NOTE 1 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization – The Stablish Foundation was organized as a Minnesota nonprofit corporation on February 2, 1995. It was formed to assist donors in fulfilling their charitable intentions through individualized educational, technical and administrative support. The Foundation assists the donors' professional advisers and documents any administrative support.

Basis of Presentation – Contributions received are recorded as an increase in unrestricted, temporarily restricted or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions. Accordingly, net assets of the Foundation and changes therein are classified and reported as follows:

Unrestricted – These resources over which the Foundation has discretionary control. Designated amounts represent those revenues that the Foundation has set aside for a particular purpose.

Temporarily Restricted – Those resources subject to donor imposed restrictions, which will be satisfied by actions of the Foundation or the passage of time.

Permanently Restricted – Those resources subject to a donor imposed restriction that they be maintained permanently by the Foundation

At December 31, 2011 and 2010 the Foundation had no permanently restricted assets.

Donated Services – The value of services donated by individuals, corporations, foundations and governmental organizations for the Foundation is not reflected in the financial statements since no objective basis is available to measure the value

Investments – The Foundation carries investments in mutual funds with readily determinable fair values and all investments in life insurance at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statement of activities. Realized investment income and gains restricted by donors are reported as increases in temporarily restricted net assets

Allowance for Uncollectible Accounts – The Foundation uses the allowance method to determine uncollectible accounts receivable. An allowance for doubtful accounts has not been established at December 31, 2011 based on the Foundation's past collection experience and management's analysis of outstanding accounts receivable.

Funds Held for Others – Funds held for others consist of charitable remainder trusts for which the Foundation is the trustee

Split Interest Agreements – The Foundation administers several charitable remainder trusts in which the Foundation is the remaining beneficiary. The charitable remainder trusts provide for distributions to the beneficiaries during the life of the trust. At the end of the trust's term, the remaining assets are transferred to the Foundation. The portion of the trust attributable to the future interest of the Foundation was recorded in the statements of activities as temporarily restricted contributions in the period the trust was established. Assets held in the charitable remainder trust are recorded at fair market value in the Foundation's balance sheet.

On an annual basis, the Foundation revalues the liability to make distributions to the designated beneficiaries based on actuarial assumptions. The initial contributions are recorded at the present value of the estimated future payments, which is calculated using the IRS mid-term AFR and applicable mortality tables. The AFR was 1.27% and 1.52% at December 31, 2011 and 2010 respectively.

NOTE 1 SIGINIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Standards of Accounting and Financial Reporting – The Foundation follows the accounting guidance in the audit and accounting guide, Not for Profit Organizations, which is in conformity with the recommendations of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenue and expense during the reported period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Tax Exempt Status – The Foundation is qualified as a public charity and is exempt from excise taxes on investment income. The Foundation is also exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3). The management is of the view that there are no significant tax positions that may be challenged.

The Organization's Forms 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax for the years ending 2010, 2009, and 2008 are subject to examination by the IRS, generally for three years after they were filed.

Subsequent Events – Subsequent events have been evaluated through the date of the accountant's report which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. No transactions were noted that require adjustments or disclosure.

NOTE 4 – RELATED PARTY

The Foundation was formed to meet the charitable giving goals of participants. Substantially all of the donees to the Foundation are clients of a securities broker-dealer corporation and its investment advisory firm. Virtually all of the members of the board of directors are affiliated with the broker-deal or investment advisory firm. Fees paid to these related firms for investment advisory services totaled \$46,779 for 2011 and \$22,342 for 2010.

NOTE 5 - TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Temporarily restricted net assets consist of charitable remainder trusts, restricted by time.
