The organization shall be known as the Air, Space, and Missile Defense Association (ASMDA).

II. ASSOCIATION OBJECTIVES

The Air, Space, and Missile Defense Association is a non-profit organization operated under the auspices of an elected Board of Directors (BOD). Revenue is derived from corporate and individual membership dues and by conducting seminars, workshops, and symposia. Funds are also raised by private donations. Association objectives are:

A. To foster communications and relationships between the U.S. Army Space and Missile Defense Command (USASMDC); the Missile Defense Agency (Huntsville); the Missile and Space Intelligence Center (MSIC); NASA Marshall Space Flight Center (MSFC); U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Life Cycle Management Command (AMCOM); U. S. Army Aviation and Missile Research Development and Engineering Center (AMRDEC); the Program Executive Office, Missiles and Space (PEO-MS); other local Government organizations; and local industries.

B. To provide an industry forum that can be utilized for organizing and promoting areas of common interest.

C. To provide an effective single point of broad industry and Government contact.

D. To provide an organization that can benefit the missile defense industry professionally and foster community and civic interests and goals.

III. ASSOCIATION STRUCTURE

The association shall consist of a Board of Directors (BOD), Association Officers, Board of Trustees (BOT), Affiliate Chapters, and General Membership (corporate and individual members).

A. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

1. BOD Function: The function of the BOD will be to direct, prioritize, coordinate and approve all association goals, business objectives, and other activities.

2. Board Composition: The Board of Directors (BOD) shall consist of twenty-one voting members. The membership shall be made up of at least seven members who are active employees of USASMDC, MDA (HSV), MSIC, NASA MSFC, AMCOM, AMRDEC, and PEO-MS, either active duty military or civilian; three former or retired employees who currently actively support the space and missile defense community; and six from industry. Board membership shall be limited to no more than one individual from the same corporation.

3. Terms of Service:

Membership on the Board will be alternated by years to ensure new ideas and allow the BOD to continually consider new initiatives and to ensure that at least 30 percent of the board membership is renewed annually.

Prior to the ASMDA Annual Membership Meeting, the ASMDA Nomination Committee will recommend a slate of new and returning board members. This committee will nominate new members in accordance with paragraph III.A.1 above.

Existing BOD members will also be reviewed and contacted to determine their desire to continue to serve on the BOD. Attendance at BOD meetings by BOD Members is expected at least 9 of the 12 monthly BOD Meetings during a calendar year. Attendance can be by telecon by notifying the ASMDA Secretary prior to the meeting.

If a member of the Board resigns or terminates membership on the BOD, the BOD shall select a new board member from the membership at large to serve out the existing term of the departing BOD member.

As a standard practice, a member of the ASMDA BOD cannot succeed himself as a member of the BOD without at least a one-year break as a member of the BOD. This is to ensure "new blood" on the BOD. However, the BOD has the authority to approve succession if necessary and justified by a majority vote of the BOD members.

A recommended slate of offices will be presented by the Nominating Committee to the current ASMDA President and BOD Members for permission to obtain slate approval by the general membership..

4. Other Board Members: The Secretary and the Treasurer shall be Ex-Officio members of the Board. Other members may be elected to the BOD as Ex-Officio members because of the contribution they may provide in experience or expertise in some area associated with ASMDA. Ex-Officio members may be from the same company as a voting member of the BOD. The term of service for Ex-Officio members is at the discretion of the BOD. Ex-Officio positions are reconfirmed each year at the Annual Membership meeting.

B. ASSOCIATION OFFICERS

Officers of the association shall be selected from the board membership and will serve in a dual capacity as board members and as Officers for the same term. Officers shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Duties of the Officers include:

1. President: Chairs the meetings of the BOD and of the membership. Coordinates and approves programs and arrangements for meetings and activities. Represents the association at outside functions and other organization activities.

2. Vice President: Performs the duties of the President in the absence of the President. Performs special assignments at the request of the President or the BOD.

3. Secretary (Ex-Officio Member): Records and maintains minutes of all meetings. Maintains association charter, bylaws, and other official records. Maintains an up-to-date list of all corporate and individual members.

4. Treasurer (Ex-Officio Member): Prepares and maintains annual budget. In the capacity of custodian of all association funds, performs all financial record keeping tasks such as receipt and deposit of dues, payment for luncheons, guest speaker fees, and other association bills. Maintains financial records such that they can be audited at any time. Prepares and submits financial records at association meetings.

C. BOARD OF TRUSTEES (BOT)

The function of the BOT will be to oversee the development, execution, and investment activities of the ASMDA Endowment Fund. The BOT will report directly to the ASMDA BOD.

The BOT shall consist of three members. Members of the BOT will be Ex-Officio members of the ASMDA BOD. Annually, the President of the Association will nominate the BOT members for approval by the BOD.

BOT membership will be alternated each year to ensure new ideas and allow the BOT to continually consider new initiatives.

If a member of the BOT resigns or terminates membership, the ASMDA President shall select a new BOT member with the approval of the BOD to complete the term of the departing BOT member.

D. AFFILIATE CHAPTERS

The establishment of new affiliate chapters will be formed as subordinate chapters of the parent ASMDA to eliminate potential complications associated with the new chapters obtaining tax exemption status. The day-to-day activities of the new chapters will be run by a set of Officers elected by the local affiliate chapter membership with each affiliate chapter's President also serving on the parent ASMDA BOD.

E. GENERAL MEMBERSHIP

All current and retired employees of the Federal Government are eligible for association membership. All members of the business community who support USASMDC, MDA (HSV), MSIC, NASA MSFC, AMCOM, AMRDEC, and PEO-MS are eligible for association membership. Both individual and corporate memberships will be accepted. For voting purposes, each individual membership carries the authority of one vote and each corporate membership (because it includes one individual membership) carries the authority of one vote.

Membership or participation in the association creates no conflict of interest by military personnel, Government employees, or private industry.

IV. DUES/ DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS

An annual budget shall be developed by the BOD, approved by the general membership, and used for luncheon expenses, special events, guest speakers, and any administrative cost (e.g., stationery, postage) incurred in the conduct of normal association business. The annual budget should also include special awards, scholarships, and any other large expenses expected to occur in the upcoming year. The Association Officers shall be empowered to disburse such funds as are reasonable and necessary to further the goals and objectives of the association. To this end, they will have the authority to levy reasonable and moderate dues assessments to cover any unusual or special expenses and/or debts.

A. MEMBERSHIP DUES

Membership dues may be adjusted (increased or decreased) for both individuals and corporations by the BOD as appropriate without a Charter Amendment. Membership dues for both individuals and corporations will be collected annually by calendar year.

Effective for calendar year 2010, membership dues shall be as follows:

1. Individual membership dues for members of the business community who support USASMDC, MDA (HSV), MSIC, NASA MSFC, and PEO-MS shall be \$10.00 annually. There is no limit on the number of individual members from a single corporation.
2. Corporate membership dues shall be \$150.00 annually. However, for voting purposes, these corporate memberships only carry the authority of one vote (i.e. the individual registered for the one membership that comes with corporate membership).
3. There are no individual membership dues for current and retired employees of the Federal Government. However, to obtain membership, current and retired employees of the Federal Government must fill out and submit an ASMDA membership application. For voting purposes, these memberships carry the authority of one vote.

B. EXPENSES FOR ESTABLISHING AFFILIATE CHAPTERS

The ASMDA will provide advance funding to affiliate chapters to cover initial major expenses incurred when responsibility for the execution of an ASMDA Conference or major fundraiser is given to the affiliate chapter. The amount of funding will be established and approved by the BOD for each event.

V. MEETINGS

A. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The BOD shall hold regularly scheduled and special meetings as necessary to properly conduct the affairs of the association. Meetings will be called by the President and must be attended by a majority of the voting board members to conduct association business. All regularly scheduled and special meetings will be announced to the entire BOD membership including Ex-officio members and the BOT.

On occasion, when ASMDA business needs to be conducted between meetings, the President may authorize the conduct of a "special meeting" to be held virtually (i.e., via email.) Email approval of at least eight board members is still required to conduct association business.

B. ANNUAL BUSINESS MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

The association shall hold an annual business meeting at the beginning of the calendar year to elect a new BOD and to conduct any other new business.

VI. AREAS OF SUPPORT

Areas of association support may be suggested by any member, individual, or corporation at any association business meeting and then voted on by the general membership. The BOD is empowered to select committees to refine the type and level of support, to administer the effort, and report progress. Specific guidelines will vary (e.g., source of revenue for effort, duration, level of participation, etc.). No committee, however, is empowered to expend association funds without prior approval. While there is no limitation on the areas of support, it is anticipated that they will generally fall into three categories:

A. Technical- Efforts which will further the consolidation of the Huntsville areas as the Center of Excellence for space and missile defense.

B. Professional- Participation in both Government and industry organized and sanctioned events that demonstrate the state of the industry.

C. Civic- Sponsorship of groups or individuals for causes/reasons determined to be in the best interests of the association.

VII. MISCELLANEOUS

A. The association shall be a non-profit and non-political organization and shall not participate in any political fund-raising, politically oriented, or political candidate endorsement activities.

B. Any member may propose revisions to the bylaws (i.e. this Charter). The BOD shall review all suggestions and, if approved, will bring the proposed revision to the general membership for vote. If passed by a majority of those present and voting, the revision will be incorporated within 30 days.

C. In the event of dissolution of the association, all remaining assets shall be donated to a local charity at the discretion of the BOD.

VIII. PURPOSE AND NON-PROFIT STATUS OF ASMDA

A. The Air, Space, and Missile Defense Association is organized exclusively for educational and scientific purposes, as well as the distribution of funds to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

B. No part of the net earnings of the organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation; and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

C. Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

IX. CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY

A. Conflict of Interest Policy Purpose: The purpose of the conflict of interest policy is to protect ASMDA's tax-exempt organizational status when it is contemplating entering into a transaction or arrangement which might benefit the private interest of an Association Officer, member of the Board of Directors, member of the Board of Trustees, or Ex-Officio member of the Board of Directors, resulting in a possible excess benefit transaction.

B. Interested Person: An Interested Person is defined as any Association Officer, member of the Board of Directors, member of the Board of Trustees, or Ex-Officio member of the Board of Directors, who has a direct or indirect financial interest.

C. Financial Interest: A Financial Interest is when a person has, directly or indirectly, through business, investment, or family: a) An ownership or investment interest in any entity with which ASMDA has a transaction or arrangement; b) A compensation arrangement with ASMDA or with any entity or individual with which ASMDA has a transaction or arrangement; or c) A potential ownership or investment interest in, or compensation arrangement with, any entity or individual with which ASMDA is negotiating a transaction or arrangement. Compensation includes direct and indirect remuneration as well as gifts or favors that are not insubstantial.

D. Duty to Disclose: In connection with any actual or possible conflict of interest, an interested person must disclose the existence of the financial interest and be given the opportunity to disclose all material facts to any ASMDA Committee Chairs, Officers, or Board of Directors. This disclosure can be made at any time by contacting the committee chair, any Association Officer, or making an announcement during a Board of Directors meeting.

E. Determining Whether a Conflict of Interest Exists: After disclosure of the financial interest and all material facts, and after any discussion with the interested person, the interested person shall leave the Board of Directors or committee meeting while the determination of a conflict of interest is discussed and voted upon. The remaining board or committee members shall decide if a conflict of interest exists by simple majority vote. These results will be reflected in the BOD minutes for the meeting.

F. Procedures for Addressing the Conflict of Interest: a) An interested person may make a presentation at the Board of Directors or committee meeting; but after the presentation, he/she shall leave the meeting during the discussion of, and the vote on, the transaction or arrangement involving the possible conflict of interest; b) An association officer shall, if appropriate, appoint a disinterested person or committee to investigate alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement; c) After exercising due diligence, the Board of Directors or committee shall determine whether ASMDA can obtain with reasonable efforts a more advantageous transaction or arrangement from a person or

entity that would not give rise to a conflict of interest; d) If a more advantageous transaction or arrangement is not reasonably possible under circumstances not producing a conflict of interest, the Board of Directors or committee shall determine by a majority vote of the disinterested directors whether the transaction or arrangement is in ASMDA's best interest, for its own benefit, and whether it is fair and reasonable. In conformity with the above determination, it shall make its decision as to whether to enter into the transaction or arrangement. The results of this decision shall be reflected in the BOD minutes for the meeting

G. Violations of the Conflicts of Interest Policy: a) If the Board of Directors or committee has reasonable cause to believe a member has failed to disclose any actual or possible conflict of interest, it shall inform the member of the basis for such belief and afford the member an opportunity to explain the alleged failure to disclose; and b) If, after hearing the member's response and after making further investigation as warranted by the circumstances, the Board of Directors or committee determines the member has failed to disclose an actual or possible conflict of interest, it shall take appropriate disciplinary and corrective action.

H. Records of Proceedings: The minutes of the Board of Directors and all committees with board delegated powers shall contain: a) The names of the persons who disclosed or otherwise were found to have a financial interest in connection with an actual or possible conflict of interest, the nature of the financial interest, any action taken to determine whether a conflict of interest was present, and the Board of Directors' or committee's decision as to whether a conflict of interest in fact existed; and b) The names of the persons who were present for discussions and the votes relating to the transaction or arrangement, the content of the discussion, including any alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement, and a record of any votes taken in connection with the proceedings.

I. Annual Statements: Each Association Officer and member of the Board of Directors shall annually sign a statement which affirms such person: a) Has received a copy of the conflicts of interest policy; b) Has read and understands the policy; c) Has agreed to comply with the policy; and d) Understands ASMDA is charitable and in order to maintain its federal tax exemption it must engage primarily in activities which accomplish one or more of its tax-exempt purposes. Individuals refusing to sign the Annual Statement will be asked to step down from their position in the Association.

J. Signing of Annual statements: Annual statements will be routinely signed in conjunction with the annual year-end business meeting and the election of a new Board of Directors.

K. Review of Annual statements: Annual statements will be reviewed by an Association Officer and maintained on file for a period of at least three years from the date of signature.

L. Periodic Reviews In addition to the Annual Statement: To ensure ASMDA operates in a manner consistent with charitable purposes and does not engage in activities that could jeopardize its tax-exempt status, periodic reviews shall be conducted. These reviews may be requested at any time by any Association Officer or member of the Board of Directors.

X. WHISTLEBLOWER POLICY

A. Whistleblower Policy Purpose: The public expects ASMDA to abide by ethical standards that promote the public good." ASMDA views its tax-exempt status as a privilege that requires serious protection. From federal tax and tax-exemption points of view, the whistleblower rules are extremely relevant for ASMDA. ASMDA is encouraged by the IRS to adopt an effective policy for handling complaints and to establish procedures to report in confidence any suspected financial impropriety or misuse of ASMDA's resources. Therefore, ASMDA must have clear policies and procedures that allow staff, volunteers, or clients of the organization to report suspected wrongdoing within the organization without fear of retribution.

B. Whistleblower Policy intent: ASMDA's intent of this policy is to create avenues for communication with the Association Officers and members of the Board of Directors to expose those allegedly involved in improper or unethical behavior.

C. Whistleblower: A Whistleblower, in the ASMDA tax-exempt organization context, is anyone who "blows the whistle" on a corrupt promoter of schemes designed to divert or distort the use or reporting of the charitable use of Association receipts or resources.

D. Nature of Violations included on IRS Form 13909: Tax-Exempt Organization Complaint (Referral) Form includes:

- Directors/Officers/persons are using income/assets for personal gain
- Organization is engaged in commercial, for-profit business activities Income/assets are being used to support illegal or terrorist activities
- Organization is involved in a political campaign
- Organization is engaged in excessive lobbying activities
- Organization refused to disclose or provide a copy of Form 990
- Organization failed to report employment, income, or excise tax liability properly
- Organization failed to file required federal tax returns and forms
- Organization engaged in deceptive or improper fundraising practices

E. Who Can Submit a Complaint: Any member of the public, all individual and corporate association members, and all Association Officers and Board concerned with behavior within ASMDA, can report in confidence any suspected financial impropriety or misuse of ASMDA's resources by bringing the information forward directly to the attention of an association officer or member of the Board or Directors.

F. How to Submit a Complaint: Any report of suspected financial impropriety or misuse of ASMDA's resources should be submitted in writing to any association officer or member of the Board of Directors by letter in person or by mailing to the ASMDA post office box (ASMDA, POB 11001, Huntsville, AL, 35816). Any report of suspected financial impropriety or misuse of ASMDA's resources may also be emailed to any Association Officer or member of the Board of Directors.

G. Determining Financial Impropriety or Misuse of ASMDA's Resources: After receiving a report of suspected financial impropriety or misuse of ASMDA's resources, the recipient will immediately notify the Association Officers and present the matter at the next Board of Director meeting. The report will be reviewed, and a determination will be made as to whether to conduct an investigation.

H. Violations of Propriety and Use of ASMDA's Resources: a) Following the conduct of the investigation, the results will be reported back to the Board of Directors with recommendations for corrective action, if warranted; and b) If the Board of Directors has reasonable cause to believe a financial impropriety or misuse of ASMDA's resources exists, it shall review the recommendations for corrective action and shall determine what actions are required to correct the violation.

I. Records of Proceedings: The minutes of the Board of Directors shall contain a summary of the financial impropriety or misuse of ASMDA's resources and the corrective actions directed by the Board of Directors.

J. Required Response: The Secretary shall prepare a written response to the individual who originally submitted the suspected financial impropriety or misuse of ASMDA's resources. The letter will be signed by an Association Officer.

K. Document Retention: A copy of the response letter, the original complaint, and any important documents related to this matter will be maintained on file for a period of at least three years from the date when the matter was closed.

XI. DOCUMENT RETENTION AND DESTRUCTION POLICY

A. ASMDA will permanently retain all records pertaining to application for recognition of tax-exempt status, the determination letter for recognizing tax-exempt status, and organization documents such as article of incorporation and by-laws with amendments (i.e.; the ASMDA Charter), as well as board minutes.

B. ASMDA will retain all books, records, receipts, and other documentation that show ASMDA complies with current Federal tax rules in order to document the sources of receipts reported on the ASMDA annual tax return (i.e., Form 990). Records must support income, expenses, and credits reported on ASMDA annual tax return (i.e., Form 990 series and other tax returns.)

C. ASMDA will retain records for federal tax purposes for as long as they may be needed to document evidence of compliance with provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. As a rule, ASMDA will maintain these record until the statute of limitations runs out or three years after the date the return is due or filed, whichever is later.

D. ASMDA reserves the right to retain documents in any appropriate medium (such as hard copy or electronically) without notification to the general membership or public.

E. When the statute of limitations has expired or when the documents are no longer required, the appropriate ASMDA officer has the right to destroy ASMDA records without notification to the general membership or public. Documents will be shredded, burned, or electronically destroyed to ensure the privacy and proprietary nature of any information contained in the documents is protected.

XII. PUBLIC INSPECTION OF ASMDA CHARTER AND TAX DOCUMENTS

A. ASMDA will make available for public inspection, upon request and without charge; original and amended annual information returns for a period of three years from the date the return was required to be filed (including any extensions) or was filed, whichever is later. For purposes of inspection, this annual information return includes an exact copy of the return (such as Form 990) and amended return if any and all schedules, attachments, and supporting documents filed with the IRS.

B. ASMDA will make available for public inspection, upon request and without charge, its application for tax-exempt status.

C. ASMDA will make available for public inspection, upon request and without charge, its current Charter.

D. ASMDA reserves the right to have an ASMDA Board Member present during any public inspection of ASMDA documentation/records.

E. Since ASMDA does not maintain a permanent office, public inspection will be performed at a reasonable location of ASMDA's choice.

F. Requests for public inspection of ASMDA documents shall be made in writing and by mailing this written request to the ASMDA post office box.

G. As a minimum, the "Public Inspection of ASMDA Charter and Tax Documents" process will be posted on the public ASMDA website and may be included on routine ASMDA correspondence and event brochures.

H. For public inspection requesting hard copies, ASMDA will provide the requested copy within 30 days from the date it receives the written request at the


ASMDA post office box. Based on the request, ASMDA may charge a reasonable fee for providing copies (not to exceed the per page rate the IRS charges for providing copies.). If most cases, this charge can be avoided if the request is for electronic copies and an email address is included in the written request.


