#### **BY-LAWS**

**OF** 

## THE JOHN R. OISHEI FOUNDATION

#### A New York Not-for-Profit Corporation

(As amended and restated effective September 14, 2007)
(As amended and restated effective May 18, 2011)

#### **ARTICLE I**

#### **MEMBERS**

1. <u>Members</u>. The Foundation shall have no members. The Board of Directors (hereinafter the "Board") may take any action which is permitted or required to be taken by members of a not-for-profit corporation formed under the laws of New York State, by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board or such greater vote as may be required by law or by these By-Laws, without the necessity of any prior action by the Board which otherwise would have been required by law for such action if there were members entitled to vote thereon.

#### **ARTICLE II**

#### **DIRECTORS**

- 1. <u>Duties and Powers</u>. The affairs and business of the Foundation shall be vested in the Board, who shall pursue such policies and principles as shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Certificate of Incorporation, these By-Laws and the laws of the State of New York. The exact number of directors shall be fixed from time to time by the Board, but shall be not less than five nor more than nine.
- 2. <u>Qualification</u>. All directors shall be at least eighteen years of age. No person shall be elected a director who shall have attained the age of *seventy-five* at the time of his or her election.

- divided into three classes, hereby designated class one, class two and class three. The number of directors in each class shall be as equal in number as possible. The terms of the directors in each class shall expire concurrently and the terms of the classes shall be such that the terms of only one class will expire each year. At each annual meeting of the Board a number of directors equal to the number of those whose terms have expired shall be elected for the term of three years and until their successors are elected and qualified (provided that the Board may shorten the term for which a director is elected in order to maintain an equal number of directors in each class). Such directors shall be elected by a majority of the votes cast. Any director who has served three consecutive three year terms shall not be eligible for immediate re-election to the Board at the expiration of his or her third term, but shall be eligible for re-election following a break of at least one year in his or her service. For purposes of the limitation of the preceding sentence, only three year terms beginning on or after the 2004 annual meeting of the Foundation will be considered.
- 4. <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy on the Board occurring during the year may be filled by a majority vote of the remaining directors (regardless of their number) at any meeting of the Board. The person so chosen shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the Board at which the election of directors is in the regular order of business (or, in the discretion of the Board, until the expiration of the term of the former director in respect of whom the vacancy was created) and his or her successor is elected and qualified.

- 5. Compensation. Members of the Board may receive compensation for their services as directors as fixed by the Board from time to time, and reimbursement of expenses incurred in the performance of such services, provided that the services rendered are reasonable and necessary to carry out the exempt purposes of the Foundation, and further provided that the amount of such compensation is reasonable and commensurate with the value of the services performed. Nothing herein shall preclude a director from serving the Foundation in any other capacity and receiving reasonable compensation for such services.
- 6. Removal. Any director may be removed for cause, and his or her successor chosen, at any time by an affirmative vote of a majority of the Board at any duly held meeting of the Board.
- 7. Appointment of Ex Officio Director. The Board may, but shall not be required to, appoint the President to serve as a director ex officio with all of the powers and privileges of a director except that he or she shall not have a vote and shall not receive compensation for his or her service as director. The President's ex officio membership shall not be counted (a) in determining the number of directors for purposes of the limitations on such number as set forth in section 1 of this Article and (b) in determining a quorum as set forth in section 5 of Article III of these By-Laws.
- 8. Annual Report of Directors. An annual report of the Foundation which shall be prepared in conformity with applicable law shall be presented at the annual meeting of the Board. Such annual report shall be filed with the records of the Foundation and either a copy or an abstract thereof entered in the minutes of the proceedings of the annual meeting.

#### ARTICLE III

#### **MEETINGS OF THE BOARD**

- 1. Annual Meeting. A meeting of the Board shall be held annually for the election of directors and officers and the transaction of such other business as may be appropriate. The annual meeting shall be held within the month of May on such date, at such time of the day, and at such place, as the Board shall designate and the notice of meeting shall specify.
- 2. <u>Regular Meetings</u>. The Board shall hold regular meetings with such frequency as may be determined from time to time by the Board.
- 3. <u>Special Meetings</u>. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the Chair of the Board or the Vice Chair and shall be called by the Chair of the Board upon the request of a majority of the Board.
- 4. <u>Notice of Meetings</u>. Three days' notice shall be given of all meetings of the Board. Notices of such meetings may be either oral or written, and if written, may be given by mail, electronic mail, facsimile transmission or telegram. When notice is given by first class mail, notice shall be deemed to have been given on the date of mailing. No notice need be given to any director who submits a signed waiver of notice before or after the meeting, or who attends the meeting without protesting, prior thereto or at its commencement, the lack of notice to him or her.
- 5. Quorum. At all meetings of the Board, a majority of the entire number of directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. When a quorum is once present to organize the meeting, it is not broken by the subsequent absence of any of those present.

- 6. Adjournment If No Quorum. If less than a quorum is present for any duly noticed meeting of the Board, a majority of the directors present may adjourn the meeting from time to time not exceeding thirty days at any one time until a quorum shall be present and the business of the meeting accomplished. If a meeting is adjourned to another time or place, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given as provided in section 4 of this Article III.
- 7. <u>Voting of Directors</u>. The vote of the majority of the directors at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board, unless the vote of a greater number is required by law or by these By-Laws.
- 8. Action Without a Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board or any committee thereof may be taken without a meeting if all the members of the Board or committee consent in writing to the adoption of a resolution authorizing the action.
- 9. <u>Conference Telephone</u>. Any one or more members of the Board or any committee thereof may participate in a meeting of the Board or committee by means of a conference telephone or similar communications equipment (such as video conferencing equipment) allowing all persons participating in the meeting to hear each other at the same time. Participation by such means shall constitute presence in person at a meeting.

#### ARTICLE IV

#### **COMMITTEES**

1. <u>Standing Committees.</u> The Board shall designate from among its members an audit committee and a governance committee, the composition and purposes of which are specified in Section 4 of this Article IV, and, by resolution of the Board, may designate from among its members other standing committees, each consisting of three or more

directors. Each such other committee, to the extent provided in such resolution and not prohibited by law, shall have all the authority of the Board.

- 2. <u>Special Committees</u>. The Board may also authorize such special committees as may be appointed by the Chair from among the members of the Board, with the consent of the Board. Each such committee shall have only the powers specifically delegated to it by the Board and shall not have powers which by law cannot be delegated to a committee.
- Committees of the Corporation. The Board shall establish an Investment Committee, the composition and purposes of which are specified in Section 4 of this Article IV, and may authorize such other committees as may be deemed desirable. Members of committees established or authorized by this Section (herein referred to as "committees of the corporation") need not be directors. Each committee of the corporation shall have only the powers specifically delegated to it by the Board and shall not have the powers which by law or these By-Laws cannot be delegated to it by the Board and shall not have powers which by law or these By-Laws cannot be delegated to a committee. Each member of a committee of the corporation shall serve at the pleasure of the Board.
- 4. <u>Committees Established by the By-Laws</u>. As to the committee established by these By-Laws:
- (a) Audit Committee. The Audit Committee shall be composed of not less than three nor more than five members of the Board, a majority of whom shall be directors who are not officers of the Foundation. It shall be the duty of the Committee to recommend to the Board the accounting firm to be selected by the Board as independent auditor of the Foundation, and to act on behalf of the Board in meeting and reviewing with the independent auditor and the appropriate Foundation officers, matters relating to Foundation financial reporting and accounting procedures and policies, adequacy of financial, accounting and

operating controls and the scope of the respective audits of the independent auditor. The Committee shall review the results of such audits with the independent auditor and shall promptly report to the Board. The Committee shall additionally submit to the Board any recommendations it may have from time to time with respect to audit procedures.

- (b) Governance Committee. The Governance Committee shall be composed of not less than three nor more than five members of the Board. The Committee shall be responsible for Board development, which include strategic analysis of the Board composition to balance the need for development of new Board members and Board leadership with the need for continuity, ongoing assessment of the capabilities and expertise necessary for optimum composition of the Board, cultivation of potential Board members, orientation of new Board members and ongoing Board training. The Committee shall recommend candidates for Board membership and officers to the Board. The Committee shall periodically review the Foundation's By-Laws for adequacy and compliance with applicable law, and recommend changes when necessary or appropriate.
- composed of not less than three nor more than five members of the Board. It shall be the duty of the Committee to recommend to the Board the Investment Policy Statement ("IPS") and any changes thereto. The Committee shall monitor asset allocation and investment manager performance to ensure conformance with the IPS. In addition, the Committee shall select investment managers, advisors and custodians subject to Board approval. The Committee shall communicate the Foundation's investment performance to the Board and conformance with the IPS. The Committee shall additionally submit to the Board any recommendations it may have from time to time with respect to investment policy or procedures.

#### ARTICLE V

#### **OFFICERS**

- 1. Designation and Election. The officers of the Foundation shall be a Chair of the Board, a Vice Chair, a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer, who shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Board and who, unless otherwise fixed by resolution of the Board, shall hold office until the next annual meeting and thereafter until their successors are chosen. The Foundation may have such other officers as the directors may determine, such officers to be elected at any meeting of the directors. Except for the Chair of the Board and the Vice Chair, both of whom shall be directors, officers may, but need not be directors of the Foundation. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person except that the President may not hold the office of Secretary or Treasurer.
- 2. <u>Chair of the Board</u>. The Chair of the Board shall preside over meetings of the Board. The Chair shall be an ex officio member, with voting rights, of all standing (except the Audit Committee) and other committees of the Board. The Chair shall make and sign in the name of the Foundation all contracts and other instruments which are authorized from time to time by the Board.
- 3. <u>Vice Chair</u>. In the event of the absence or disability of the Chair, the Vice Chair shall have the powers and perform the duties of the Chair. The Vice Chair shall also perform such other duties as shall from time to time be prescribed by the Board.
- 4. <u>President</u>. The President shall have general management responsibilities for the affairs of the Foundation, and perform all the duties incidental to that office. The President, at his/her discretion, has the authority to approve grants up to \$25,000 with subsequent ratification by the Board. The President shall report to the Board or to the Chair of the Board as the representative of the Board.

- 5. <u>Secretary</u>. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Board, shall attend to the giving and serving of all notices of the Foundation and shall affix the corporate seal to all written instruments authorized by the Board, or these By-Laws.
- 6. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall oversee the maintenance of the financial records of the Foundation; shall cause a detailed report of the accounts of the Foundation to be presented when directed by the Board; shall oversee the payment of funds as directed by order of the Board; and shall perform the other duties customarily performed by the Treasurer of a corporation.

The Treasurer, if required by the Board, shall furnish a bond at the Foundation's expense in such form and with one or more sureties satisfactory to the Board, for the faithful performance of the duties of the office, and for the restoration to the Foundation, in case of his or her death, resignation, retirement or removal from office, of all books, papers, vouchers, monies or other property and assets of whatever kind in his or her possession or under his or her control belonging to the Foundation.

- 7. Other Officers. Other officers, if any, shall have such powers and shall perform such duties as shall be prescribed by the Board.
- 8. Removal. Any officer may be removed by the Board with or without cause.
- 9. <u>Vacancies</u>. Any vacancies among the officers of the Foundation during the year shall be filled for the unexpired term by the directors of the Foundation at any duly held meeting of the directors.
- 10. <u>Compensation</u>. The officers of the Foundation may receive compensation for their services as officers as fixed by the Board from time to time, and reimbursement of expenses incurred in the performance of such services, provided that the services rendered are

reasonable and necessary to carry out the exempt purposes of the Foundation, and further provided that the amount of such compensation is reasonable and commensurate with the value of the services performed. Nothing herein shall preclude an officer from serving the Foundation in any other capacity and, except in the case of the President, receiving reasonable compensation for such services.

#### **ARTICLE VI**

#### **INDEMNIFICATION OF DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS**

Indemnification. The Foundation shall indemnify to the broadest and maximum extent permitted by the New York Not-for-Profit Corporation Law, as the same exists on the date of the adoption of this Article or to the greater extent permitted by any amendment of that Law (the intent being to provide the greatest of those indemnification rights permitted by that Law at any time from the time of the act or omission through the final disposition of the action) any person ("Indemnitee") made or threatened to be made a party to any action or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, including an action by or in the right of any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise which any director or officer of the Foundation served in any capacity at the request of the Foundation, by reason of the fact that such person is or was a director or officer of the Foundation or is or was serving such other enterprise at the request of the Foundation; provided, however, that the Foundation shall provide indemnification in connection with any such action or proceeding initiated by an Indemnitee only if such action or proceeding was authorized by the Board.

- 2. Advances. Expenses incurred by an Indemnitee in defending an action or proceeding shall be paid by the Foundation in advance of the final disposition of such action or proceeding upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of an Indemnitee to repay the expenses so advanced by the Foundation to the extent they exceed the indemnification to which the Indemnitee is entitled. Unless otherwise required by law, such Indemnitee shall not be required as a condition of obtaining advancement of expenses hereunder to show that the Indemnitee has met the applicable standard of conduct provided by law for indemnification in connection with such action or proceeding.
- 3. <u>Benefit</u>. The rights of indemnification and advancement of expenses provided for in this Article shall inure to the benefit of the Indemnitee's legal representatives, heirs and distributees.

- 4. <u>Insurance</u>. The Board may, in its discretion, authorize the Foundation to purchase and maintain insurance to indemnify itself for any obligation which it incurs as a result of the indemnification of any Indemnitee or to indemnify any Indemnitee to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 5. Interpretation. To the extent permitted under applicable law, the rights of indemnification and advancement of expenses provided in this Article (a) shall be available with respect to events occurring prior to the adoption of this Article, (b) shall continue to exist after any rescission or restrictive amendment of this Article with respect to events occurring prior to such rescission or amendment, (c) shall be interpreted on the basis of applicable law in effect at the time of the occurrence of the event or events giving rise to the action or proceeding or, at the sole discretion of the Indemnitee (or, if applicable, at the sole discretion of the heirs, distributees or legal representatives of such Indemnitee seeking such rights), on the basis of applicable law in effect at the time such rights are claimed and (d) shall be in the nature of contract rights that may be enforced in any court of competent jurisdiction as if the Foundation and the Indemnitee were parties to a separate written agreement.
- 6. Other Rights. The rights of indemnification and advancement of expenses provided in this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which any Indemnitee or other person may now or hereafter be otherwise entitled, whether contained in the Certificate of Incorporation, these By-Laws, a resolution of the Board or an agreement providing for such indemnification, the creation of such other rights being hereby expressly authorized. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the rights of indemnification and advancement of expenses provided in this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any rights, pursuant to statute or otherwise, of any Indemnitee or other person in any action or proceeding to have

assessed or allowed in his or her favor, against the Foundation or otherwise, his or her costs and expenses incurred therein or in connection therewith or any part thereof.

7. Severability. If this Article or any part hereof shall be held unenforceable in any respect by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall be deemed modified to the minimum extent necessary to make it enforceable and the remainder of this Article shall remain fully enforceable.

#### **ARTICLE VII**

#### **OFFICES**

- Office. The principal office of the Foundation shall be located in the
   County of Erie and State of New York.
- 2. <u>Additional Offices</u>. The Foundation may have offices at such other places within or without the State of New York as the Board may from time to time determine appropriate or the business of the Foundation may require.

#### **ARTICLE VIII**

#### **MISCELLANEOUS**

- 1. <u>Fiscal Year</u>. The fiscal year of the Foundation shall begin on the first day of January and terminate on the last day of December in each calendar year.
- 2. <u>Seal</u>. The seal of the Foundation shall be in the form of a circle, and shall bear the words "Corporate Seal, New York," and the name of the Foundation and the year of incorporation.

### **ARTICLE IX**

### **AMENDMENTS**

1. <u>Amendment</u>. These By-Laws may be amended, enlarged or repealed at any meeting of the Board by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the entire Board, provided that the proposed amendment or amendments shall have been provided to the Board not less than three days prior to the meeting at which the amendment or amendments shall be acted upon.
