



4a.) Managing a statewide giving program

In 2011, Advocates for Kids awarded \$183,348 primarily in support of programs that serve special needs children and adults. Programs and services for children who are deaf or hard of hearing received 55% of all funds awarded. Over 72 different organizations received financial support from Advocates for Kids in 2011. Representing the largest single recipient of support, Deaf Services Center in Columbus, Ohio received \$20,000. Deaf Initiatives, also of Columbus, and Willow Ridge Therapeutic Riding in Plain City, Ohio benefited from the second largest awards of \$10,000 each. The remainder of the grants ranged from \$50 to \$8,000. The vast majority of grants awarded were under \$5,000 and given to organizations with annual revenues under \$5,000,000. In 2010, Advocates for Kids provided grants totaling \$155,689. Advocates for Kids total giving reached a milestone of over one million dollars in 2009.

4b.) Establishing initiatives to promote services for children with special needs: Creating summer programming and communication opportunities for children who are deaf and hard of hearing throughout Ohio.

Many parents and educators acknowledge that children's academic skills may regress during the summer months. However, in the absence of quality and quantity of support services received during the school year, children with special needs are at much greater risk of significant regression academically, socially and emotionally. For example, throughout the school year, development of communication skills is an ongoing priority for children who are deaf. They spend most of the school day with teachers and staff who are trained to communicate using a variety of communication modes. Additionally, the children have an opportunity to communicate with other friends and fellow students who are deaf. As a result of this communication rich environment, children who are deaf or hard of hearing generally thrive. However, during the summer months, this communication rich environment is not available. Furthermore, many of these children are in situations where communication is extremely limited and, in some extreme instances, almost non-existent. This lack of communication during summer months can have a dramatic, negative impact. Consequently, Advocates for Kids created an initiative to create summer programming for children who are deaf and hard of hearing. As a direct result of the initiative, summer camps and other therapeutic activities specifically designed to promote socialization and communication for children who are deaf and hard of hearing, have been developed throughout the state. Prior to these grants, the Columbus Deaf Services Center was the only Community Center for the Deaf in Ohio to regularly provide summer programming for children who are deaf and hard of hearing. In 2004, initial grants of \$5,000 were awarded to six organizations in Ohio. In 2005, seven organizations received \$7,500 summer programming grants. In 2006, 2007 and 2008, eight centers received summer programming grants of \$7,500 each. In 2009 Advocates for Kids provided nine grants of \$7,500 for summer programming and activities for children who are deaf or hard of hearing. In 2010 and 2011, grants of \$8,000 were awarded to nine Centers of the Deaf throughout Ohio. To date, Advocates for Kids has awarded grants to centers of and for the Deaf in the following Ohio cities: Akron, Canton, Cleveland, Cincinnati, Columbus, Dayton, Mansfield, Portsmouth, Toledo and Youngstown. As a result of this initiative, over 300 children who are deaf and hard of hearing annually participate in summer youth programming.

4c.) Supporting other charitable organizations in the development of their service programs: Consulting with other charitable organizations in fundraising and charitable giving programs

Advocates for Kids envisions children with special needs enjoying a higher quality of life as a result of an effective service delivery system that permeates all segments of our diverse communities. The Advocates for Kids vision is the motivation behind our capacity building efforts throughout Ohio. As advocates, we attempt to increase services for children throughout Ohio not only by providing financial support, but also by providing technical support and capacity building assistance geared at strengthening their ability to provide services to children and their families. Upon request, and with no charge for our capacity building services, we assist child caring organizations in the development of service programs, fundraising capabilities, and management activities. In 2011 we worked with organizations such as Deaf Services Center, Respite Connections Inc. and Willow Ridge Therapeutic Riding Program. In addition to supporting these programs, in 2011 Advocates for Kids assisted 16 veteran and fraternal organizations throughout Ohio in their fundraising and charitable giving programs.

4d.) Creating and managing an endowment to assure the continuation of Advocates for Kids mission

In order to support our mission for years to come, Advocates for Kids strives to build a strong financial base. In 1999 the organization had no endowment and held only \$7,369 in total assets. By the end of 2005, corporate assets reached \$1,650,368 and by 2006 year-end assets climbed to \$2,254,290. In 2007 Advocates for Kids assets equaled \$2,671,458 and due to the economic slowdown and poor investment returns in 2008, total corporate assets were down slightly to \$2,406,181. In 2009, 2010 and 2011 our total assets reached \$3,197,776; \$3,556,373 and \$3,638,598 respectively. Funds not used in fund raising or the operations of the corporation are considered part of the Board established endowment fund. All endowment fund expenditures require prior Board approval.
