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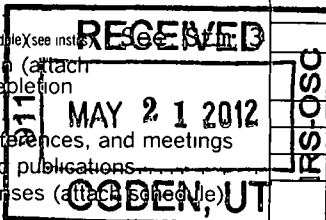

PROCEDURES ADOPTED BY THE TRUST COMMITTEE OF LINCOLN SAVINGS BANK, TRUSTEE
IN REGARD TO THE RUSSELL DUNN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP TRUST AND THE NELLIE DUNN
MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP TRUST.

The following shall constitute the initial procedures regarding selection of recipients for assistance from the Russell Dunn Memorial Scholarship Trust and the Nellie Dunn Memorial Scholarship Trust:

1. Eligible applicants shall be past graduates or a member of the current graduating class immediately preceding the award year of Reinbeck Community High School.
2. Full time students at any approved college, junior college, community college, vocational technical school or trade school shall be qualified to receive the award. Correspondence courses or courses not requiring the personal attendance of the applicants at a center of learning shall not be considered as qualified courses and students taking such courses shall be considered as ineligible.
3. Employees or directors of Lincoln Savings Bank, their spouses and lineal descendants, and members of the selection committee, their spouses and lineal descendants, shall be ineligible to receive assistance.
4. Selection shall not be based upon the employment status of the applicant or a relative.
5. The sex or race of the applicant shall not be considered in any way in making the selection.
6. The selection of recipients and the amounts of awards shall be made by the Trust Committee of Lincoln Savings Bank, Trustee. The Trust Committee is composed of four members of the Board of Directors and all of the Trust Officers (presently two in number) of Lincoln Savings Bank.
7. All application forms and the required accompanying documentation shall be submitted between the dates of February 1 and May 1 of each year.
8. Application forms and accompanying documents shall be reviewed by the committee.
9. Recommendations from the administration of Reinbeck Community High School shall be received and reviewed. Oral or written recommendation may be received.

10. Selection shall be based upon a qualified applicant's need for assistance, general character and probability of success in the chosen field of learning.

11. The financial situation of the applicant shall be considered if the student is married or past the age of 23 years. If the student is under the age of 23 years and is unmarried, the financial situation of both the student and the student's parents shall be considered.

12. Selection shall be by motion, duly seconded and passed by a majority vote of the selection committee as to the identity of recipients and amount of award. The awards may be limited to one each year or may be composed of more than one. The committee shall have the discretion to make awards to previous recipients or to make awards to new recipients each year.

The above has been adopted by the Trust committee of Lincoln Savings Bank as the procedures adopted by the committee in making awards under the foregoing Memorial Scholarship Trusts.
