

The Michael and Helen Jupka Fund was established to provide scholarship support for graduating seniors at Milwaukee Public Schools Bradley Trade and Technical High School who are attending college. The scholarship dollars were invested in the Greater Milwaukee Foundation, but remain under the control of the MPS Foundation.

4b (Code:) (Expenses \$ 40,000 including grants of \$ 40,000) (Revenue \$)
The MPS Scholarship Program was established through a generous anonymous donation to the MPS Foundation to establish the scholarship program as a show of support for public education in Milwaukee and the State of Wisconsin. In the first year (June, 2010), five \$5,000 scholarships were awarded. In the second year (2011), eight \$5,000 scholarships were awarded, three were scholarship renewals and five were new recipients. These scholarships are for high school students enrolled in Milwaukee Public Schools to attend a public college or university in the State of Wisconsin. The scholarships may be renewed for up to three years pending successful completion of renewal criteria and availability of funding.

The MPS Recreation Department received a grant, through the MPS Foundation, from the United States Olympic Committee. This grant was designed to provide recreational services to veterans with physical disabilities.
