THE SOUTH HAS HISTORICALLY UNDERINVESTED IN EDUCATION. AS THIS YEAR'S WORK REVEALS, THE REGION NOW FACES THE URGENT NEED TO ENHANCE EDUCATION AT ALL LEVELS, ESPECIALLY FOR VULNERABLE POPULATIONS THAT NEED HELP. TOWARD THIS END, EACH YEAR SEF PLACES SOUTHERN COLLEGE AND GRADUATE STUDENTS IN FOUNDATIONS AND OTHER NONPROFITS THAT WORK ON IMPROVING THE OUALITY OF AND ACCESS TO EDUCATION. SEF INTERNS ARE EXPOSED TO A RIGOROUS ORIENTATION TO PROVIDE CONTEXT ON HOW QUESTIONS OF EDUCATIONAL

IMPROVEMENT ARE BEING ADDRESSED IN THE SOUTH. ATTENTION IS GIVEN TO WORKPLACE AS WELL AS SUBSTANTIVE SKILLS SO THAT THEY CAN TAKE FULL ADVANTAGE OF THEIR INTERNSHIP EXPERIENCE. AMONG OTHER THINGS, THIS SESSION HELPED PARTICIPANTS CONSIDER WAYS TO LINK THEIR INSTITUTION'S DATA TO THESE LARGER NATIONAL SAMPLES AND TO USE THE INSIGHTS FROM THESE LONGITUDINAL DATA SETS IN FRAMING DATA COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS EFFORTS ON THEIR CAMPUSES. SEF SOON TO BE RELEASED REPORT, SUSPENDED LEARNING: THE OVERUSE OF SCHOOL SUSPENSIONS WILL REVIEW NATIONAL AND REGIONAL DATA ON SCHOOL SUSPENSION RATES. IT WILL REVEAL THAT SOUTHERN STATES HAVE THE NATION'S HIGHEST RATES OF SCHOOL SUSPENSIONS. INDEED, EIGHT OF THE 10 STATES WITH THE NATION'S HIGHEST RATES OF SCHOOL SUSPENSIONS ARE IN THE SOUTH. IT WILL ALSO SHOW THESE RATES ARE PARTICULARLY HIGH FOR STUDENTS OF COLOR.
