Pt III Line 4 The Endowment Trust received a bequest during the year ended December 31, 2011, which includes artwork and other items. At December 31, 2011, the measurable value of this bequest is \$1,481,535. A portion of this collection is the newest exhibit in Peabody Hall, "Inspired by Nature", a collection of original paintings by wildlife artist and conservationist Robert Bateman. This artwork is directly related to the Zoo's mission to educate the public about wildlife and conservation.

These assets were transferred to the Association as a result of the

dissolution of the Endowment Trust.

Pt V Line 4 The endowed funds are held for the purpose of advancing the St. Louis Zoo and further its conservation and education mission. Specifically, the endowed funds currently provide funding for the WildCare Institute, education outreach, professional positions, and employee recognition. The endowed funds were transferred to the Association at 12/31/2011 as a result of the dissolution of the Endowment Trust.
