proposals, budgets and supplemental material in separate attachments.

Please note that the foundation <u>does not</u> accept any unsolicited grant proposals. Due to limited funds, an invitation to submit a proposal <u>does not</u> imply that a grant will be forthcoming.

Reporting Requirements: Funded organizations must submit a two-page narrative project assessment and a one-page financial report of how the grant moneys were expended. The report deadline will be given when a project is funded and is generally within 13 months of the grant award. This report must be submitted via email to orchard@maine.rr.com. Grantees will be expected to report back on the three measurable goals listed in the proposal.

Application Restrictions: Grantees receiving one year support must wait until after the foundation receives the grantee's project report (see above) before submitting another Concept Letter. This requirement allows foundation board members to carefully evaluate the results of their grantmaking before considering further grants. Except in the case of multi-year grants this implies that organizations cannot be continuously funded by the foundation. One or two years between grants awarded is the norm.

<u>Final notes</u>: a part-time Executive Director staffs the office. Please assume an answering machine will answer your phone call and be prepared to leave a message. Better yet, send an email. If you are not sure whether your project fits within our guidelines, feel free to send an email or call with your question. While the foundation office is closed for July and August, we do check our phone and email messages from time to time, so we will eventually get to your queries. And finally, please be aware that the foundation guidelines can change so if you are reading a *printed copy* of these guidelines, please check the web site for updated information before emailing any material!

The Orchard Foundation favors organizations with a demonstrated competency in specific skills, such as litigation, technology, scientific advocacy, or coalition building. The foundation favors groups with local and national ties, either through networks, chapters or other affiliations. Finally, the foundation favors organizations with a demonstrated strong base of citizen and activist support.

Areas not funded: Given that the Orchard Foundation is a very small foundation, it is impossible to fund all projects that fall into our primary environmental program areas. Therefore it is easier to list some of the areas which the foundation board is not interested in funding. Those include: general citizen organizing and public awareness-building projects, environmental education projects (for adults or children), ocean fisheries, growth management and sprawl, toxic substances and pollution prevention (as previously funded by the foundation), animal rights, animal hospitals or rehabilitation centers, species specific projects, scientific research, and land acquisition. Please see Application Guidelines (available from the foundation) for more general program limitations.

Children, Youth and Families - The foundation funds in one area.

Child & Family Advocacy supports projects that promote child welfare at local and state levels by addressing systemic issues, such as funding availability or rights, as opposed to direct service projects. We support projects advocating for reproductive rights for adolescents, in addition to projects aiming for comprehensive sexuality education for middle and high school students. By "advocacy projects" we include those programs that seek to change governmental policies or that educate people to advocate for children as a group. We do not fund projects in which individuals are taught to advocate for their own children.

Areas not funded: Given that the Orchard Foundation is a very small foundation, it is impossible to fund all projects that fall into the Children, Youth & Families category. Therefore it is easier to list some of the areas which the foundation board is not interested in funding. These areas include: child literacy, children enrichment projects, parenting skills and support programs, direct pregnancy prevention programs (all previously funded by the foundation), adult literacy programs, violence prevention, and or projects that

focus on specific diseases or conditions. Please see Application Guidelines (available from the foundation) for more general program limitations.

Funding limitations: Total funding available for these two program areas has been approximately \$475,000 annually. This figure can and will fluctuate greatly. Other monies disbursed by the foundation are done on a designated giving basis only. These are at the discretion of the trustees and no correspondence concerning them will be considered. Grants lists at this website include awards made by the process described in the Program Areas and Application Guidelines brochures.
