1. Organization and Nature of Activities

Voices Against Brain Cancer, Inc. (the "Organization") is a New York non-profit corporation. The Organization's mission is to find a cure for brain cancer by advancing scientific research, increasing awareness within the medical community and supporting patients, their families and caregivers afflicted with this devastating disease.

The Organization is supported primarily through public support received from donations, grants and fundraising events. The Organization's support for the year ended December 31, 2011 came primarily from six fundraising events and a one-time grant. The Organization fulfills its goals primarily through contributions to other charitable organizations.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

<u>Presentation of Financial Statements</u> – The financial statements for the Organization are prepared in accordance with the provisions of the FASB Codification Topic 958-10, Not-for-Profit Entities. Under this topic, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted assets, and permanently restricted net assets. As permitted by the topic, the Organization does not use fund accounting.

<u>Accrual Basis</u> - The financial statements of the Organization have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and accordingly, reflect all significant receivables, payables and other liabilities.

<u>Use of Estimates</u> - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

<u>Cash and Cash Equivalents</u> – Cash and cash equivalents consist of all cash balances and highly liquid investments with a remaining maturity of three months or less when purchased and are carried at fair value. At December 31, 2011, the Organization did not hold any cash equivalents.

<u>Fair Value of Financial Instruments</u> – The Company's financial instruments include cash, receivables, and accounts payable and accrued expenses. The Company believes that the carrying amounts of these instruments are reasonable estimates of their fair value because of the short-term nature of such instruments.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

<u>Income Taxes</u> – It has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service that the Organization is a publicly supported tax-exempt entity under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code. Contributions are tax deductible by donors under applicable Internal Revenue Code Sections. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is required.

The Foundation has no unrecognized tax benefits at December 31, 2011. The Foundation's U.S. Federal and state income tax returns prior to fiscal years 2008, respectively, are closed and management continually evaluates expiring statutes of limitations, audits, proposed settlements, changes in tax law and new authoritative rulings.

If applicable, the Foundation would recognize interest and penalties associated with tax matters as management and general expenses and include accrued interest and penalties with accrued expenses in the statement of financial position. There were no interest or penalties paid for the year ended December 31, 2011.

Classification of net assets and support - The Organization separately accounts for and reports donor-restricted and unrestricted donations and net assets. Unrestricted donations and net assets are not externally restricted for identified purposes by donors or grantors. Assets set aside by the Board of Trustees are not considered to be donor-restricted. Temporarily restricted donations and net assets are those whose use is temporarily limited by the donor. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported as net assets released from restrictions. If donor-imposed restrictions are met in the same period as the gift or investment income is received, the amount is reported as unrestricted revenues. Permanently restricted net assets have been restricted by donors to be maintained by the Organization in perpetuity. At December 31, 2011, no unrestricted net assets were set aside by the Board of Trustees.

<u>Revenue recognition</u> – The Organization's revenue is derived from donations, grants, sponsorships, and program revenues.

<u>Contributions</u> – The Organization has adopted FASB Codification Topic 958-605, Not-for-Profit Entities – Revenue Recognition to account for contributions received, and FASB Codification Topic 958-720, Not-for-Profit Entities – Other Expenses to account for contributions made. Contributions made are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted or permanently restricted support depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions.

Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a donation that is in substance unconditional. For the years ended December 31, 2011, generally, all contributions are unrestricted and recorded when received. Contributions that are received in advance for a specific event will be deferred until the event occurs.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

<u>Contributed Services</u> - During the year ended December 31, 2011, the value of contributed services meeting the requirements for recognition in the financial statements was not material, and has not been recorded. These services do not meet the criteria for recognition as contributed services.

<u>Allocation of Expenses</u> – The costs of providing the various programs and activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

<u>Property and Equipment</u> - It is the Organization's policy to capitalize property and equipment over \$1,000. Lesser amounts are expensed. Purchased property and equipment is capitalized at cost. Donations of property and equipment are recorded as contributions at their estimated fair value. Such donations are reported as unrestricted contributions unless the donor has restricted the donated asset to a specific purpose. Assets donated with explicit restrictions regarding their use and contributions of cash that must be used to acquire property and equipment are reported as restricted

2. Grants Payable

The goal of the Organization's granting program is to support both research and non-research programs that advance the Organization's mission. Grants payable at December 31, 2011 represent unpaid amounts committed to by the Organization's research board.

3. Grant Income

Have A Chance, Inc. Grant - During 2010, the board of directors of Have A Chance, Inc. (a New York non-profit corporation) approved a plan to dissolve its Organization pursuant to Article 10 of the New York Not-for-Profit Corporation Law. As part of that plan, Have A Chance, Inc. conveyed all of its assets in the form of a restricted purpose grant in the amount of \$426,291 to the Organization in 2011. The restricted purpose grant, including any income earned thereon, can only be used for the purpose of: (i) financially supporting research efforts in regard to the treatment of brain cancers and/or tumors and/or other cancers, and promoting public awareness of the same; (ii) to provide assistance to those suffering from brain cancers and/or other cancers; and (iii) engaging in any and all other lawful activities incidental to and in pursuit of the foregoing purposes.

In addition to maintaining separate recordkeeping and separation of funds, the Organization is required to appoint a at least one board member from the Have A Chance, Inc. board of directors to the Organization's board for a full term and at least one committee appointment for the annual "Walk to Fight Brain Tumors" for a minimum of two full terms.

3. Grants (Continued)

<u>Duke University Grant</u> – Duke University has obtained a non-binding pledge agreement from an individual for a recurring annual grant to the Organization for brain cancer research. Under the agreement, the Organization could receive \$200,000 annually each year for the years 2011 through 2015 for a total of \$1,000,000. The grant is considered to be an exchange transaction. Accordingly, revenue is recognized when earned and expenses are recognized as incurred.

4. Concentration of Risk

The Company maintains cash balances with two financial institutions, which, at times, may exceed federally insured amounts. The Company believes that it is not exposed to any significant credit risk on cash and cash equivalents. Cash in excess of federally insured limits at December 31, 2011 amounted to \$966,838.

5. Subsequent Events

These financial statements considered subsequent events through June 21, 2013, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
