Notes to Financial Statements

Year ended December 31, 2011 (Expressed in Canadian dollars, except as otherwise stated)

World Federation of Hemophilia - Fédération Mondiale de l'Hémophilie (the "Federation") is incorporated under Part II of the Canada Corporations Act. The Federation became a registered charity under the Income Tax Act (Canada) in 2005. The Federation is composed of representatives from hemophilia organizations in 118 countries. The mission of the Federation is to improve and sustain care for people with inherited bleeding disorders around the world. As part of its activities, the Federation receives product donations in the form of medicine from pharmaceutical companies and distributes those products to health organizations and other agencies located around the world.

The Federation is not required to pay income taxes on the excess of revenue over expenses as it is a registered not-for-profit organization

1. Significant accounting policies:

(a) Revenue recognition:

The Federation follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or as receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Donated products are recognized as revenue when received from donors and shipped to beneficiaries and are recorded at their fair market value if those amounts can be reasonably estimated. Distributions of product donations are recognized as expenses when shipped on behalf of the Federation to the beneficiaries, or sent directly by donating companies.

A Hemophilia World Congress is held every two years. Revenues and expenses from Congress activities are recognized in full in the year during which the Congress is held. Revenues and expenses are deferred as deferred contributions or prepaid expenses until the year during which the Congress is held.

Some events are held every two years. Revenues and expenses from those events are recognized in full in the year during which those events are held.

Notes to Financial Statements, Continued

Year ended December 31, 2011 (Expressed in Canadian dollars, except as otherwise stated)

1. Significant accounting policies (continued):

(b) Foreign exchange translation:

The financial statements are expressed in Canadian dollars. Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into Canadian dollars at the rates of exchange in effect at year-end. Non-monetary assets and liabilities are translated into Canadian dollars at historical rates of exchange in effect at the transaction date. Revenues and expenses in foreign currencies are translated into Canadian dollars at the rates of exchange in effect at the transaction dates. Gains and losses on translation of foreign currencies are included in the statement of revenue and expenses.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents:

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, bank balances less outstanding cheques and investments in monetary market instruments with a maturity period of three months or less when purchased. At December 31, 2011 and 2010, there were no cash equivalents

(d) Capital assets:

Capital assets are recorded at cost less accumulated amortization. Amortization of office equipment, computer hardware and computer software is computed using the straight-line method at annual rates of 20%, 33 1/3% and 100%, respectively. Amortization of leasehold improvements is computed using the straight-line method over the duration of the lease.

(e) Deferred contributions:

Deferred contributions represent unspent resources for various workshops and designated activities.

(f) National Member Organizations:

Contributions from National Member Organizations are recognized when received or receivable An allowance for possible uncollectible amounts is also provided for accordingly.

(g) International Hemophilia Training Centres - Fellowships.

Fellowships are expensed in the year of approval by the Executive Committee.

1. Significant accounting policies (continued):

(h) Financial instruments.

Subsequent to the adoption of Section 3855, Financial Instruments - Recognition and Measurement, of the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants ("CICA") Handbook, the Federation classifies its financial instruments as follows:

- (i) Cash and cash equivalents are classified as financial assets held for trading and are measured at fair value, which is the carrying amount due to the approaching maturity of these financial instruments.
- (ii) Contributions and other receivables are classified as loans and receivables and accounts payable and accrued liabilities as other liabilities, and are initially recorded at fair value, which is the carrying amount due to the approaching maturity of these financial instruments.
- (iii) Short-term and long-term investments are classified as held for trading and are recorded at fair value, which is the quoted market value. Resulting gains and losses are recorded in the statement of revenue and expenses
- (iv) Forward foreign exchange contracts are classified as derivative financial instruments and are measured at fair value, which is the quoted market value. Resulting gains and losses are recorded in the statement of revenue and expenses.

The CICA issued Section 3862, Financial Instruments - Disclosures, and Section 3863, Financial Instruments - Presentation, in replacement of Section 3861, Financial Instruments - Disclosure and Presentation. The Federation had the option to apply these sections or to continue to disclose and present its financial instruments in accordance with Section 3861. The Federation elected to present its disclosures in accordance with Section 3861.

(i) Contributed materials and services

Contributed materials, including product donations, are recognized in the financial statements when a fair value can be reasonably estimated and when the materials and services are used in the normal course of operations and would otherwise have been purchased. The fair value is established at the date of contribution.

Contributions of volunteers are not recognized in the financial statements because of the difficulty of determining the fair value of the contributed services.

Notes to Financial Statements, Continued

1. Significant accounting policies (continued):

(j) Allocation of expenses

The mission of the Federation is to improve and sustain care for people with inherited bleeding disorders around the world. As part of its activities, the Federation engages in various programs. The costs of each program include the costs of personnel, premises and other expenses that are directly related to providing the program as well as general support expenses that are common to the administration of the organization.

Cost of personnel and general support expenses are being allocated to the programs on the basis of employees' time spent on the particular program, and applied on that basis consistently each year.

(k) Management estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

With regard to the organization of the 2012 Hemophilia World Congress, the Federation is committed to pay \$521,589 for the rental of the Le Palais des Congrès de Paris and \$2,078,333 for hotel accommodation purposes. Cancellation of hotel contracts would result in penalties.

(b) Letter of guarantee

A bank guarantee of €200,000 valid to June 2016 has been issued in favour of the Federation's fiscal representative in France. The guarantee amount is covered by investments having an equivalent amount of \$300,000.

9. Product donations:

Product donations coordinated by the Federation but channelled through Hemophilia of Georgia - USA, or shipped directly by donation companies, are recorded in the financial statements of World Federation of Hemophilia USA (note 10 (b))

Product donations are priced using the current year's Red Book, a reference document used by pharmacists to help them, among other things, determine the pricing of most common drugs. For products not listed in the Red Book, the Federation establishes their prices based on products with similar characteristics listed in the Red Book.

(b) World Federation of Hemophilia USA.

World Federation of Hemophilia USA was incorporated as a not-for-profit corporation in the State of New York on April 29, 1996. World Federation of Hemophilia USA is organized exclusively for charitable, educational and scientific purposes and qualifies as a tax-exempt organization under Section 501 (c)(3) of the US Internal Revenue Code.

The specific purpose of World Federation of Hemophilia USA is to mobilize US support for the World Federation of Hemophilia's global mission to improve and sustain care for individuals with inherited bleeding disorders around the world. As part of its activities, World Federation of Hemophilia USA receives product donations in the form of medicine from US-based pharmaceutical companies and distributes these products to health organizations and other agencies located around the world.

(b) World Federation of Hemophilia USA (continued).

World Federation of Hemophilia USA works in close collaboration with the Federation in providing donations of services, education and humanitarian aid worldwide.

The accounts of World Federation of Hemophilia USA expressed in US dollars have not been consolidated in the financial statements.

Effective January 1, 2011, World Federation of Hemophilia USA signed a Services Agreement with World Federation of Hemophilia whereby World Federation of Hemophilia would provide certain administrative and other services to World Federation of Hemophilia USA, certain of which without compensation, and to provide the rest of those services solely for reimbursement by World Federation of Hemophilia USA of certain costs and expenses that it incurs in doing so.

12. Financial instruments:

(a) Interest rate risk:

(c) Currency risk:

The Federation is exposed to currency risk as a result of the significant portion of donations received which are denominated in US dollars. In 2011, these risks were covered partially by forward foreign exchange contracts. Such contracts have not been designated as hedges for accounting purposes and accordingly are recognized in the balance sheet and measured at fair value with changes in fair value recognized in the statement of revenue and expenses.

13. Comparative information:

Some 2010 comparative information has been reclassified to conform with the financial statement presentation adopted for the current year.

Volunteer contributions:

In the course of its operations, the Federation depends on the contributions of volunteers to carry out its various programs. Services provided by volunteers include training by hemophilia health care specialists in hematology, orthopedics, nursing, laboratory activities, physiotherapy, organization and management. Volunteers further contribute to the work of the Federation by preparing educational materials and serving on committees and task forces. Management estimates the value of these services to be approximately \$3,399,356 for the year ended December 31, 2011 (2010 - \$3,222,817). This amount has not been recorded in the financial statements.

Schedule A - Part IV Supplemental Information

Part II, Section C, line 17b - Facts and circumstances test - 2011

- 1. Attraction of Public Support. WFH USA is organized and operated so as to attract new and additional public support on a continuous basis. Through a Services Agreement with its Canadian affiliate, World Federation of Hemophilia ("WFH"), WFH USA maintains a continuous and bona fide program for solicitation of funds from the general public, as well as engaging in activities designed to attract in-kind donations of clotting factor and other pharmaceutical products from multiple sources. Hemophilia treatment products received as donations are distributed to as many as 50 developing countries each year for treatment of thousands of people with haemophilia and related bleeding disorders. This activity is namely called the Humanitarian Aid Program. Cash contributions are utilized to cover the operational costs related the Humanitarian Aid Program, to support other charitable activities (such as the Journey Around the World Project), and to pay WFH USA's administrative expenses. The scope of WFH USA's fund-raising activities is reasonable in light of its charitable activities. More specifically, WFH employs a full-time Development Director who is assisted by an Annual Giving Manager and a Fundraising Officer.
- 2. The Charity's Percentage of Public Support. WFH USA's total support from the public during the five-year period ending CY 2010 was at 11.5%; for the five-year period ending CY 2011 the ratio dropped to 9.26%. As explained in Part III of Form 990, WFH USA's mission is to mobilize US support for the WFH's global mission to improve and sustain care for individuals with inherited bleeding disorders around the world. As also explained in Part III of Form 990, the primary way that WFH USA carries out that mission is through a Humanitarian Aid Program in which it receives product donations that are then distributed each year in as many as 50 developing countries for treatment of thousands of persons with hemophilia and related bleeding disorders. As a result, the great majority of WFH USA's support is received in the form of in-kind contributions of blood clotting factor or other related pharmaceutical products from U.S. manufacturers of those products. As there are only a limited number of such manufacturers, the more successful that WFH USA is in obtaining substantial contributions from them, the lower WFH USA's public support percentage will be. Thus, WFH USA limits its activities to a special field and that inherently limits the number of its in-kind contributors. In other words, the nature of WFH USA's Humanitarian Aid Program is the reason that WFH USA's public support percentage is relatively low. More specifically, there were until the five-year period ending 2010, five major donors of blood clotting factor products. For this five-year period ending in 2011, there are now only four major donors. Considering the calculation method of the ratio, this situation had the effect of reducing the public support ratio below 10%.
- 3. The Charity's Sources of Public Support. WFH USA's public support is derived from a representative number of persons. WFH USA does not receive most of its support from the members of a single family or from a single business. During the five-year period ending CY 2011, WFH USA received in-kind contributions of blood clotting factor or other related pharmaceutical products from 9 separate (and unrelated) sources. WFH USA also received cash donations from more than 300 different (and unrelated) individuals or organizations during that time period.

- 4. WFH USA's Governing Body. WFH USA has a governing body that represents the broad interests of the public. Its governing body does not represent the personal or private interests of a limited number of donors. WFH USA's governing body is comprised of persons having special knowledge or expertise in the particular field or discipline in which WFH USA operates and/or other persons having a knowledge of, and an interest in, WFH USA and its mission to improve and sustain care for people with inherited bleeding disorders. WFH USA's governing body represent a broad cross-section of the views and interests of persons with inherited bleeding disorders and persons devoted to treating those disorders. None of the members of WFH USA's governing body are selected by, affiliated with, or otherwise represent the interests of the manufacturers of blood clotting factor or other related pharmaceutical products that contribute such products to WFH USA.
- 5. WFH USA's Facilities and Services. WFH USA provides facilities or services directly for the benefit of the general public on a continuing basis and maintains a definitive program to accomplish its charitable work on a world-wide basis. As already noted, each year, WFH USA's Humanitarian Aid Program benefits thousands of persons with hemophilia and related bleeding disorders in as many as 50 developing countries.
