They directly engage an independent compensation advisor to assist with this process. The process includes evaluation of the individuals performance, utilization of compensation studies of similarly situated positions as well as comparisons to compensation as reported by other health care organizations. The reasonableness of compensation is evaluated based upon these and other factors. Part VI Section B, Question 15b HAPs process for determining compensation for officers (with the exception of the CEO) is designed to meet the requirements for rebuttable presumption of reasonableness under Section 4958. The process includes review and approval by independent persons, market research data prepared and presented by an independent consultant and contemporaneous substantiation of the deliberation and decision. Hap compares compensation of the officers to other HMOs in the surrounding local area with the same or similar title and documents the decisions on compensation in the Executive and Compensation. Committee minutes. The HAP Executive and Compensation Committee is responsible for assuring that the Officers compensation is competitive, meets the guidelines under the HAP Compensation Philosophy, is not considered to be excess compensation and is aligned within their respective pay grades. Key Employees compensation is based upon their pay grade, performance and the HAP Compensation Philosophy. Their performance is evaluated by their immediate supervisor and any increase is based upon the salary increase ra
