- ATTEND MEETINGS OF THE BOARD AND OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE;
- ATTEND COMMITTEE MEETINGS WHEN REQUESTED BY ITS CHAIRPERSON OR WHEN THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR DEEMS IT APPROPRIATE.

SECTION 6.3 TERM - THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MAY BE DISMISSED WITH OR WITHOUT CAUSE BY A VOTE OF THREE-QUARTERS OF THE MEMBERS OF THE ENTIRE BOARD OF TRUSTEES THEN IN OFFICE AND NOT ON LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

SECTION 6.4 COMPENSATION - THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL BE PAID SUCH COMPENSATION AS THE BOARD DETERMINES.
