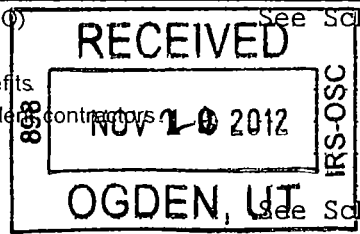

are orphans or from extreme need. Being fed means they can concentrate better and
benefit from the education that they are receiving. We started with scholarship
assistance and hope to increase that dramatically in 2011. The foundation of new
classrooms were laid.



Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 - Nature of Activities and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Nature of Activities

ECHOES Around the World (the "Organization") is a non-profit corporation formed in July 2005. The purpose of the organization is to provide for the medical and educational needs of children in Uganda. The major sources of funding for the Organization are contributions primarily in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and fundraising events in Pennsylvania.

(b) Basis of Accounting

The Organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the modified cash basis of accounting; consequently, contributions and other revenues are recognized when received rather than when promised or earned, and certain expenses and purchases of assets are recognized when cash is disbursed rather than when the obligation is incurred. This is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles. The financial statements are not intended to be presented in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

(c) Contributions

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence or nature of any donor-imposed restrictions.

Support that is restricted by the donor is reported as an increase in unrestricted net assets if the restriction expires in the reporting period in which the support is recognized. All other donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are classified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

As of December 31, 2011 the Organization does not have temporarily or permanently restricted net assets.

(d) Deferred Revenue

Deferred revenue represents amounts received in advance for the 2012 fundraising event. The amounts are expected to be recognized as revenue in the subsequent year.

(e) Fair Value of Financial Instruments

Unless otherwise indicated, the fair values of all reported assets and liabilities which represent financial instruments approximate the carrying values of such amounts.

(f) Advertising

The Corporation follows the policy of charging the cost of advertising to expense as incurred.

(g) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(h) Concentration of Risk

One donor accounted for more than 10% of support during the year ended December 31, 2011. The total support from the donor in 2011 is \$80,000.

(i) Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through November 9, 2012, the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Note 2 - Internal Revenue Code Status

The Corporation is a charitable organization with an exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and has been classified as an organization that is not a private foundation as defined in Section 509(a)(1) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles require entities to evaluate measure, recognize, and disclose any uncertain tax positions taken on their income tax returns. Management has evaluated the impact of this standard on its financial statements and believes that there are no uncertain tax positions and the effects of this standard did not impact the Organization's financial position, statement of activities or changes in net assets.

The Organization recognizes accrued interest and penalties associated with uncertain tax positions, if any, as part of the income tax provision. The Organization does not have tax related interest and penalties for the years ended December 31, 2011.

The tax returns of the Corporation for the years ended December 31, 2008, 2009, and 2010 are subject to examination by the Internal Revenue Service and other various taxing authorities, generally for three years after the date the Corporation files the returns

Note 3 - Donated Materials and Services

Contributions of donated non-cash assets are recorded at their fair values in the period received. The Organization does not value contributions of donated services that creates or enhances non-financial assets or that requires specialized skills, is provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by donation. The fair values of the non-cash materials and services are not recorded and the effect on the financial statements is not determined.

Note 4 - Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of functional expenses. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

Note 5 - Results of Special Events

The following presents the results of the Organization's fundraising projects and events. The Organization held one event in November 2010 from which it received some contributions and paid expenses in 2011.
