

RESPONSIVE GRANTS POLICIES AND GUIDELINES

It is important that you carefully review Community Memorial Foundation's (CMF) Funding Policies and Guidelines before submitting a grant request. Grant proposals must clearly illustrate how the health of people served will be improved by the proposed program.

- Funding consideration is given to organizations whose missions are congruent with that
 of Community Memorial Foundation and which offer programs and services to
 measurably improve health.
- The Foundation gives preference to organizations that address identified needs among underserved segments of the population.
- Every organization seeking a grant must furnish a copy of its tax-exempt ruling from the Internal Revenue Service showing that exemption has been granted under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or its comparable predecessor section.
- Generally, the Foundation does not consider more than one proposal from any one
 institution during a 12-month period. However, consideration may be given to more
 than one proposal from departments or divisions of large organizations when submitted
 through the office of the chief executive and/or development office of the parent
 organization.
- Generally, the Foundation does not fund programs that are geared primarily for academic credit.
- Generally, no organization will receive a grant of more than 33% of its total budget.
- Generally, the Foundation does not support the same grantee program for more than three consecutive years.
- Organizations requesting multi-year grants must first contact CMF staff prior to written submission.

CMF DOES NOT FUND:

LOGIC MODEL

What is a logic model?

As noted by the University of Wisconsin Extension Program□, in its simplest form, a logic model explains:

- The resources that go into a program.
- The activities the program undertakes.
- The changes or benefits that result.

The logic model describes the sequence of events thought to bring about benefits or change over time, showing the chain of reasoning. It shows the connection of interdependent parts that together make up the whole.

structure for clearly understanding the situation that drives the need for an initiative, the desired end state and how investments It is used for *planning*, as a framework to bridge the gap between where you are and where you want to be. It provides a are linked to activities for targeted people in order to achieve the desired results.

It is used for program management, since it displays the connections between resources, activities and outcomes. During the course of implementation, a logic model is used to explain, track and monitor operations, processes and functions It is used for evaluation, and is really the first step in evaluation. It helps determine when and what to evaluate so that evaluation resources are used effectively and efficiently. Through evaluation, we test and verify the reality of the program theory - how we believe the program will work. A logic model helps us focus on appropriate process and outcome measures.

And it is a key to communication. DEFINITIONS OF LOGIC MODEL TERMS

<u>Inputs</u> are what you provide for the program to happen, such as staff, funding, volunteer resources, equipment, or other elements Outputs are what you do (e.g., provide weekly home visits, provide biweekly parent education classes, provide screenings and referrals to families in need of services) to whom (the participants) Outcomes are what you hope to have happen. Typically, programs think in terms of shorter-term and longer-term outcomes (you may, in fact, find it easier to only fill out two columns and skip the "medium-term" outcomes). Short-term outcomes are what you outcomes take families, such as showing decreased rates of negative birth outcomes, improved parent-infant bonding, reduced during pregnancy, or showing increased feelings of support. Longer-term outcomes are where you hope these shorter-term immediately expect to happen as a result of your services, such as parents learning better ways to take care of themselves ates of children needing early intervention services.

Assumptions are elements that need to be in place for the program to be successful. These could include staff factors (ability to hire bilingual staff, for example) or client factors (parents are able to attend education groups, for example) External factors exist in the environment or community that influence the program's success, both positively and negatively. This home visiting programs can be impacted by changes in welfare requirements that make it so low-income families have to work might include cultural factors, shifting demographics, political factors, changing priorities in the community, etc. For example, and (therefore) be out of the house more.

RESPONSIVE GRANTS POLICIES AND GUIDELINES

- Funding consideration is given to organizations whose missions are congruent with that of Community Memorial Foundation and which offer programs and services to measurably improve health.
- The Foundation gives preference to organizations that address identified needs among underserved segments of the population.
- Every organization seeking a grant must furnish a copy of its tax-exempt ruling from the Internal Revenue Service showing that exemption has been granted under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or its comparable predecessor section.

- Generally, the Foundation does not consider more than one proposal from any one
 institution during a 12-month period. However, consideration may be given to more
 than one proposal from departments or divisions of large organizations when
 submitted through the office of the chief executive and/or development office of the
 parent organization.
- Generally, the Foundation does not fund programs that are geared primarily for academic credit.
- Generally, no organization will receive a grant of more than 33% of its total budget.
- Generally, the Foundation does not support the same grantee program for more than three consecutive years.
- Organizations requesting multi-year grants must first contact CMF staff prior to written submission.

CMF DOES NOT FUND:

- Organizations that limit services to any one religious group or members of a specific sectarian perspective.
- Organizations that as a substantial part of their activities attempt to influence legislation, or directly or indirectly participate in and/or intervene in political organizations, political campaigns or lobbying groups.
- Individuals
- Organizations that illegally discriminate on the basis of race, gender, sexual orientation, creed, age or national origin.
- Tickets to dinners or advertising space in program books or other publications
- Endowments
- Cost of in-patient care

REVIEW CRITERIA:

Funding requests are reviewed according to the following criteria:

- The ability of the project to make a contribution toward improving the quality of health of area residents.
- Demonstrated stability through consistent and effective management, strong board engagement, a broad base of community support, and financial responsibility through exemplary record keeping and effective use of funds.
- The viability of the project, as evident in sound design, appropriate budget, the qualifications of staff and a strong implementation plan.
- The adequacy of plans for measuring success, outcomes and benefits.
- The program's ability to become self-sustaining.
