

Notes to Financial Statements

1. Nature of Operations and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of Operations

The accompanying financial statements of Collectors Foundation (Foundation) have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP). Certain amounts from the prior year have been reclassified to conform with the current year presentation. These reclassifications had no impact on net assets. Management has evaluated subsequent events through the date these financial statements were available to be issued, April 30, 2012.

The Foundation is a public charitable foundation whose mission and principal activities are to receive and administer funds for fostering preservation of, and education about, historic vehicles and vintage boats. The Foundation's revenues and other support are derived principally from contributions, including in-kind contributions, and its activities are conducted throughout the United States. The Foundation intends to provide scholarships and grants to those persons and organizations who work to further the education, preservation and safety of historic vehicles and vintage boats.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, gains, losses and other changes in net assets during the reporting period. Although the estimates are considered reasonable, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Foundation considers all liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents. At December 31, 2011 and 2010, cash equivalents consisted primarily of money market accounts with a broker.

At December 31, 2011 and 2010, the Foundation's cash accounts did not exceed federally insured limits. Effective December 31, 2010 through December 31, 2012, all non-interest bearing transaction deposit accounts are fully insured regardless of amount.

Investments

Investments consisted of equity securities that are unrestricted and are administered by an investment manager. Changes in unrealized gains and losses are included in the statements of activities as investment income. Any realized gains and losses from the sale of investments are calculated using the specific identification method. Equity investments are carried at estimated fair value and consisted of the following:

Other Assets

The Collectors Foundation currently holds a 1950 Lyman boat with an estimated fair market value of \$7,000. In 2010, management allowed a local museum to use the item as an educational piece, and has reclassified the asset from assets held for sale to other assets on the accompanying statements of financial position.

Contributions

Gifts of cash and other assets received without donor stipulations are reported as unrestricted revenue and net assets. Gifts received with a donor stipulation, if any, that limits their use are reported as temporarily or permanently restricted revenue and net assets. When a donor-stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Gifts having donor stipulations that are satisfied in the period the gift is received are reported as unrestricted revenue and net assets. The Foundation received unrestricted contributions during the year ended December 31, 2011 and received both unrestricted and temporarily restricted contributions during the year ended December 31, 2010. Temporarily restricted net assets will be used to fund future scholarships.

Unconditional gifts expected to be collected within one year are reported at their net realizable value. Unconditional gifts expected to be collected in future years are reported at the present value of estimated future cash flows. The resulting discount is amortized using the level-yield method and is reported as contribution revenue.

Conditional gifts depend on the occurrence of a specified future and uncertain event to bind the potential donor, and are recognized as assets and revenue when the conditions are substantially met and the gift becomes unconditional.

In-Kind Contributions

In addition to receiving cash contributions, the Foundation receives in-kind contributions from various donors. It is the policy of the Foundation to record the estimated fair value of certain in-kind donations as an expense in its financial statements, and similarly increase contribution revenue by a like amount. For the years ended December 31, 2011 and 2010, \$160,135 and \$127,653, respectively, was recorded as in-kind contributions.

Income Taxes

Under current IRS rules, exempt organizations must complete calculations by the end of their sixth year to determine if the organization is publicly supported and, therefore, retain public charity status. The year ended December 31, 2010 marked the end of the sixth year of operations for the Foundation, and calculations were completed prior to December 31, 2011 and submitted to the IRS in order to determine if it will continue as a public charity or if it must be converted to a private foundation. As of the date of this report, there is no indication from the IRS that there will be a change in status from a public charity to a private foundation.

The Foundation has not identified any material uncertain tax positions. As such, the disclosures required by GAAP pertaining to uncertain tax positions have been omitted.

Notes to Financial Statements

Fair Value Measurements

The Foundation values its investments in accordance with the provisions of Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, which defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value and expands disclosures about fair value measurements. See Note 5 for disclosures related to fair value measurements.

2. Contributions Receivable

Contributions receivable at December 31, 2011 and 2010 consisted of \$186,292 and \$97,740, respectively, of contributions due within one year. The Foundation believes these contributions receivable are fully collectible and, as such, has not established an allowance for uncollectible contributions receivable.

3. Related-Party Transactions

The Foundation received substantial support from HagertyPlus, LLC. HagertyPlus, LLC is partially owned by a Foundation Board member. The Foundation currently receives donated office space and administrative services, including the salary and benefits of the Foundation's executive director, from HagertyPlus, LLC. Additionally, the Foundation receives cash contributions from HagertyPlus, LLC. This relationship provided the Foundation with \$187,500 and \$199,993, respectively, of unrestricted cash contributions and \$160,135 and \$127,653, respectively, in inkind contributions for the years ended December 31, 2011 and 2010.

The Foundation receives contributions from various members of its Board of Directors. Contributions received from Board members totaled \$14,375 and \$103,760 for 2011 and 2010, respectively.

4. Significant Estimates and Concentrations

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require disclosure of certain significant estimates and current vulnerabilities due to certain concentrations. Those matters include the following:

Contributions

Approximately 40% and 39% of all contributions were received from HagertyPlus, LLC for the years ended December 31, 2011 and 2010, respectively.

5. Fair Value Measurements

ASC 820 defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants. A fair value measurement assumes that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability occurs in the principal market for the asset or liability, or in the absence of a principal market, the most advantageous market for the asset or liability.

The price of the principal (or most advantageous) market used to measure the fair value of the asset or liability shall not be adjusted for transaction costs. An orderly transaction is a transaction that assumes exposure to the market for a period prior to the measurement date to allow for marketing activities that are usual and customary for transactions involving such assets and liabilities; it is not a forced transaction. Market participants are buyers and sellers in the principal market that are: (i) independent; (ii) knowledgeable; (iii) able to transact; and (iv) willing to transact.

ASC 820 requires the use of valuation techniques that are consistent with the market approach, the income approach and/or the cost approach. The market approach uses prices and other relevant information generated by market transactions involving identical or comparable assets and liabilities. The income approach uses valuation techniques to convert future amounts, such as cash flows or earnings, to a single present amount on a discounted basis. The cost approach is based on the amount that currently would be required to replace the service capacity of an asset (replacement cost). Valuation techniques should be consistently applied. Inputs to valuation techniques refer to the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. Inputs may be observable, meaning that those that reflect the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on market data obtained from independent sources, or unobservable, meaning those that reflect the reporting entity's own assumptions about the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on the base information available in the circumstances. In that regard, ASC 820 establishes a fair value hierarchy for valuation inputs that gives the highest priority to quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs. The fair value hierarchy is as follows:

- Level 1 Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Foundation has the ability to access as of the measurement date.
- Level 2 Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be derived from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.
- Level 3 Significant unobservable inputs that reflect the Foundation's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.
