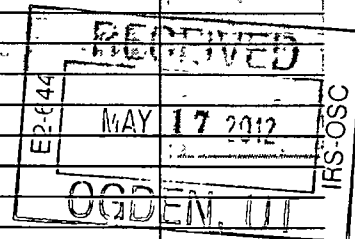

In addition, the Foundation makes grants, in memory of Rebecca Lee Spitz, to New Hampshire municipal libraries and non-profit organizations with similar or related functions, for limited projects to enhance their services to their clientele. In general, the Foundation will not participate in funding drives, or in supporting general operating requirements, its interest lie in providing all or some of the seed-money necessary, on a one-time basis, to get projects or activities started, without additional funding commitments being required. The Foundation's geographic interests are restricted generally to the States of New Hampshire and Massachusetts, with emphasis on the North Country of New Hampshire.
