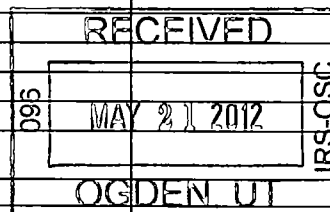

<p>Foundation Conference: The annual Dysferlin Conference brings together scientists and clinicians working to understand and develop a therapy for the dysferlinopathies, Limb Girdle Muscular Dystrophy 2B (LGMD2B) and Miyoshi Myopathy. These diseases, caused by mutations in dysferlin, are characterized by progressive muscle wasting beginning in the late teenage years. Although dysferlin has been implicated in repair of muscle fiber membrane tears, a more complete understanding of dysferlin's function and role in pathology is required for effective development of therapies. The objective of the 5th Annual Dysferlin Conference, held from July 11-14, 2011 in Chicago, IL, USA, was to speed research on dysferlinopathy by promoting the sharing of ideas and unpublished data between scientists actively working on dysferlin and other relevant therapeutic approaches. During this meeting, researchers funded by the Jain Foundation presented new findings implicating new roles for dysferlin and opening new avenues for therapeutic interventions. The conference was sponsored and organized by the Jain Foundation, and participants included 34 invited speakers (20 additional scientists that were not speaking), 31 scientific poster presenters, 5 representatives of other muscular dystrophy foundations, and 12 members of the Jain Foundation scientific team. Research was presented from 11 countries around the world. Four patients from the Jain Foundation's patient registry also shared their experiences with this disease including the risk of misdiagnosis and the damaging outcome of treatments given as a result of the misdiagnosis.</p>	\$ 112,219.

<p>Research Resources: One goal of the Jain Foundation is to promote cross-collaboration between scientists and labs along many different research lines. The foundation encourages labs not only to share ideas but also research tools such as mice, DNA, antibodies and cells. This collaboration is imperative in order to improve the quality of research results and reduce the costs and time taken to do experiments. Towards this end, two initiatives proved to be helpful in 2011, the re-design of the Foundation's website with detailed information for researchers and physicians and the continued generation and maintenance of many research tools.</p>	\$ 62,563.

The Foundation's Website: The Foundation's website was first available in 2005 when the Foundation was formed. It grew organically as the Foundation grew its funding footprint and soon became a reliable source of information on dysferlinopathy. Researchers, physicians and patients worldwide visit the website for data, facts and the latest information about this disease. In 2011 the Foundation redesigned its website to make it more user friendly to the dysferlin community and to make it easy for the Foundation's team to update. This initiative was very important because the Foundation funds and works with scientists, physicians and patients worldwide but has a single small office in Seattle, WA. The Foundation also reviews and summarizes research from all over the world and makes these reviews available on the website as a database of specific and pertinent information. Having complex information and scientific results synthesized in an easy to navigate manner increases efficiency of all projects. The website also hosts the patient registry and the resource sharing network. It provides information about misdiagnosis and lists physicians across the world that patients can consult. Approximately 4000 people visit our website frequently.

The Generation and Maintenance of Tools: The Jain Foundation actively identifies and funds the development of research tools and resources that are needed to advance research in the dysferlin field. These tools include DNA constructs, mouse models, cell lines, and antibodies that are either commercially available or can be obtained with assistance from us. The Foundation is also committed to developing and providing frequently required reagents, the unavailability of which slows down research. For example, the Foundation designed and funded the generation of antibodies through a specialty antibody generation company and through academic labs. In addition, it generated and maintained new mouse models at a custom breeding colony at Jackson Laboratories (Maine, US). Information about these resources are frequently disseminated to relevant researchers through e-mails and through the Foundation's website.

While the focus of its funded research is LGMD2B, the resulting scientific advances and collaborations will also have a broader impact on human health through their relevance to other conditions, including muscle disorders in general, degenerative diseases of tissues other than muscle, and normal aging. Examples include those on stem cell therapy, gene therapy, editing within DNA and RNA, repair of cellular injury, and intervention in membrane biology. The Foundation is very hands-on in its approach to funding. It closely monitors progress of every project it funds (every quarter) and keeps track of results and agreed upon timelines through detail oriented

<p>Patient Identification and Registration: Given the relative rarity of this disease, one of the goals of the Foundation is to identify a worldwide LGMD2B patient population. The Foundation maintains a patient registry and facilitates by providing funding for patients' diagnosis to the genetic and molecular level, which will greatly accelerate the process of patient recruitment for clinical trials. In 2011, three important developments were initiated by the Jain Foundation to enhance patient recruitment efforts. The first was a project started in partnership with a lab in Mumbai (India) to effectively and rapidly diagnose and recruit patients in India. The second was to establish a project at Emory University (GA) to expedite and overcome an important and expensive diagnostic roadblock. The third was the development of a clinical outcome study (COS) with 14 centers worldwide. These initiatives will greatly expedite not only the recruitment of patients of this rare disease but also help in understanding the progression of this disease. The Foundation continues the task of educating neuromuscular physicians about LGMD2B by participating at relevant physician meetings and by targeted mailing of information about the disease. Finally the Foundation team also keeps abreast of any relevant clinical trials and their roadblocks and provides this information on its website.
