One of the primary ways in which Virtua fulfills its exempt purpose is through the provision of healthcare to those in need. Being located in New Jersey, Virtua complies with the provisions of the State's charity care program. Under this program, assistance is limited to individuals with incomes up to 300% of the Federal poverty guidelines. Virtua has supplemented the State's program with the creation of its own charity assistance program, which extends assistance to individuals with incomes up to 500% of Federal poverty guidelines. This has resulted in assistance being available to more of those in need throughout the community, with over 28.89% of total 2011 assistance being provided under the provisions of Virtua's program.

4b (Code) (Expenses \$) including grants of \$) (Revenue \$)

Virtua provides care to many individuals that receive assistance with the costs of their healthcare under a medical assistance program. The largest such program is Medicaid, which is jointly funded by the Federal and State of New Jersey governments and is administered by the State. The program's reimbursement does not adequately cover the cost of the care provided. By absorbing the cost of care that is not reimbursed, Virtua is relieving the government of this burden. Services are provided on both an inpatient and outpatient basis, including in the emergency departments and in clinics.

Virtua provides a wide range of outpatient services through its Camden facility, including comprehensive primary care and specialty services for infants, children, teens and adults. Additionally, Virtua subsidizes women's clinics for gynecological and obstetrical care, as well as behavioral health and emergency trauma services. More than 700 patients were provided with emergency helicopter transportation during 2011 through the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program. The costs associated with maintaining these services are in excess of reimbursements to Virtua.
