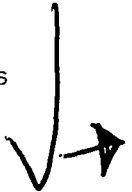

DON E. AND CHARLOTTE J. WILLIAMS CHARITABLE FOUNDATION, INC.  
PURPOSES OF THE FOUNDATION & GRANT PROCEDURES

The Don E. and Charlotte J. Williams charitable foundation, Inc. is being established for various purposes and is to implement and carry out the following:

I. EDUCATION

- A. Provide grants to individuals for travel, study, apprenticeships, trade schools, or other similar purposes. Grants shall have the same definitions as set forth in Section 4945 of the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations §53.4945-4.
- B. All grants are to be awarded on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis.
- C. The grant will constitute a scholarship or fellowship which is excluded from gross income under Section 117(a) and is to be utilized for study as described in Section 151(e) (4).
- D. The purpose of the grant is to achieve a specific objective, produce a report or similar product, or improve or enhance a literary, artistic, musical, scientific, teaching, or other similar capacity, skill, or talent of the grantee.
- E. The Board of Directors shall appoint a selection committee to award all grants. The selection committee shall consist of the following:
  - (1) No more than five nor less than three members shall make up the committee.
  - (2) All members of the selection committee must consist of individuals totally independent and separate from the private foundation, its organizer and the employer concerned.
  - (3) All grants are to be awarded on an objective and non discriminatory basis. No grants or awards are to be given which represent compensation for past, present, or future employment services nor as an employee incentive. Also, no grants are to be given if such studies or research are primarily for the benefit of the grantor, the foundation or the employer.
  - (4) All public announcements of the awards must be made by the selection committee or by the foundation.
  - (5) The number of grants to be awarded may be reduced but may not be increased from the number recommended by the selection committee. Only the committee may vary the amount of grants awarded.
  - (6) The program must impose identifiable minimum requirements



for grant eligibility. If an employee must have been employed for some minimum period by the employer to which the program relates to the eligible to receive a grant or to make that employee's children eligible to receive a grant, the minimum period of employment may not exceed three (3) years. Eligibility must not be related to any other employment related factors, such as the employee's position, services or duties.

- (7) A grant may not be terminated because the recipient or the recipient's parent terminates employment regardless of the reason for such termination.
- (8) The courses of study for which grants are available must not be limited to those that would be of particular benefit to the employer or the foundation.
- (9) The grants are to be awarded to enable the recipients to obtain an education in their individual capacities solely for their personal benefit and must not include any commitments, understandings, conditional or unconditional, suggesting that the studies are undertaken by the recipients for the benefit of the employer or the foundation.
- (10) The program must meet either the 25% or 10% tests regarding number of grants awarded under the program as outlined in Revenue Procedure 76-47.
- (11) Individual Grant Procedures

Pursuant to Section 4945(g) of the Internal Revenue Code and §53.4945-4, the following are the procedures of the Don E. and Charlotte J. Williams Charitable Foundation, Inc. in the awarding of grants to individuals.

(a) The Selection Process - Candidates for Grants

In the case of grants to individuals, selection of grantees is made by the foundation's Selection Committee on the basis of criteria reasonably related to the purposes of the grant including the merits of the proposal and credentials of the potential grantee.

On the basis of criteria relating to the particular grant program involved, an individual grantee may be selected (1) from a group of qualified candidates or (2) without reference to a group of candidates because he or she is exceptionally qualified to carry out the charitable, educational, or scientific purpose of the grant or (3) it is otherwise evident that the selection is particularly calculated to effectuate the exempt purpose of the grant rather than to benefit particular persons. The group of persons who select recipients (see discussion of Selection Committee) are not in a position to derive a private benefit, directly or indirectly, if certain potential grantees are selected over others.

- (i) How solicited: Applicants are solicited

through the distribution of notices to all deWco employees annually and by word of mouth to other potential applicants.

- (ii) How selected: Applicants are required to submit a biographical record, including a report on their academic and professional careers.
- (iii) Screening board: There is a preliminary screening of all candidates by the Selection Committee, who are not employees of the Foundation. Neither employees of the Foundation nor "disqualified persons" are eligible for grants.

(b) Terms and Conditions Under Which the Foundation Makes Individual Grants

The terms and conditions of each grant to an individual are contained in a letter sent to each recipient of such a grant. The recipient is required to communicate acceptance thereof by a letter in writing to the Foundation. Terms and conditions include: specific purpose of the grant, its duration, and the total amount of the grant.

(c) Procedure for Exercising Supervision Over Individual Grants

With respect to individual scholarship or fellowship grants, the Foundation arranges to receive a report of the grantee's courses taken (if any) and grades received (if any) in each academic period. Such a report must be verified by the educational institution attended by the grantee and is obtained at least once a year. Where study at an institution does not involve the taking of courses but the preparation of research papers or projects, the Foundation requires a brief report from the institution on the progress of the paper or project at least once a year. Upon completion institution, a final report is also obtained.

The Foundation may not consider it necessary to obtain the foregoing reports if the following conditions are met: First, the grant is a scholarship or fellowship subject to the provisions of Section 117(a) of the study at an educational institution which normally maintains a regular faculty and curriculum and normally has a regularly organized body of students in attendance at the place where its educational activities are carried on. Second, the Foundation pays the scholarship or fellowship to the educational institution. Third, the educational institution agrees to use the grant funds to defray the recipient's expenses or pay funds to the recipient only if he is enrolled at the educational institution and his standing at such institution is consistent with the purposes and conditions of the grant.

(d) Procedures for review of Grantee Reports, for Investigation Where Diversion of Grant Funds From Their Specified Purposes is Indicated, and for Recovery of Diverted Grant Funds

Review of grantee reports

A professional staff member of the Foundation and the Selection Committee has the responsibility to follow the progress of the individual grant, that is, to review each report submitted by the funded educational institution or person, to make a determination as to whether the grant purposes are being or have been fulfilled, and to look into any questions requiring further scrutiny or investigation.

Investigation where diversion of grant funds from their specified purpose is indicated

Where reports to the Foundation or other information (including failure to submit reports after a reasonable time has elapsed from their due date) indicates that all or any part of grant funds are not being used for the purposes of such grant, the Foundation initiates an investigation. While conducting the investigation, the Foundation withholds further payments to the extent possible until it has determined that no part of the grant has been used for improper purposes, and until any delinquent reports have been submitted.

If the Foundation determines that any part of a grant has been used for improper purposes, the Foundation takes all reasonable and appropriate steps to recover diverted grant funds or to insure the restoration of diverted funds and the dedication or other grant funds held by the grantee to the purposes being financed by the grant. These steps will include legal action unless such action would in all probability not result in the satisfaction of execution of a judgement.

If the Foundation determines that any part of the grant has been used for improper purposes and the grantee has not previously diverted grant funds to any use not in furtherance of a purpose specified in the grant, the Foundation withholds further payments on the particular grant until (1) it has received the grantee's assurances that further diversions will not occur, (2) any delinquent reports have been submitted, and (3) it has required the grantee to take extraordinary precautions to prevent further diversions from occurring. If the Foundation determines that any part of the grant has been used for improper purposes and the grantee has previously diverted Foundations grant funds, the Foundation withholds further payment until the three conditions of the preceding sentence are met and the diverted

funds are in fact recovered or restored.

II. CIVIC

Grants may be given to such civic organizations which, in the opinion of the Board of Directors, advances and improves the quality of life in the Illinois and Iowa Quad City area.

III. CHARITABLE

Grants may be given to such charitable organizations which, in the opinion of the Board of Directors, provides necessary services to the residents of the Illinois and Iowa Quad City area.



**COMMUNITY FOUNDATION OF THE GREAT RIVER BEND  
DON E. AND CHARLOTTE WILLIAMS SCHOLARSHIP  
PURPOSE AND PROCEDURES**

**Purposes:**

1. Provide grants to individuals for educational purposes at colleges and other post-high school institutions, including trade and technical schools.
2. The purpose of the grant is to achieve a specific objective, produce a report or similar product or improve or enhance a literary, artistic, musical, scientific, teaching or other similar capacity, skill or talent of the grantee.
3. All grants are to be awarded on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis.

**Procedure:**

1. A Scholarship Committee of no more than 5 nor less than 3 members will be selected by the Community Foundation of the Great River Bend. The Don E. and Charlotte Williams Charitable Foundation may recommend Scholarship Committee members but at least one Committee member shall be a Community Foundation Board or Committee member. All members of the Scholarship Committee must be totally independent and separate from the Don E. and Charlotte Williams Charitable Foundation.
2. No member or immediate family of members of the Scholarship Committee or the Community Foundation Board and staff shall be eligible to receive a grant.
3. The Community Foundation will do a preliminary screening of all candidates as to eligibility.
4. The individual grantees will be selected from a group of qualified candidates.
5. The solicitation for candidates will be done on the Community Foundation website, notices to schools or news releases. For 2002, awards will be made in August. In subsequent years, the Community Foundation's schedule for granting scholarships will be followed.
6. The Scholarship Committee will determine the number of scholarships and the amount to be received by each applicant. The maximum distribution for new scholarships will be \$25,000 per year. The grants will be approved by the Community Foundation of the Great River Bend in accordance with its scholarship policies. Continuation requests can be made by reapplication on the scholarship form used by the Community Foundation.
7. All public announcements of the awards will be made by the Community Foundation.

**COMMUNITY FOUNDATION OF THE GREAT RIVER BEND  
DON E. AND CHARLOTTE WILLIAMS SCHOLARSHIP  
CRITERIA**

1. Each applicant should be considered if (criteria listed in order of importance):
  - a. The applicant is a resident of the service area of the Community Foundation of the Great River Bend, or if the applicant does not reside in the service area, the applicant is a lineal descendant or dependent of a former employee (worldwide) of Don E. Williams Company.
  - b. The applicant shows evidence of leadership and character.
  - c. The desired education is conducive toward enabling the applicant to achieve gainful employment in the applicant's chosen career.
  - d. A reasonable financial need appears to exist
  - e. The applicant demonstrates academic achievement.
  - f. The applicant appears determined to achieve his or her educational goals
  - g. Evidence of well-rounded interests and concern for others can be considered.
  - h. The applicant does not yet have a Bachelors degree.
2. Distribution:
  - a. Amount to be distributed:
    - i. Scholarships for full-time students will be awarded in an amount up to \$2,500 per full school year. Part-time students can receive \$75 per semester hour. The Committee can adjust the amount of awards up or down but must uniformly apply their decision.
    - ii. Scholarships can be used to cover the costs of tuition, fees and books.
    - iii. Distributions will be made directly to the school attended by the award recipient. If the entire scholarship amount is not used in the first semester, any unused balance will be available in the second semester.
  - b. Continuation requests for scholarships awarded in prior years should be considered unless:
    - i. The recipient has attained a Bachelors degree.
    - ii. The recipient has failed to maintain a 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale.
    - iii. The recipient has already received funding of \$12,500 in scholarships from the Don E. and Charlotte Williams Scholarship Fund, or has received grants for five years.
