The Foundation.

The purpose of the Edita & Ira Morris Hiroshima Foundation is to promote peace by supporting efforts in the cultural sphere to favour peace and reconciliation. The Foundation was created in 1989 following a bequest by the Swedish author Edita Morris who was married to the American author Ira Morris (1903-1972).

The Foundation presents awards to women and men who contribute, in a cultural field, to fostering dialogue, understanding and peace in conflict areas. The aim of the Foundation is not only to reward past contributions but first and foremost to encourage and support continued efforts.

The Hiroshima Foundation is named after Edita Morris' most famous novel The Flowers of Hiroshima which describes the suffering caused by the atomic bomb. Edita and Ira Morris' son Ivan Morris (1925-1976) was professor in Japanology and one of the first interpreters sent into Hiroshima after the explosion of the bomb.

Edita and Ira Morris founded a rest house in Hiroshima for the victims of the bomb. Both became honorary citizens of Hiroshima.

Edita Morris was born in Örebro in 1902 and died in Paris in 1988.

The Hiroshima Prize is now given every second year.

The award.

In earlier years, Foundation awards were given at irregular intervals and frequently to several recipients. All in all there have been 23 laureates.

The 2004 and 2006 awards consisted of US \$ 100.000. In addition the laureate receives (since 1994) a sculpture by the Swedish artist Lena Krantz, a split cannon ball in which you can glimpse a pearl.

- 2001: **Donald Kenrick**, British Romani linguist, **Valdemar Kalinin**, Belarussian Roma writer and poet, **Roberto Ciulli**, German theatre director and founder of the Theater an der Ruhr, and **Rahim Burhan**, a founder of the Roma Theatre Prilipe in Skopje, The Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, for their work in promoting understanding for the Roma culture and language.
- 1998: **John Kani**, South African playwright and theatre director, for his work with cultural integration in cooperation with people from different ethnic communities, and **Antjie Krog**, South African poet and investigating journalist, for her efforts to make the truth and reconciliation process in South Africa understood.
- 1996: **Xavier Albó**, Spanish-born Bolivian Jesuit priest and anthropologist, and **Félix Layme Pairumani**, Bolivian university professor, for their work on the Spanish-Quechua and Spanish-Aymara dictionaries in Bolivia and for translating Bolivian and Peruvian laws, and **Carolyn Forché**, American poet, for her efforts to combat torture and genocide in El Salvador.
- 1995: **Akihiro Takahashi**, Japanese atom bomb survivor and former Head of the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum and Director of the Hiroshima Peace Culture Foundation.
- 1994: **Aziz Nesin**, secular Turkish writer, for his resistance to political and religious fundamentalism, and **Mohamed Talbi**, Tunisian historian and a devout Muslim, for his efforts to promote dialogue between Muslims and Christians.
- 1993: **Marion Kane** and **Vivienne Anderson**, both British, for their efforts to promote dialogue between Catholic and Protestant women in Northern Ireland.
- 1992: **Sonja Licht**, Serbian sociologist and political activist, for promoting peaceful cooperation between the different communities in former Yugoslavia, and **Tanja Petovar**, lawyer and human rights activist.

Edita Morris - a short biography by Christopher Toll

Edita Morris – before her marriage Edith Toll - was born in Örebro, Sweden, on 5 March 1902. She was the youngest of four daughters of the agronomist Reinhold Toll and his first wife Alma Prom-Möller and grew up in the country in South Sweden at her grandmother's farm and in Stockholm, where she was educated by a divorced strong-willed mother, and at a good girls' school. The family was noble and poor, a combination that entailed great efforts and privations in secret, in order to enable the girls to take the place in the society of Stockholm in the twenties to which their name and education entitled them. Already Edith's teacher in Swedish encouraged her to write, and a tragic accident that killed one of her sisters might have stirred her wish to express her feelings. But writing gave no income. So Edith got work at the Army Council as a secretary and became engaged to a young lieutenant of a noble family.

But destiny intervened in the person of young Ira Morris, son of a similarly named American millionaire and envoy to Stockholm. He took her away, in 1925, from the fiancé, the Army Council and Stockholm to Nesles, a château in France which his father gave to the couple. Himself a writer, Ira Morris got her to realize her dream of writing, and under her new name Edita Morris she published a number of short stories in American literary magazines. Ira Morris was opposed to his rich and ostentatious parents and got Edita interested in political and social questions which inspired her to many books.

The best known is *The Flowers of Hiroshima* about the victims of the atomic bomb whom she met when she visited Hiroshima in 1955. This book, which won the Albert Schweitzer Prize in 1961, has been turned into an opera, Hollywood bought the film rights (but the film was never produced), and it was translated into so many languages (39?) that she used to say that only Dr. Spock had surpassed her in this respect. She wrote in English but her books have been translated into her Swedish mother tongue and into many other languages. Among them are *The Solo Dancer*, about the son of an Indonesian rice peasant, *A Happy Day*, *Love to Vietnam*, *How are you, I hope well* about a black maid in Jamaica and her white mistress, and *Kill the beggars!* about poverty in South America. She also wrote two autobiographical works, *The Strait Jacket* and *The Seventy Years' War*. Her best novel was *Life, wonderful life!*, a revised edition of the first part of *My darling from the lions* (six reprints in the USA and seven foreign editions). The novel is built upon her recollections of the happy country life at the farm of her grandmother. "It is fresh as mountain air", one critic said, "and youth sings through it." It was, however, in the short story that her mastership reached its peak and caused critics to compare her to Katherine Mansfield. Her first book was a collection of short stories entitled *Birth of an old lady and other stories*, other collections were *Three who loved*, *Dear me and other tales from my native Sweden*. Some of her stories have been staged. She kept writing until her death and was inspired by many new subjects, such as Linnaeus, the Polar explorer Eduard Toll who disappeared in the ice in 1902, the Vikings: she wanted to turn everything into a story.

Her own life was perhaps her best story, about the poor Swedish girl who became a _____

famous writer in English and a well known figure in the world of literature and art. Through her friendship with the Swedish painter Nils Dardel, who made some beautiful portraits of her, she got to know, among others, Georges Braque and through this acquaintance it happened that she spent her last years in a flat opposite Braque's house in the street in Paris which now bears his name.

But most thrilling were the contrasts in her life and personality: between the poverty and the nobility in her youth, between the wealth and the socialism in her married life. between a gradually older and more conservative well-born lady, a woman of the world, equally at home in New York, Mexico City, Paris, London, Athens and Stockholm, with a faithful driver and a perfect cook, disapproving of the long hair, slovenly dress and bad manners of the younger generation – and a writer who in several of her books campaigned against poverty, starvation and oppression and for peace and disarmament, and in that capacity spent time in the company of long-haired and leftist youths in jeans and was invited to visit Socialist countries such as the Soviet Union and Communist China.

She died in Paris on 14 March 1988 – both her husband Ira Morris and their son Ivan Morris, a distinguished professor of Japanese at Columbia University and a well-known translator of Japanese literature, had died before her. They all three of them lie buried in the park of their beloved Nesles-en- Brie. Edita Morris left her property to the Edita and Ira Morris Hiroshima Foundation for Peace and Culture. Except for a half-sister in London, now also dead, she had no closer relatives than her Toll family in Sweden.

Origin, legal status and structures

1. Edita Morris left in her will, dated 3 February 1986, the residue of her estate (after a number of specific bequests) to be used for the benefit of the Edita and Ira Morris Foundation for Peace, in her words "a Swedish Foundation I have created and whose purpose is the promotion of peace through the media, that is to say radio, television, cinema and theatre, and I direct my Trustee hereinafter named to apply the net income arising from my estate in quarterly instalments for the use and benefit of the said Foundation". The trustee and executor of the will was Russell M Porter, her American lawyer in Paris.

2. It appeared, however, according to advice obtained from a lawyer in Stockholm at the time, that there was no possibility of obtaining exemption from taxes in Sweden for the envisaged foundation as it did not qualify under Swedish law, as it was, for such exemption.

A private foundation in Sweden ("stiftelse") is formed by a letter of donation from a founder donating funds or assets to be administered for a specific purpose. A private foundation may have diverse purposes, including but not limited to collective, familiar, or the purpose of passive administration of funds. Normally, the supervision of a private foundation is done by the county government where the foundation has its domicile; however, large foundations must be registered by the County Administrative Board (CAB), which must also supervise the administration of the foundation. The main legal instruments governing private foundations in Sweden are those that regulate foundations in general: the Foundation Act (1994:1220) and the Regulation for Foundations (1995:1280). These instruments are of course posterior to the will and to the death of Edita Morris in 1988. The previous legislation was, however, even more restrictive. No assets were ever transferred to Sweden and the foundation was never registered in Sweden. It is therefore more than doubtful that the foundation ever has had any legal status in Sweden.


3. The assets were instead transferred to a specially created body called The Hiroshima Fund which set up under the laws of Delaware and registered in New York. The purpose of the Fund was to promote peace and aid peace activities. The Fund was exempted from taxation in both the United States and France. The sole purpose of the Fund was, however, de facto to finance the Edita and Ira Morris Hiroshima Foundation for Peace and Culture. The Foundation adopted by-laws on 30 January 1986 which were amended on 17 March 1991 (see Appendix 1). The Board of the "Swedish Foundation" selected the recipients for the award and organised the ceremonies for the presentation of the award. The travel costs for attending meetings and accommodation etc for members of the Board were reimbursed from the assets of the Hiroshima Fund. The members of the Board were regularly informed of the financial situation of the assets held by the Fund. Russell Porter not infrequently pointed out, however, that such information was given as a matter of courtesy and that the Board had no formal say in the way the assets of the Fund were handled. The Board members expressed the hope that funds should not be invested in companies involved in areas which were incompatible with the purposes of the Foundation. Moreover Russell Porter stated on various

occasions that, if he so wished, he could terminate the activities of the Foundation and the assets of the Fund be handed over to the United States tax authorities.

4. In 2011 it became apparent that changes in the US legislation would mean that the Fund could no longer benefit from the charitable status and consequent exemption from taxation for the Hiroshima Fund. Chandras Rajakaruna who had taken over the function of trustee and treasurer from Russell Porter stressed the importance of steps being taken urgently to move the assets from the United States to another country where they would maintain the exemption from taxation. Failure to do so would result in the assets having to be handed over to the US Treasury or to the State of New York. Moreover it was also essential that a formal structure was created in order to guarantee the continuation of the Foundation were he to die or become incapacitated. The Board was informed of the situation in the course of several meetings.

5. With the assistance of Maître René Merkt, a lawyer in Geneva, who had also been the lawyer of Mona Bismarck, the creator of the Mona Bismarck Foundation, a new foundation was created under Swiss law to which the assets from the Hiroshima Fund were transferred. The Swiss law of Foundations is governed by Articles 80 et seq under the Swiss Civil Code. It must be created by a deed before a notary. It must be placed under the supervision of a public law entity. In this case the Federal Department of the Interior (Département Fédéral de l'Intérieur) in Bern. The supervisory authority ensures that the resources are used for the intended purpose. A foundation must have a Foundation Board and an audit board. The Foundation Board must be composed of at least three members, one of whom must be a Swiss citizen or a citizen of an EU member state and resident in Switzerland. At the initial stage the three members were René Merkt, Chandras Rajakaruna and Thomas Ouchterlony .. The name of the Swiss Foundation is "Fondation Edita Morris pour la Paix" with its seat in Geneva. The Foundation was constituted through a deed before a notary on 17 January 2012 and in accordance with the relevant regulations registered with the Trade Registry (Régistre de Commerce) in Geneva on 30 January 2012.

6. Edita Morris left her money to a Swedish foundation with a specific mandate. Although the legal framework was not exactly the one she had envisaged (i.e. a Swedish foundation with its seat in Sweden) the Swedish Board of the Foundation has carried out the mandate in the spirit she had envisaged. The Board has through its work and the granting of awards constituted the public face of what she wanted to create. The fact that the money has now been transferred from an American Fund to a Swiss Foundation should not, as far as possible, neglect the moral obligation of pursuing the aims she wanted to achieve. It is therefore in this spirit that the work of the Swiss Foundation has to be undertaken in order to continue the work that has already begun. The statutes of the Swiss Foundation should therefore be adapted, within the framework of Swiss law and regulations, to ensure the continuity of the work. For practical reasons and because of the urgency of escaping the draconian implications of the changes in the United States tax rules, the initial procedures to satisfy the formalities for setting up a foundation under Swiss law were handled by only three persons. The Swiss Foundation is now in existence. The time has therefore come to reconcile the Swiss legal framework with the intentions of Edita Morris, including the manner in which the prize is given in her name.



Dear Sirs,

We are writing in response to your letter of 2 December 2011 in which you requested exemption from direct federal income tax on entities for the above-mentioned institution.

After examining the Articles of Association for this institution, the purpose of which is to "promote efforts to restore and maintain peace in the world, principally by means relating to the field of culture", **we would like to inform you that the Foundation may benefit from the provisions of Article 56, letter g) of the federal direct income tax act (LIFD) and be exempt from tax, provided that the funds collected are in effect used in compliance with the specified purpose of the entity, starting from the 2012 tax period (financial year ending during 2012), for an undetermined period.**

We would therefore be obliged if you would kindly inform us of any subsequent modifications to the Articles of Association.

Moreover, we reserve the right to retract our decision should your Foundation no longer fulfil the conditions for exemption set out in Article 56, letter g) of the LIFD.

The Foundation remains subject to the obligation to make declarations and provide documentary proof, as well as to the verifications established by the LIFD.

Pursuant to Article 132 of the Federal Direct Income Tax act dated 14 December 1990, a complaint against this prejudicial taxation decision may be submitted to the Canton Tax Administration, Case Postale 3937, 1211 Geneva 3, within 30 days of said notification.
