ALBEMARLE GOTTWALD SCHOLARSHIP GRANT PROGRAM

Rules and Regulations

Eligibility

Qualified applicants for scholarships shall be dependent children of any regular employee of Albemarle Corporation and its subsidiaries who are high school seniors eligible to graduate in the current year. A child is a dependent for this purpose as defined in Section 152 of the Internal Revenue Code and properly reported as dependents on the employee's income tax returns. Further, employees include deceased employees who qualify as employees at the time of their death, or retired employees who qualify as such employees at the time of their retirement.

Scholarship Grants

Scholarships will be granted for full-time study toward a degree in **business, engineering, math or science** at a recognized four-year college or university located within the U.S. or described in Sections 117 and 170 of the Internal Revenue Code. The awards can be used for tuition, fees, books, supplies and equipment required to pursue the study for which the scholarship is granted.

Scholarships shall be for a minimum of \$2,500 per year of eligibility, except that one "Floyd D. Gottwald Scholar" will be selected for a minimum \$5,000 scholarship per year of eligibility. Scholarships may be granted to a recipient for a total of four years based on continuing eligibility as determined by the Scholarship Selection Committee. A limited number of scholarships will be awarded each year.

Applications

Eligible high school students must submit their applications by February 15. Each student must complete the application form and provide the documents and information requested, including high school transcript, SAT and/or ACT scores, and essay. See application form for details.

Applicants will be asked to designate on their application form whether they wish to be considered based on their financial need. Fifty percent of the scholarships awarded (including the "Floyd D. Gottwald Scholar") will go to those students with high academic criteria who also who request consideration and demonstrate

financial need; the other fifty percent of the scholarships awarded will go to students with a greater emphasis on their academic criteria.

Administration

Determination of eligibility will be decided by an Albemarle Foundation Scholarship Selection Committee, which is composed of college/university level administrators, a secondary school level educator, and leaders from the community in which Albemarle operates. No current or past employee of Albemarle may serve on the Selection Committee. All questions regarding scholarship eligibility and administration will vest with the Scholarship Selection Committee.

Continuing Requirements

Scholarship recipients will be asked for current transcripts and school standing at the end of each semester. Scholars will be subject to forfeiture for future grants in the event that:

- Any amount of the scholarship program is used for purposes other than tuition, fees, books or expenses related to the academic program.
- The student fails to maintain a 3.0 GPA (on a possible 4.0 basis).
- The student does not maintain full time status.
- The student pursues a degree outside of business, engineering, math or science.
- The student does not maintain good-standing status at the college or university where enrolled by virtue of poor grades or rule infractions.
- The student is expelled, asked to leave the university, or voluntarily abandons his or her studies.
- Eligibility may be re-established if good standing status can be reestablished within one year, upon written notification and documentation to the panel.
