### ARTICLE I

### Members

Section 1.1. Categories of Members; Terms of Membership. The Founding Members of the Corporation were Anna A. Greenwall, Frank K. Greenwall, Alfred A. Halden, Elias D. Cohen, and Nancy G. Leven, each of whom continued in office until his or her resignation or death. There shall be no other members of the Corporation.

### ARTICLE II

### **Board of Directors**

- <u>Section 2.1.</u> <u>Powers.</u> The property, affairs and activities of the Corporation shall be managed and controlled and its powers exercised by the Board of Directors, except as otherwise provided by statute or by these By-Laws.
- <u>Section 2.2</u> <u>Number of Directors.</u> The authorized number of Directors of the Corporation, including the President, shall be ten.
- Section 2.3 Qualification of Directors. All Directors shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age and at least one of them shall be a citizen of the United States and a resident of the State of New York. No one shall be eligible to stand for election or reelection as Director if (a) at that time he or she is seventy-two (72) years of age or older or (b) at that time he or she shall have served as a Director for three consecutive full three year terms commencing at or after the 2012 annual meeting, provided that, subject to clause (a), any person who shall have served as a Director for three consecutive full three year terms shall be eligible to stand for election as a Director (and, subsequently, for reelection as a Director for a total of up to three consecutive three year terms) if he or she shall not have been a Director for at least one full year immediately preceding such election.
- Section 2.4. Classification of Directors and Terms of Office.

  Commencing at the 2012 annual meeting, the elected members of the Board of Directors shall be divided into three classes as nearly equal as may be Directors of the first such class shall be elected at the 2012 annual meeting for a period of one year, whose term expires at the 2013 annual meeting; Directors of the second such class shall be elected at the 2012 annual meeting for a period of

two years, whose term expires at the 2014 annual meeting; and Directors of the third such class shall be elected at the 2012 annual meeting for a period of three years, whose term expires at the 2015 annual meeting. At each annual meeting following the 2012 annual meeting, the successors to the Directors of the class whose terms then expire shall be elected for three year terms, provided, however, that, effective for Directors elected in 2013 or thereafter, the term of any elected Director who attains age seventy-two (72) while in office shall expire at the annual meeting on or next following his or her seventy-second (72nd) birthday. Notwithstanding the foregoing, each Director in each Class shall continue in office until his or her successor is elected and qualified.

- Section 2.5. Election of Directors. The President shall be an *ex officio* Director, with voting rights. At each annual meeting of the Directors of the Corporation for the election of Directors, the Directors to be elected shall be chosen by a majority vote of the Directors then in office.
- Section 2.6. Resignation. Any Director may resign at any time by delivering a written resignation to the President or the Secretary of the Corporation. The acceptance of any such resignation, unless required by the terms thereof, shall not be necessary to make the same effective.
- Section 2.7. Removal. Any Director may be removed at any time for cause by the vote of two-thirds of the Directors of the Corporation then in office at any annual or special meeting of the Board of Directors of the Corporation.
- Section 2.8. Vacancies. Newly created Directorships resulting from an increase in the number of Directors constituting the entire Board of Directors and vacancies occurring in the Board of Directors for any reason may be filled by vote of a majority of the Directors then in office. A Director elected to fill a vacancy shall hold office until the next annual meeting at which the election of Directors is in the regular order of business and until his or her successor is elected and gualified.
- Section 2.9. Annual Meetings. The annual meeting of the Board of Directors for the election of the Directors and officers of the Corporation and for the transaction of such other business as properly may come before it shall be held in May or at such other time within thirteen months of the last preceding annual meeting as the Directors shall determine, on a date and at a place (which may be either within or outside the State of New York) specified in the notice of the meeting or in the waiver of the notice thereof.
- Section 2.10. Regular Meetings. The Board of Directors from time to time may provide by resolution for the holding of such regular meetings as it may determine upon and may fix the time and place (which may be either within or outside the State of New York) thereof.
- Section 2.11. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called at any time by the Chairman, any Vice Chairman or the President of the Corporation or upon the written demand of not less than one-half of the Directors then in office, at such time and place (which may be either within

or outside the State of New York) as may be specified in the notice of the meeting or in the waiver of the notice thereof.

Section 2.12 Notices of Meetings No notice of any regular meeting of the Board of Directors need be given, provided, however, that if the Board of Directors shall fix or change the time or place of regular meetings, notice of such action shall be mailed promptly to each Director who shall not have been present at the meeting at which such action was taken, addressed to such Director at his or her address as it appears on the records of the Corporation. Notice of each special meeting of the Board of Directors shall be mailed to each Director addressed to such Director at his or her address as it appears on the records of the Corporation at least five days before the day on which the meeting is to be held, or sent by telecopier to such address, or delivered to such Director personally, not later than two days before the day on which the meeting is to be held. Notice of any meeting need not be given to any Director, however, if waived by such Director before or after the meeting in writing or by telecopier. No notice need be given of any meeting at which every member of the Board of Directors shall be present, and any business may be transacted thereat. No notice need be given of any adjourned meeting.

Section 2.13. Quorum and Adjournments. Except as otherwise expressly required by statute and as provided in Section 2.8, at all meetings of the Board of Directors the presence of two thirds of the Directors then in office shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Whether or not a quorum is present, a majority of the Directors present at the appointed time and place of the meeting may adjourn the meeting sine die or to another time and/or place. At any duly adjourned meeting at which a quorum is then present, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the meeting as originally called.

Section 2.14. Voting. At all meetings of the Board of Directors at which a quorum is present, except as otherwise expressly required by statute or by these By-Laws, all matters shall be decided by the vote of a majority of the Directors present at the meeting.

Section 2.15. Action of the Board of Directors Without a Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board of Directors may be taken without a meeting if all members of the Board of Directors consent in writing to the adoption of a resolution authorizing the action. The resolution and the written consents thereto shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors.

Section 2.16. Meeting of the Board of Directors by Means of a Conference Telephone. Any one or more members of the Board of Directors, or any committee thereof, may participate in a meeting of the Board or committee by means of a conference telephone or similar communications equipment allowing all persons participating in the meeting to hear each other at the same time. Participation by such means shall constitute presence in person at a meeting.

Section 2.17. Honorary Directors. The Board of Directors may, at any annual meeting held after the adoption of these By-Laws, elect Honorary Directors for a term of five years. Honorary Directors shall be chosen from among the former Directors of the Board of the Corporation and shall be authorized to attend all meetings of the Board of Directors but shall not be entitled to vote.

### **ARTICLE III**

### **Officers**

### Section 3.1. Number of Officers and Qualifications.

- (a) The officers of the Corporation shall be a Chairman of the Board of Directors, one or more Vice Chairmen, a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer, and such other officers as may be appointed from time to time in accordance with the provisions of Section 3.3 hereof. Any person may hold any two or more offices of the Corporation except (a) those of Chairman and Vice Chairman, (b) those of President and Secretary. No officer, other than the Chairman, each Vice Chairman of the Board, and the President, need be a Director.
- (b) The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. The Chairman shall have general supervision over the affairs of the Corporation, subject, however, to the control of the Board of Directors. He or she shall also have such other powers and perform such other duties, not inconsistent with these By-Laws, as may be assigned to him or her from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- (c) A Vice Chairman, in the absence of the Chairman, shall preside at the meetings of the Board of Directors. A Vice Chairman shall also have such other powers and perform such other duties, not inconsistent with these By-Laws, as may be assigned to him or her from time to time by the Board of Directors or the Chairman.
- (d) The President shall be the chief executive officer of the Corporation and shall:
  - (i) have executive responsibility for conducting the affairs of the Corporation in accordance with policies set by the Board of Directors, subject to the supervision of the Chairman and the direction and control of the Board of Directors;
  - (ii) see that all orders and resolutions of the Board of Directors are carried into effect, and from time to time report to the Board of Directors all matters within his or her knowledge which, in his or her judgment, the interests of the Corporation may require to be brought to the attention of the Board of Directors;
    - (iii) see that all notices are duly given in accordance with these

By-Laws or as required by law:

- (iv) prepare and submit to the Board of Directors plans and suggestions for work to be done or undertaken by the Corporation; and
- (v) assist the Treasurer in keeping the accounts of the Corporation.

He or she shall have such other powers and perform such other duties, not inconsistent with these By-Laws, as may be assigned to him or her from time to time by the Board of Directors or the Chairman, or, in his or her absence, any Vice Chairman.

- Section 3.2. Election and Term of Office. Each officer (except such officers as may be appointed in accordance with the provisions of Section 3.3 hereof) shall be elected by the Board of Directors annually at its annual meetings. The Board of Directors may also at any meeting elect an officer to fill a vacancy. Each such officer, whether elected at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors or to fill a vacancy shall hold office until the close of the election of officers at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors next held after his or her election and thereafter until a successor shall have been elected and shall qualify or until the death, resignation or removal of such officer.
- Section 3.3. Subordinate Officers The Board of Directors from time to time may appoint such other officers or agents or committees as may be deemed advisable. The Board of Directors may delegate to any officer or agent or committee the power to appoint any such subordinate officers or agents or committees, and to prescribe their respective titles, terms of office, authorities and duties.
- Section 3.4. Resignations. Any officer may resign at any time by delivering a written resignation to the President or the Secretary of the Corporation. The acceptance of any such resignation, unless required by the terms thereof, shall not be necessary to make the same effective.
- <u>Section 3.5.</u> <u>Removal.</u> Any officer may be removed at any time either for or without cause by the vote of two-thirds of the Directors then in office at a special meeting of the Board of Directors called for the purpose
- <u>Section 3.6.</u> <u>Vacancies.</u> Any vacancy in any office may be filled for the unexpired portion of the term by the Board of Directors or by any committee, officer or agent to whom the power to fill such vacancy has been delegated pursuant to the provisions of Section 3.3 hereof.
- Section 3.7. Powers and Duties. The officers of the Corporation shall have such powers and duties, except as may be modified by the Board of Directors, as generally pertain to their respective offices as well as such powers and duties as from time to time may be determined by the Board of Directors.

### ARTICLE IV

### Deposits, Checks, Contracts, Etc.

- Section 4.1. Deposit of Funds. All funds of the Corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited in such banks or trust companies or with such bankers or other depositaries as the Board of Directors from time to time may determine.
- <u>Section 4.2.</u> <u>Checks, etc.</u> All checks, drafts, endorsements, notes and evidences of indebtedness of the Corporation shall be signed by such officer or officers or agent or agents of the Corporation and in such manner as the Board of Directors from time to time may determine.
- <u>Section 4.3.</u> <u>Contracts.</u> No contract may be entered into on behalf of the Corporation unless and except as authorized by the Board of Directors; any such authorization may be general or confined to specific instances

### **ARTICLE V**

## Compensation of and Contracts with Directors and Officers

- <u>Section 5.1</u> <u>Compensation</u> Any Director or officer of the Corporation is authorized to receive a reasonable salary or other reasonable compensation from the Corporation for services rendered to the Corporation, when authorized by the Board of Directors, and only when so authorized.
- Section 5.2. Contracts. Any Director or officer is authorized to be interested, directly or indirectly, in any contract or transaction relating to the operations conducted by the Corporation, or in any contract or transaction for furnishing supplies or services thereto, provided that such contract or transaction shall be approved by the Board of Directors and that the interest of such Director or officer therein shall be disclosed or known to the other members of the Board of Directors acting upon or in reference to such contract or transaction. Such contract or transaction must also be approved pursuant to The Foundation's Conflict of Interest Policy

### ARTICLE VII

### Fiscal Year

Section 7.1 Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be the calendar year.

### **ARTICLE VIII**

Distribution in the Event of Dissolution

Section 8.1. <u>Distribution</u>. In the event of the dissolution of the Corporation, none of the assets of the Corporation shall be distributed, directly or indirectly, to any Director or officer of the Corporation but shall be distributed to one or more religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational organizations for the same general purposes for which such assets were held and were to be used by the Corporation.

### **ARTICLE IX**

### Amendments to By-Laws

Section 9.1. Amendments All By-Laws of the Corporation shall be subject to amendment or repeal, and new By-Laws may be made, by vote of two-thirds of the Directors then in office at any annual, regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors, the notice or waiver of notice of which shall have specified or summarized the proposed amendment, repeal or new By-Law; provided, however, that a vote of both (a) two-thirds of the Directors then in office and (b) a majority of the authorized number of Directors shall be required to amend the number of Directors set forth in Section 2.2.

### ARTICLE X

### Committees

Section 10.1. Committees of the Board. The Board of Directors may, by resolution adopted by a vote of majority of the authorized number of Directors, establish and appoint an executive and other standing committees. The chairman of each such committee may be designated by resolution of the Board of Directors or, absent such a designation, appointed by the Chairman. Each committee so appointed shall consist of three or more Directors and, to the extent provided in the resolution establishing it, shall have all the authority of the Board except as to the following matters:

- (a) the filling of vacancies on the Board or on any committee;
- (b) the amendment or repeal of the By-Laws or the adoption of new By-Laws;
- (c) the amendment or repeal of any resolution of the Board which by its terms shall not be so amendable or repealable;
- (d) the fixing of compensation of the Directors for serving on the Board or any committee.

At any meeting of such a standing committee, the presence of a majority of its members then in office shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Special committees may be appointed by the Chairman with the consent of the

Board and shall have only the powers specifically delegated to them by the Board, provided that no such committee shall have any powers not authorized for standing committees pursuant to this Section 10.1.

Section 10.2. Committees of the Corporation. The Board of Directors may create committees other than standing or special committees to be committees of the Corporation. Any such committees created by the Board of Directors shall be appointed by action of the Board of Directors. Such committees may consist of Directors and others.

### THE GREENWALL FOUNDATION

### Charter of the Executive Committee

### I. Purpose

The Executive Committee provides the capacity for emergency action on behalf of the Board, within the limits prescribed by The Foundation's By-Laws. It also acts as the Compensation Committee when it recommends the compensation of the President as set out below.

### II. Membership

The Executive Committee consists of the Chair, Vice Chair, the Chair of the Faculty Scholars Program Committee, the Chair of the Investment and Finance Committee, and the President, a member *ex officio*. The Chair of the Board of Directors serves as Chair of the Executive Committee.

### III. Authority and Responsibilities

When the Board of Directors is not in session, the Executive Committee, subject to the limitations set out below, has all the powers of the Board except those specifically vested in other committees or specifically reserved by the Board of Directors.

In keeping with The Foundation's By-Laws, the Executive Committee is not authorized to fill vacancies in the Board of Directors; amend or repeal the By-Laws or approve adoption of new By-Laws for The Foundation; or amend or repeal any resolution of the Board of Directors.

The Executive Committee is responsible for reviewing the performance of The Foundation's President and recommending to the Board his/her compensation each fiscal year. The President should not be present when the Committee votes on its recommendations to the Board on executive compensation.

Action may be taken by the Executive Committee with the approval of a majority of the members.

### IV. Meetings

The Executive Committee meets as circumstances require and may meet by conference telephone.

A majority of the members of the Committee including the Chair of the Board will constitute a quorum.

Minutes of any meeting should be added to the Board's books and records.

This charter was approved by the Board of Directors at its November 14, 2011 meeting, and will be effective May 21, 2012.

### THE GREENWALL FOUNDATION

### Charter of the Nominating and Governance Committee

### i. Purpose

The Nominating and Governance Committee helps the Board assure effective governance of The Foundation, oversee the composition and effectiveness of the Board and its committees, and identify Director nominees to recommend to the Board.

### II. Membership

The Nominating and Governance Committee consists of the Vice Chair of the Board, and the Chair of the Faculty Scholars Program Committee and the Chair of the Investment Committee. The Chair of the Board and the President are members *ex officio*. The Vice Chair of the Board serves as Chair of the Nominating and Governance Committee.

### III. Authority and Responsibilities

The Nominating and Governance Committee is responsible for monitoring the soundness and effectiveness of The Foundation's governance structure, keeping abreast of best practices in the foundation field, and recommending improvements to the Board as necessary.

The Nominating and Governance Committee has the following authority and responsibilities:

- Review the size and composition of the Board and consider the profile of the Board as a whole in terms of diversity, skills, and experience relevant to The Foundation's work.
- Review the size, composition, and mandates of the committees and recommend Directors for committee assignments.
- Review the functioning, performance, and effectiveness of the Board and its committees.
- Recommend to the Board slates of officers of The Foundation (Chair, Vice Chair, President, Treasurer, and Secretary).
- Recommend to the Board Directors' Committee assignments.
- Review and recommend to the Board compensation of Directors and expense reimbursement policies.

The Nominating and Governance Committee has the following authority and responsibilities regarding Board nominees:

- Establish search criteria for recruitment of Board candidates.
- Evaluate new candidates for nomination to the Board.
- Recommend qualified candidates to the Board
- Review the suitability of continued Board service by each Director prior to the completion of a three-year term and consideration for their reelection to another term.

### IV. Meetings

The Nominating and Governance Committee meets as circumstances require, but normally at least once a year in anticipation of the Annual Meeting of the Board. The Committee may meet by telephone. Any four members of the Committee including the Chair of the Committee will constitute a quorum.

Minutes of all meetings should be prepared by the President and these should be added to the Board's books and records.

This charter was approved by the Board of Directors at its November 14, 2011 meeting, and will be effective May 21, 2012.

### THE GREENWALL FOUNDATION

### Charter of the Investment and Finance Committee

### I. Purpose

The Investment and Finance Committee of The Greenwall Foundation is charged with assuring the effective and prudent investment of the endowment needed to assure a stable source of funds for programs. The Investment and Finance Committee oversees the investment policies and manages the assets of The Foundation. The Committee also reviews and approves the operating budget, approves leases, approves insurance plans, and approves employee benefit plans. The Board may assign other duties to the Committee from time to time.

### II. Membership

The Committee consists of four or more Directors including the Chair and President of The Foundation. Members should have investment expertise or experience with endowment management.

The chair of the Committee is appointed by the Board Chair with consent of the Board. The chair should be an individual with investment or endowment management experience, and ideally have had prior experience on a nonprofit or pension fund trustee committee.

### III. Authority and Responsibilities

The Investment and Finance Committee has the following authority and responsibilities:

- Formulate and review investment policies and asset allocation strategies, taking into account The Foundation's projected spending rate (annual spending as a percent of the average market value of the endowment), expected investment returns, risk tolerance, and liquidity and other relevant constraints.
- Oversee the adoption and implementation of appropriate risk management policies and procedures to manage market, liquidity, operational, credit, and other investment and asset management risks.
- Select The Foundation's investment advisors and investment managers and monitor their performance and capacities for delivering expected performance.
- Approve the annual operating budget, leases for Foundation office space, employee benefit plans, and insurance plans.

### IV. Meetings

The Committee meets two or more times each year, as circumstances require. The Committee may meet by telephone or video conference. Any three members of the Committee will constitute a quorum.

Minutes of Committee meetings should be prepared by the President and the Committee should give full reports on its actions at the next Board meeting following a Committee meeting. The Committee's reports to the Board should cover (a) investment strategy and asset allocation policies; (b) investment performance; (c) decisions on investment managers; and (d) other matters, as requested by the Board.

Minutes of any meeting should be added to the Board's books and records.

This charter was approved by the Board of Directors at its November 14, 2011 meeting, and will be effective May 21, 2012.

### THE GREENWALL FOUNDATION

Charter of the Audit and Risk Management Committee

### I. Purpose

The Audit and Risk Management Committee helps the Board oversee the accounting and financial reporting of The Greenwall Foundation, The Foundation's independent auditor, The Foundation's fiscal controls and risk management, tax and regulatory compliance matters, and compliance with The Foundation's Conflict of Interest Policy. The Board may assign other duties to the Audit and Risk Management Committee from time to time.

### II. Membership

The Audit and Risk Management Committee consists of three or more Directors appointed by the Board. To assure the independence of the Committee, the Board Chair and the President do not serve on the Audit and Risk Management Committee, and its Chair should not be a board member with a close association with an organization with which The Foundation conducts business. All members of the Audit and Risk Management Committee should be financially literate, and at least one member should have accounting and financial reporting expertise. (The Board Chair and the President may be invited to attend parts of the meeting for discussions of risk management or other matters.)

### III. Authority and Responsibilities

The Audit and Risk Management Committee has the following authority and responsibilities:

### Financial Reporting

- Review with the independent auditor important trends and developments in reporting practices and requirements and their effect on The Foundation's financial statements.
- Review with the independent auditor the critical accounting policies and practices used to prepare the financial statements.
- Review the independent auditor's opinion of the financial statements prepared by management and advise the Board whether the opinion and financial statements merit the Board's approval.

### Independent Auditor

- Recommend the appointment of the independent auditor to the Board and periodically consider competitive bids for the audit.
- Oversee the outside auditor and assure its independence.
- Review an annual report by the auditor that describes (a) any aspects of its
  relationship with The Foundation that could affect its objectivity and independence;
  (b) its internal quality controls; (c) any material issues raised by the most recent
  internal or peer review of these controls; (d) any significant issues concerning its
  client audits raised by any inquiry or review by professional, stock exchange, or

regulatory authorities during the past three years; and (e) any steps taken to address these issues.

- Evaluate the experience and qualifications of the senior member of the independent audit team and the overall performance of the audit firm.
- Consider the periodic rotation of the independent auditor's lead partner on The Foundation's account, and, in the Committee's discretion, require the rotation of other members of the audit team.
- Review progress in implementing any independent auditor recommendations approved by the Committee.
- Review any problems or disputes that the independent auditor may have encountered in the course of the audit, including any restrictions on the scope of its activities or on its access to information, and any resulting dialogue with management
- Review and require Committee pre-approval for the recruitment to The Foundation's staff of any employee of the independent auditor, if the employee was a member of the audit team for The Foundation at any time in the past three years.
- Review and require Committee pre-approval for the performance of any non-audit services by the independent auditor.

### Legal and Compliance Matters

- Review (a) legal and tax matters that may have a significant effect on the financial statements; (b) compliance with The Foundation's Conflict of Interest Policy; and (c) any significant government inquiries or proceedings regarding The Foundation's activities.
- Review proposed exceptions to The Foundation's Conflict of Interest Policy on vendors and make the final determination. Should the potential conflict in question involve a member of the Audit and Risk Management Committee, that member should not participate in the review process and final determination.

### Risk Management

- In an environment of heightened awareness of and concern about risk, undertake
  periodic thorough assessments of potential risk and develop and recommend to the
  Board countermeasures to control risk and thereby reduce or prevent harm from
  negative events.
- Areas requiring attention include but are not limited to:
  - > a catastrophic loss in the market value of the endowment;
  - > a terrorist event impairing the viability of New York City as The Foundation's headquarters;
  - activities undercutting The Foundation's reputation and standing as a nonpartisan organization;
  - > the strength of The Foundation's Board and executive leadership;

- > compliance with the Internal Revenue Code and IRS regulations;
- > conflicts of interest:
- compliance with provision of Sarbanes-Oxley applicable to the Corporation;
- compliance with tax payment requirements and myriad federal and state regulatory filings;
- > the strength and vitality of The Foundation grant programs;
- > the quality of The Foundation's grantee research and publications, on which The Foundation's reputation largely depends.

### IV. Meetings

The Audit and Risk Management Committee meets as circumstances require, at least twice a year, once usually in anticipation of the Annual Meeting of the Board. The Committee may meet by telephone or videoconference. Any two members of the Committee constitute a quorum.

Committee meetings should be structured to provide an open avenue of communication between the Board, management, and the independent auditor. The Committee may ask management, the independent auditor, and any Foundation employee, grantee, or vendor to attend its meetings. The Committee should meet in executive session (a) only with outside auditors, and (b) may meet in executive session with outside auditors and with management.

Minutes of all meetings should be prepared by Foundation staff, and these should be added to the Board's books and records.

This charter was approved by the Board of Directors at its November 14, 2011 meeting, and will be effective May 21, 2012.

### THE GREENWALL FOUNDATION

Charter of the Faculty Scholars Program Committee

### I. Purpose

The Faculty Scholars Program Committee of the Corporation is charged with monitoring the Faculty Scholars Program, mentoring Scholars, providing guidance on tenure and promotion, and overseeing professional development activities.

### II. Membership

The Faculty Scholars Program Committee consists of six or more members, at least two of whom will be Directors of The Foundation: the President who will staff the Program and another who will chair the Committee. Members should have the requisite experience credibly to exercise their oversight responsibilities.

### III. Authority and Responsibilities

The Faculty Scholars Program Committee has the following authority and responsibilities:

- Establish criteria for Faculty Scholars, approve application process, interview and select each class of Scholars.
- Monitor professional development activities and mentor Scholars, providing guidance in tenure and promotion process.
- Oversee development of such other bioethics research grantmaking initiatives as The Foundation's asset base may allow and are authorized by the Board.
- Monitor each Scholar's performance and evaluate the Faculty Scholars Program effectiveness.

### IV. Meetings

The Committee meets two or more times each year and may have additional meetings as circumstances require. The Committee may meet by telephone or video conference. Any four members of the Committee, including the President and at least one other Director, will constitute a quorum.

Minutes of Committee meetings should be prepared under the direction of the President, and the Committee should give full reports on its actions at the next Board meeting following a Committee meeting. The Committee reports to the Board should cover (a) grants awarded to Scholars and grants awarded through any subsidiary activities; (b) changes in selection criteria or Program design; (c) strategy for strengthening the Program; and (d) other matters as thought important by the Committee or requested by the Board.

Minutes of any meeting should be added to the Board's books and records.

This charter was approved by the Board of Directors at its November 14, 2011 meeting, and will be effective May 21, 2012.
