#### CONDENSED STATEMENT OF THE THOMAN **FOUNDATION GUIDELINES**

Adopted by the Board of Trustees of the W.B. and Candace Thoman Foundation, December 10, 1968

\* \* \*

Foundation money should be used for the education and benefit of the young. "FIRST:

Any deviation from this rule must be justified by exceptional circumstances.

SECOND: The young people must be orphans or from very poor families. . .

The young people helped must, in the opinion of the trustees, have potential and THIRD:

ambition. They must have not only the ability to progress, but also an intense

desire to better themselves. . .

FOURTH: These young people should be helped as far and so long as they are willing and

> have ability. This means that the foundation aid will not necessarily be cut off upon the completion of grammar or high school education. Those who, in the trustees' opinion, have the ability and willingness, can go on to college and even

graduate school with the assistance of the foundation. . .

FIFTH: There shall be no limitation as to race, nationality, color, country of origin or

creed. . .

SIXTH: Care must be taken in the selection of the ones helped and the foundation must

insure that it continues to supervise those receiving aid. . .

SEVENTH: Local charities may be considered as objects of aid . . . aid to these charities

should be considered secondary, however, as the primary purpose of the

foundation will be to provide assistance for poor children with ability. . .

EIGHT: No relative of any trustee or any employee of the foundation will ever be helped."

Thus the statement below does not include each year of the foundation's start-up and full-payment periods as required by Reg. 53 4942(a)-3(b)(7)(ii)(d) & (e). However, the foundation's assets prior to 1979 are believed to have been less than \$50,000 and the foundation has consistently distributed amounts in excess of its required annual Sec. 4942(d) distributable amount. In fact, for the period 1983 -1997, \$688,264 of the foundation's distributions expired unused against the Sec. 4942(d) minimum distribution amount.
