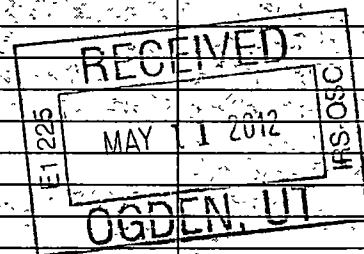

Dr. May L. Flanagan Foundation

Dr. Flanagan was a contemporary woman leader in Lincoln, Nebraska in the early 1900's. She was a physician as well as director of the Dr. Benjamin F. Bailey Hospital and Sanatorium. She successfully lived the life of a modern day woman during a time period where such a life-style was uncommon.

She was born in Orleans, Michigan on October 22, 1866 and died in Lincoln, Nebraska on August 8, 1963 at the age of 97.

Dr. Flanagan came to Lincoln after graduating from Hahneman Medical School, Chicago, Illinois in 1900. The late Dr. Bailey, with whom she began her practice, offered her a partnership when he established Bailey's in 1901.

After Dr. Bailey's death in 1944, Dr. Flanagan bought and managed the 24 acres and the sanatorium. The 115 bed facility was the only private institution in the state with surgical and mental patients.

In 1958, at the dynamic age of 91, she sold the sanatorium to the Benedictine Sisters of Sacred Heart Convent, Yankton, South Dakota to be used as a home for the aged.

A private person, Dr. Flanagan avoided much of the credit for her success in building an outstanding reputation for the hospital and sanatorium. Her personal dedication to the institution as well as her teaching in the nursing school were two factors which helped build the fine reputation of the facility.

A devout Catholic, she attend daily Mass and was known for her charity to the less fortunate.

When Dr. Flanagan died, she specified in her will that money be give to three interests:

1. The community of Lincoln, Nebraska,
2. The Catholic Church,
3. Educational and charitable organizations of the Catholic Church.

Such a career and life-style are admirable. As Directors we are privileged to carry out the directives of Dr. Flanagan's will to the best of our abilities.
