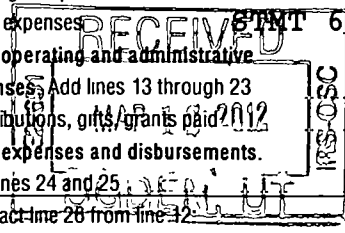

Dear Student:

Please be advised of the following requirements:

1. The student must send a copy of the tuition bill in advance of the due date and must include the school's business or bursar's office address. The student must review the statement and make sure the Foundation's grant portion has been applied for that period. If a student seeks an advance from the grant funds, he (she) must first make a written request to the Foundation that will in return send instructions to the School. The student must also notify the Foundation of any reimbursement received from the School.
2. The student is required to maintain passing grades each and every semester, and send a copy of the student's grading form, front and back, for each and every semester, so that all codes, symbols, or explanations can be reviewed. Failure to submit each of the student's completed grades can lead to the termination of the student's grant. **THE FOUNDATIONS' PASSING GRADE BASIS IS A MINIMUM OF 2.50 GPA OR EQUIVALENT.**
3. The student shall advise the Foundation whether the student is commuting to, or boarding at the school, or living off campus. The student shall send the residence address and phone number, and any changes thereof, when boarding away from home.
4. The student shall write to the Foundation at least once each semester about the student's progress and experiences in school, the major category of their studies, or about the possibilities of a change in program, or degree the student intends to qualify for.
5. The student, or student's family, must notify the Foundation of any interruption of the student's studies due to poor health, accident, financial difficulties, or the student's voluntary termination of the student's educational program for any other reason.
6. The student, or the student's parents, or guardian, are responsible for the payment of any remaining balance due on the student's educational charges once the school has credited to the student's account, the Foundation's grants and any other financial aid received by the school or the student. If the student is married, then, in that event, the student and spouse are responsible for the payment of any outstanding balance due for educational charges as stipulated above. Failure to pay any remaining balance for educational charges due the school, in a timely manner, will terminate this Foundation's grant.

GENERAL FOUNDATION PURPOSE

The John P. Peterson Foundation is a privately funded Foundation. The Foundation was created for the benefit of those persons desiring to further their education by attending a college, university, or an accredited trade or professional school of their choice, in order to advance their education, and who are in need of assistance because of financial difficulties or because of a mental or physical disability and are primarily residents of the state of NEW JERSEY. Applicants who are accepted by the Foundation and have completed our Baccalaureate program may reapply for postgraduate aid by proper notice to the Foundation and subject to the formal acceptance of the post graduate application by the Foundation's board of Trustees.

The John P. Peterson Foundation is administered by a Board of seven trustees. All grants are awarded and renewed on a Semester Basis for education expenses, which may include tuition, books, special instructional fees or services, and room and board.

The applicant must maintain passing grades of all minimum 2.5 G.P.A. or equivalent each semester. Applicant must submit a copy of the grades for each semester to the Foundation's office. Failure to do so will terminate the grant. Applicant or applicant's family must pay in a timely manner the balance due the school each semester, after allowing credit for the Foundation's semester grant. Failure to do so will terminate the grant.

All Foundation grant payments are made directly to the school the applicant is attending. The applicant or applicant's family will receive a copy of each of the Foundation's payment letters. The Foundation requires the applicant to forward to the Foundation, immediately upon receipt, copy of every tuition bill received from the school. With this arrangement, the Foundation will be able to pay the grant directly to the school provided the applicant is qualified, as provided for above. Failure to do so will terminate the grant.

The amount of the initial semester grant award will be based on the Board of Trustees review of the information provided by the applicant and applicant's family. As a guide, the total income of the parents must be stated along with an itemized list of any other financial aid, grants or scholarships (not loans offered to the applicant by the schools selected). The number of children in the family and their ages

will be used to determine the amount of the grant. The number of children in the family and their ages educational expenses by semester of the three first choices the applicant will be considered. Generally, the applicant can submit a copy of the financial aid form filed with the schools to provide the information requested here.
