Part IX-A summary of direct charitable activities:

1 The Foundation was organized on August 26, 2010 and was incorporated as a Virginia non-stock not-for-profit corporation on August 30, 2010. The Foundation is a 501(c)(3) tax exempt grant-making non-operating private foundation devoted to charitable, scientific, literary and educational purposes, particularly the care of and prevention of cruelty to animals, the support of the arts, and the support of childhood education through the encouragement, recognition and reward, by means of scholarships, fellowships, prizes and/or awards, of outstanding or exceptional academic achievement, primarily by elementary, middle and secondary school students and teachers, particularly in the areas of physics, chemistry, mathematics, the performing and fine arts, reading, language and literature.

During fiscal 2012, the Board of Directors approved the award of seven grants payable to six organizations. Two grants totaling \$200 went to the Virginia Symphony Orchestra, to help fund its general operations providing live classical music performances on the Virginia Peninsula and honoring the 20th anniversary of its Music Director and Principal Conductor. Grants of \$100 each went to WHRO Public Television, the Virginia Museum of Fine Art and the Muscarelle Museum of Art to help fund their general operations providing and exhibiting educational television and fine arts to the Virginia Peninsula area.

By far the most significant grants were those awarded to the educational organization, An Achievable Dream, Inc (\$900), and the non-profit that operates the animal welfare program, The Peninsula Pet Pantry (\$500)

An Achievable Dream operates two public schools in an economically depressed area of Newport News, VA. Its mission is to provide the facilities, support, programs and special attention necessary to foster improved educational opportunities for disadvantaged children of the area. The Foundation's grant provided money to fund "The Nora & Neil Monahan Reading Achievement Awards," a series of 13 \$25 awards to 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students who demonstrated the greatest improvement in their basic reading skills during the 2010-2011 school year; "The Anna & Nelson Becci Awards for Outstanding Academic Achievement," a series of 6 \$75 awards to 11th & 12th grade students who demonstrated the most outstanding or exceptional success and achievement in the study of mathematics, physics, and chemistry during the school year; and "The Channing & Coca Barron Award for Outstanding Teaching," a \$125 award to the elementary school teacher who best demonstrated, during the school year, outstanding or exceptional success and achievement in inspiring children to study hard, to cultivate an interest in learning, and to achieve their best performance.

The Peninsula Pet Pantry provides pet food and supplies to needy recipients in the lower Virginia Peninsula and Middle Peninsula areas who could not otherwise afford to provide proper food and care to their pet animals. It collects donated pet food and supplies from public donation drop-off sites located throughout the area. The Foundation's grant provided money to establish "The Spot, Rover & Spike Becci Memorial Fund," a pool of money that the Pantry uses to assist needy pet owners and caregivers to pay the costs of emergency veterinary services and/or prescription medications, especially for dogs.

Financial support for organizations such as An Achievable Dream and the Peninsula Pet Pantry exemplifies the very essence of the Foundation's core mission. The Board of Directors has already announced that it will increase the amount of its support for the academic achievement and teaching awards in 2012 and the Foundation already has awarded an additional grant to the Pet Pantry in early 2012.

Part X line 4 cash held for charitable activities

Since the Foundation just began operations at the end of 2010, its assets consist primarily of small amounts of cash and investments. It is the current intention of the Board of Directors to award grants during 2012 that will approximate the total value of those

awarded in 2011, ie , approximately \$2000. In addition, the Treasurer is of the opinion that at least another \$1000 of the Foundation's cash balance may be needed during 2012 for administrative and operating expenses. Therefore, the sum of \$3000 has been deemed "held for charitable activities" in Part X line 4 even though this amount exceeds the 1½% general rule
