#### Facts and Circumstances

The mission of the International Foundation for Functional Gastrointestinal Disorders (IFFGD) is to inform, assist, and support people affected by gastrointestinal (GI) disorders, or bowel incontinence. We address these disorders in adults and children through education and support or encouragement of research.

Our activities are directed to a specialized and often stigmatized health field that deals in large part with bowel disorders, including anal/fecal incontinence, diarrhea, and constipation. Discussion of bowel disorders, and disorders, and fecal incontinence, which are widely prevalent in the U.S. and worldwide with a huge associated social and economic cost, are still considered taboo by many. Other conditions we address such as dyspepsia, gastroparesis, and cyclic vomiting syndrome are widespread with symptoms that include nausea and vomiting. Additionally, the foundation addresses functional esophageal disorders, such as gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD), which is a generally treatable disorder that often goes undiagnosed because of a lack of awareness; untreated GERD may lead to serious complications. We also address rare disorders in children, such as Hirschsprung's disease and pseudo-obstruction, as well as more common pediatric functional GI disorders.

IFFGD receives support from thousands of individuals distributed across the United States and countries outside of the United States. We regularly solicit contributions from the general public. We keep our annual dues low and distribute a large amount of information free of charge in order to reach as large a cross section of the public as we can. Regular solicitations for funds are made through our Internet sites and publications.

We also regularly solicit unrestricted contributions from corporations that are involved with the research, development, manufacturing, and/or sales of products for the diagnosis, treatment, or management of gastrointestinal disorders or incontinence. The purpose of these contributions is to help fund activities initiated by the foundation in order to further our mission.

Regardless of the source of contributions – whether from the general public or from corporate supporters – IFFGD retains unrestricted control over the application of funds and over the planning, content, objectives, methods, and execution of all initiatives and projects. We do not endorse specific products. IFFGD retains the independence essential to our nonprofit role as an impartial and authoritative resource.

The governing body of IFFGD is representative of the general public we serve and includes physicians and healthcare professionals from various disciplines related to digestive health and incontinence, as well as non-medical professionals from legal and business fields. Additionally, IFFGD has an advisory board that is made up of 68 medical professionals from various disciplines representing the U.S.A. and 10 other countries. Many of these individuals are noted experts in the field of functional gastrointestinal disorders. Eleven physicians serve on the editorial board of our journal, *Digestive Health Matters*.

The information and activities of IFFGD have a broad appeal. Our quarterly journal, *Digestive Health Matters*, covers different areas of gastrointestinal health in adults and children with up-to-date information on recognizing, diagnosing, treating, and living with the disorders. The information is reliable and understandable by lay readers, while being authoritative for medical professionals. Our journal is distributed to members, physicians, regulators, investigators, and the general public in nearly every state and in over 130 other countries throughout the world. We offer a library of our own publications and fact sheets that contains over 250 articles with information on a range of topics to help individuals or the families of those affected by GI disorders. Most of our articles are written for us by leading international experts in the field of GI health and research. To encourage wide dissemination, articles are distributed either free of charge or with a nominal charge to cover postage and handling expenses.

Our family of web sites contains over 110 free articles that are available to anyone who logs on, in addition to the diagnostic, treatment, and research information made available. Together, our web sites currently average over 100,000 visits per month.

Additionally, IFFGD maintains Facebook pages and Twitter accounts that inform visitors about health issues.

Additionally, IFFGD maintains a toll-free phone number for members of the public to call with questions about gastrointestinal or incontinence issues.

In 1999, IFFGD produced the first Public Service Announcement (PSA) about irritable bowel syndrome (IBS) that was ever televised in the USA. IBS is the most common functional GI disorder, affecting an estimated 10–20% of the population (25 to 50 million people) in the United States alone. Functional GI disorders are often painful and generally embarrassing. The symptoms can be debilitating for millions of sufferers, and place an estimated \$20 billion annual burden on the U.S. healthcare system including indirect costs of work absenteeism. Yet when IFFGD produced this PSA and polled major TV markets before distribution, one-half said they would not televise the PSA if the word "bowel" was spoken or appeared! Thus we could not even name the disorder – irritable bowel syndrome. Instead, we used the acronym IBS. Given this type of public stigma attached to the most common functional GI disorder, it is no wonder that many sufferers keep their disorder a secret, and suffer in silence. IFFGD works hard to change that and we are making progress.

In 2011, IFFGD produced the 2nd Public Service Announcement (PSA) about irritable bowel syndrome.

In order to help individuals and the public understand the impact of IBS on sufferers, in 2002 we conducted and published *IBS in the Real World Survey* of 350 adults with a diagnosis of IBS. This survey looked at the symptoms, treatment, side effects, and overall impact the disease has on the lives of those affected. The survey found that most of these individuals were living with chronic symptoms that impaired their quality of life and productivity with few effective treatments.

In 2003, we presented our first *IFFGD Research Awards* to seven leading investigators in the field of gastroenterology. The awards are intended to encourage the participation of clinicians and scientists in multidisciplinary efforts aimed at advancing the understanding of gastrointestinal disorders in adults and in children, to improve diagnosis and treatment.

Our 2005 IFFGD Research Awards were presented to six investigators at the 6th International Symposium on Functional GI Disorders held in April 2005.

Our 2007 IFFGD Research Awards were presented to six investigators at the 7th International Symposium on Functional GI Disorders held in April 2007.

In 2008 IFFGD Research Grants were presented to three investigators studying functional GI disorders.

In 2009 IFFGD Research Awards were presented to five investigators at the 8th International Symposium on Functional GI Disorders held in April 2009.

In 2011 IFFGD Research Awards were presented to six investigators at the 9th International Symposium on Functional GI Disorders held in April 2011.

In 2004 we conducted the *IFFGD National IBS Survey* of 1,000 adults in the USA to look at prevalence and awareness of IBS symptoms, diagnosis, and treatment. This survey found that, while symptoms are negatively impacting quality of life, a lack of understanding by many about IBS may be getting in the way of diagnosis and treatment.

In 2007–2008 we conducted the *IBS Patients: Their Illness Experience and Unmet Needs* survey in collaboration with the UNC Center for Functional GI and Motility Disorders to shed light on IBS, how patients experience its symptoms and treatment, and patient unmet needs.

In 2008 we created an online forum at <u>www.aboutIncontinence.org/community</u> to give people affected by urgency, soiling, or incontinence a safe and supportive place to discuss issues surrounding these sensitive topics.

In 2008 we created, published and distributed a Reporter's Guide to Bowel Incontinence to provide print, broadcast and electronic media with accurate information about incontinence.

In 2008 we collaborated with the Rome Foundation to conduct focus groups to gather data about the patients' experience of IBS and the factors that contribute to severity.

In 2009 we created, published and distributed a Reporter's Guide to Functional Gastrointestinal Disorders to provide print, broadcast and electronic media with accurate information about these prevalent disorders.

In 1997 IFFGD designated the month of April as *IBS Awareness Month*, and it is listed on the U.S. National Health Observances calendar. Every April we make a special effort to focus attention on important health messages about IBS diagnosis, treatment, and quality of life issues. We do so through our publications, web sites, and through the production and distribution of Public Service Announcements that are distributed through print, radio, television, and the Internet. We also created a special web page for this effort located at <a href="www.aboutibs.org/Publications/IBSawareness.html">www.aboutibs.org/Publications/IBSawareness.html</a> where people are able to find information year around.

In 2001, IFFGD produced GERD in the Workplace, a "toolkit" that provides corporate wellness managers or human resource managers the information they need to educate their employees about the signs, symptoms, and treatment of gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD). GERD can be a debilitating disorder that affects up to 15% of the population. Complications of GERD can lead to pre-cancerous conditions. The disorder is usually treatable under a physicians care. However, its most frequent symptom, heartburn, is so common that people often ignore it or treat it ineffectively with over the counter remedies. To encourage dissemination of the information in our Workplace toolkit, we provide it free of charge to interested employers. The IFFGD toolkit includes a variety of fact sheets, brochures, and journals published by IFFGD. The information is then distributed by employers to their employees through company newsletters or health fairs. Examples of major corporations that have received the GERD in the Workplace Toolkit include Liberty Mutual Insurance Co., the automotive giant Daimler-Chrysler, and Bank One. Collectively they employ hundreds of thousands of people throughout the United States.

In 1998 IFFGD designated one week in November as GERD Awareness Week, which is also listed on the U.S. National Health Observances calendar. During this time (and at any time), people experiencing symptoms, which may be GERD-related, are encouraged to call the IFFGD Heartburn Helpline toll-free at 1-888-964-2001 to receive information and support regarding GERD. We created a special web page for this effort located at <a href="www.aboutgerd.org/week.html">www.aboutgerd.org/week.html</a>. Every November, IFFGD efforts to support GERD Awareness Week include a Public Service Announcement outreach to print, and television and radio outlets.

Health messages to the general public from IFFGD about GI disorders and incontinence continually appear in a range of diverse media outlets online or in print such as, WebMD, RealAge, LiveStrong, Health Day News, Exceptional Parent Magazine, Modern Medicine, Medical News Today, EndoNurse, Gastroenterology & Endoscopy News, Good Housekeeping, Redbook, Parade, Self, Prevention Magazine, US News & World Report, Cosmopolitan, the Washington Post, LA Times, New York Times, Wall Street Journal, and the Daily Yomiuri (Tokyo) to name a few. IFFGD messages have appeared on numerous TV and radio shows including CBS This Morning/Early Morning Show, the Today Show, Fox News, CNN Headline News, and National Public Radio's Living Without Limits among others.

Functional GI disorders, for the most part, lack structural or biochemical markers that identify the disorders. Thus, they have long been difficult for physicians to understand, diagnose, and treat. The prevalence of fecal incontinence has long been underestimated and that population underserved. As a part of our mission of serving patients, IFFGD also conducts education initiatives for physicians and caregivers of these specialized GI topics.

Fecal/anal incontinence is often thought of as a rare disorder associated with aging. It is not. Beginning in 1993, IFFGD launched a research project to determine the prevalence of and characteristics associated with anal incontinence in the general community. The results of this research initiative, which reported that 2.2% of the general public are afflicted by this disorder, were published in *The Journal of the American Medical Association* (JAMA), August 16, 1995, Volume 274.

IFFGD initiated and co-sponsors, with the Office of Continuing Medical Education of the University of Wisconsin Medical School, the *International Symposia on Functional GI Disorders* that began in 1995. Our 9th meeting was held in April 2011. This biennial conference was the first international meeting designed to communicate new knowledge in the field of functional GI disorders. It has been described as "an educational jewel," attracting hundreds of scientists and health care professionals from around the world as well as representatives of the National Institutes of Health and the Food and Drug Administration. Findings presented in these meetings are widely distributed through our publications and web sites.

In 1996, IFFGD produced a physician text and slide set on the most common functional GI disorders. This was the first educational guide to offer information on functional GI disorders incorporating the Rome Criteria, a symptom-based diagnostic method, that physicians and healthcare professionals can use in presentations to educate the general public and community medical groups. In 2004, the irritable bowel syndrome section to the guide was updated and placed on CD with power point slides.

In 1998, IFFGD supported the development of an educational video for medical professionals entitled: A Biopsychosocial Approach to Irritable Bowel Syndrome: Improving the Physician Patient Relationship. Using simulated patient encounters, this video offers physicians techniques to improve communication with patients having mild, moderate, and severe symptoms of IBS. The video received recognition in 1998 from the American Medical Association (AMA) when it was named 1st runner-up in the AMA International Medical Film Festival for the category of patient education.

IFFGD originated and helped coordinate, the first Consensus Conference on Treatment Options for Fecal Incontinence. This first meeting, held by IFFGD in Milwaukee, led to the publication of a consensus report, which was published in Diseases of the Colon and Rectum, in 2001. A second incontinence meeting, Advancing the Treatment of Fecal & Urinary Incontinence Through Research: Trial Design, Outcome Measures, and Research Priorities, was organized and held by IFFGD in November 2002 and received support from the National Institutes of Health (NIH). Publication of the proceedings of this meeting were published in the January 2004 Supplement of the journal, Gastroenterology, a widely read peer-reviewed medical journal. In 2007 we helped plan and participated in the NIH State-of-the-Science Conference on Prevention of Fecal and Urinary Incontinence in Adults.

IFFGD has focused its efforts on serving patients with multiple, often stigmatized, digestive disorders throughout the world. The organization has attempted to raise awareness among the general public while at the same time raise funds from this population. Many of our members have these disorders, which may affect their ability to maintain continual employment. Hence, their incomes may be limited and therefore we have made the concerted effort to keep their membership fees at nominal levels. IFFGD's corporate contributors have been an integral part in providing support so that the organization can reach as many people as possible. The mix of dollars of the individual givers with the corporate contributors have resulted in the public contribution percentage occasionally falling below the 501(c)3 (a)1 organization 33 1/3 % level. IFFGD will continue to look for new ways to achieve public percentage while never affecting our number one objective; to be a patient organization that serves the public, to work toward finding cures for these diseases, but at a minimum to help those affected manage and maintain their quality of life while co-existing with these disorders.
