THE TAX YEARS ENDED 2008, 2009 AND 2010 MAY STILL BE SELECTED FOR AUDIT FOR BOTH FEDERAL AND STATE PURPOSES BASED ON INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS. THE ADOPTION OF ASC 740-10 DID NOT HAVE ANY IMPACT ON THE ORGANIZATION'S FINANCIAL STATEMENTS.
