EDUCATIONAL AND SCIENTIFIC PURPOSES UNDER SECTION 501(C)(3) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED, (THE "CODE") OR CORRESPONDING SECTION OF ANY FUTURE FEDERAL TAX CODE, AND IN FURTHERANCE THEREOF IS AUTHORIZED TO DO THE FOLLOWING: (A) TO PARTICIPATE AS FAR AS CIRCUMSTANCES MAY WARRANT, IN ANY ACTIVITY DESIGNED AND ESTABLISHED TO PROMOTE THE FINANCIAL LITERACY, CONTINUED EDUCATION AND SOCIAL NEEDS OF THE FOLLOWING COMMUNITIES: ALL MUNICIPALITIES LOCATED WITHIN MIDDLESEX COUNTY, MASSACHUSETTS AND ESSEX COUNTY, MASSACHUSETTS; THE MASSACHUSETTS MUNICIPALITIES OF FITCHBURG, LEOMINSTER, HARVARD, LUNENBURG AND LANCASTER; AND ALL MUNICIPALITIES LOCATED WITHIN HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY, NEW HAMPSHIRE AND ROCKINGHAM COUNTY, NEW HAMPSHIRE; (B) TO RECEIVE GIFTS, DEVISES, BEQUESTS OR OTHERWISE, ANY KIND OF PROPERTY, ABSOLUTELY OR IN TRUST, THE PRINCIPAL OR INCOME OF THE SAME TO BE USED FOR THE FURTHERANCE OF ANY OF THE PURPOSES DESIGNATED HEREIN; (C) TO MAKE DISTRIBUTIONS TO ORGANIZATIONS THAT QUALIFY AS EXEMPT ORGANIZATIONS UNDER SECTION 501(C)(3) OF THE CODE IN FURTHERANCE OF ANY OF THE PURPOSES DESIGNATED HEREIN; AND (D) TO ENGAGE GENERALLY IN ANY ACTIVITY IN FURTHERANCE OF THE CORPORATION'S CHARITABLE, EDUCATIONAL, RELIGIOUS AND SCIENTIFIC PURPOSES THAT MAY LAWFULLY BE CARRIED ON BY A CORPORATION FORMED UNDER CHAPTER 180 OF THE MASSACHUSETTS GENERAL LAWS, AS AMENDED OR SUPPLEMENTED FROM TIME TO TIME, PROVIDED THAT THE CORPORATION SHALL TAKE NO SUCH ACTION THAT WOULD CAUSE THE CORPORATION TO FAIL TO BE QUALIFIED AS AN EXEMPT ORGANIZATION UNDER SECTION 501(C)(3) OF THE CODE.

#### **ARTICLE III**

A corporation may have one or more classes of members. If it does, the designation of such classes, the manner of election or appointments, the duration of membership and the qualifications and rights, including voting rights, of the members of each class, may be set forth in the by-laws of the corporation or may be set forth below

Other lawful provisions, if any, for the conduct and regulation of the business and affairs of the corporation, for its voluntary dissolution, or for limiting, defining, or regulating the powers of the corporation, or of its directors or members, or of any class of members, are as follows:

#### We Share a Common thread Foundation, Inc.

# ARTICLE I THE CORPORATION

- Section 1.1 Name. The name of the corporation shall be We Share a Common Thread Foundation, Inc.
- Section 1.2 **Purposes.** The corporation is organized and shall be operated for the purposes set forth in its Articles of Organization as amended from time to time.
- Section 1.3 **Corporate Offices.** The principal office of the corporation shall be located in Lowell, Massachusetts, or whatever other place the board of directors shall determine. The corporation shall also have and continuously maintain registered agents where required by law.
- Section 1.4 **Dissolution.** In the event of dissolution of the corporation, the board of directors, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, and after the plan of dissolution has been approved in accordance with Massachusetts law, shall distribute all of the assets of the corporation as the directors shall determine to such organization or organizations that are exempt from federal taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or shall be distributed to the federal government or to a state or local government for a public purpose, all in accordance with the Articles of Organization.

### ARTICLE II MEMBERS

The corporation shall have no members.

### ARTICLE III BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 3.1 **Duties and Powers.** The business of the corporation shall be managed by a board of directors who may exercise all the powers of the corporation. In the event of a vacancy in the board of directors, the remaining directors, except as otherwise provided by law, may exercise the powers of the full board until the vacancy is filled.
- Section 3.2 **Composition of Board of Directors.** The board of directors shall consist of such number of directors as shall be fixed by the electors from time to time. The electors shall be the President and Chief Executive Officer of Jeanne D'Arc Credit Union, presently having offices at One Tremont Place, Lowell, MA 01854, and the senior management team of said Jeanne D'Arc Credit Union, consisting of all individuals who report directly to said President

and Chief Executive Officer. Initially there shall be five (5) directors. The directors shall be elected annually by the electors at any meeting of the electors where the election of such directors is listed as an agenda item for the meeting.

- Section 3.3 **Tenure.** Except as otherwise provided by law, by the Articles of Organization or by these Bylaws, directors (other than any director serving *ex officio*) shall hold office for a term of one year and until their successors are chosen and qualified.
- Section 3.4 **Resignation.** Any director may resign by delivering his or her written resignation to the corporation at its principal office or to the president or clerk. Such resignation shall be effective upon receipt unless it is specified to be effective at some other time or upon the happening of some other event.
- Section 3.5 **Vacancies; Reduction of Board.** Any vacancy in the board of directors, however occurring, including a vacancy resulting from the enlargement of the board of directors, may be filled solely by the electors, and any director so elected shall hold office for the unexpired term of the director he or she replaced. In lieu of filling any such vacancy, the electors may reduce the number of directors, but not to a number less than three.
- Section 3.6 Enlargement of the Board. The board of directors may be enlarged by the electors at any time.
- Section 3.7 **Removal.** A director may be removed from office at any time with or without cause by the electors.
- Section 3.8 Attendance Requirement. In order to assure the proper discharge of a director's duties, each director is expected to attend all meetings of the board of directors. Any director who is absent from three consecutive meetings for other than compelling reasons shall be deemed to have tendered his or her resignation which the board of directors in its discretion may accept or reject. Such resignation shall be effective only upon acceptance by the board of directors.

## Section 3.9 Meetings of the Board.

- (a) Annual Meeting of the Board. The annual meeting of the board of directors shall be held each year at the place, date, and time determined by the board of directors. Such meeting shall be held at the principal office of the corporation or at such place and such time and date as may be designated from time to time by the board of directors for the purposes of electing officers as hereinafter provided and transacting such other business as shall be desirable.
- (b) Regular Meetings of the Board. Regular meetings of the board of directors may be held without notice at such time, date and place as the directors shall provide by resolution. Meetings of the board of directors shall be held at least quarterly.

- (c) Special Meetings of the Board. Special meetings of the board of directors may be called by the chairperson of the electors, by the chairperson of the board of directors, by the president, or by the clerk upon the written request of any three directors.
- Section 3.10 Notice of Board of Directors Meeting. Notice of the time, date, and place of all special meetings of the board of directors shall be given to each director in person or by telephone or by facsimile telecommunication or other form of electronic transmission consented to by the director to whom the notice is given at least forty-eight hours in advance of the meeting, or by written notice mailed to his or her business or home address at least four days before the date of the meeting, which notice shall state generally the nature of the business to be taken up at the meeting. Such notice shall be deemed to be delivered, (i) if by mail, when deposited in the U.S. mail in a sealed envelope, properly addressed, first-class postage prepaid, (ii) if by facsimile telecommunication, when directed to a number at which the director has consented to receive notice, (iii) if by electronic mail, when directed to an electronic mail address at which the director has consented to receive notice, and (iv) if by any other form of electronic communication consented to by the director to whom the notice is given, when directed to the director. Notice need not be given to any director if a written waiver of notice, executed by him or her before or after the meeting, is filed with the records of the meeting, or to any director who attends the meeting without protesting prior thereto or at its commencement the lack of notice to him or her. A waiver of notice of a meeting of the board of directors need not specify the purpose of the meeting.
- Section 3.11 **Quorum at Board Meetings.** For all meetings of the board of directors (other than for action taken by unanimous written consent), a quorum shall be a simple majority of the directors then serving unless a larger number is required by law. Less than a quorum may adjourn any meeting from time to time and the meeting may be held as adjourned without further notice.
- Section 3.12 **Voting at Board Meetings.** At any meeting of the board of directors at which a quorum is present, a majority of the directors present may take any action on behalf of the board of directors, except to the extent that a larger number is required by law, by the Articles of Organization or by these Bylaws. Each director shall be entitled to cast one vote on all matters presented to the board for its approval.
- Section 3.13 **Informal Action by Directors.** Any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the board of directors may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all the directors entitled to vote with respect to the subject matter thereof and the written consents are filed with the records of the meetings of directors. Any consent signed by all the directors shall have the same effect as a unanimous vote and may be stated as such in any document filed with the Secretary of State of the Commonwealth or with anyone else.
- Section 3.14 Meeting by Electronic Communication. Directors may participate in and act at any meeting of the board of directors by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment if all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other

simultaneously, and participation by such means shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.

Section 3.15 **Compensation of Directors.** Directors shall receive no compensation for their services as such, but may be reimbursed for expenses of attendance at meetings or when on other business of the corporation.

#### Section 3.16 Committees.

- (a) **Committees.** The board of directors, by vote of a majority of the directors then in office, may elect from its number committees and may delegate thereto some or all of its powers except those which by law, by the Articles of Organization, or by these Bylaws may not be delegated.
- (b) Committee Procedures. Except as the board of directors may otherwise determine, any committee may make rules for the conduct of its business, but unless otherwise provided by the board of directors or in such rules, its business shall be conducted so far as possible in the same manner as is provided by these Bylaws for the board of directors. All members of such committees shall hold such offices at the pleasure of the board of directors. The board of directors may abolish any such committee at any time. Any committee to which the board of directors delegates any of its powers or duties shall keep records of its meetings and shall report its action to the board of directors. The board of directors shall have power to rescind any action of any committee, but no such rescission shall have retroactive effect.

## ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

- Section 4.1 **Enumeration of Corporate Officers.** The officers of the corporation shall include a chairperson of the board, a president, a treasurer, a clerk, and such other officers as the board of directors may determine. The chairperson shall be a director of the corporation, and the other officers of the corporation need not be directors. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person.
- Section 4.2 **Election.** The chairperson of the board, the President, the treasurer and the clerk of the corporation shall be elected annually by the board of directors at their annual meeting or at any other meeting. Other officers may be elected by the board of directors at such meeting or at any other meeting.
- Section 4.3 **Tenure.** Except as otherwise provided by law, by the Articles of Organization or by these Bylaws, the president shall hold office for a term of one year until the next annual meeting of the members and until his or her successor is chosen and qualified; the chairperson, the treasurer and the clerk shall hold office for a term of one year until the next annual meeting of the board of directors and until their respective successors are chosen and qualified; and all other officers shall hold office for a term of one year until the next annual

meeting of the board of directors and until their successors are chosen and qualified, or for such shorter term as the board of directors may fix at the time such officers are chosen.

- Section 4.4 **Resignation.** Any officer may resign by delivering his or her written resignation to the corporation at its principal office or to the president or clerk, and such resignation shall be effective upon receipt unless it is specified to be effective at some other time or upon the happening of some other event.
- Section 4.5 **Removal.** The electors may remove the president at any time with or without cause, and the board of directors may remove the president or any other officer with or without cause by a vote of a majority of the entire number of directors then in office. An officer may be removed for cause only after reasonable notice and an opportunity to be heard by the body removing him or her.
- Section 4.6 **Vacancies.** Any vacancy in any office may be filled for the unexpired portion of the term by the board of directors (subject in the case of the chairperson of the board to ratification by the members).
- Section 4.7 **Duties of the Chairperson.** The chairperson of the board of directors shall have all the duties which that position would customarily require, including chairing all meetings of the board of directors, recommending to the board the creation of committees of the board of directors and the election of their members and all other duties assigned to the chairperson under these Bylaws or by board resolution.
- Section 4.8 **Duties of the President.** The president shall be the chief executive officer of the corporation. The president shall be the direct executive representative of the board of directors in the management of the corporation and shall have all the duties and authority which such position would customarily require
- Section 4.9 **Duties of the Clerk.** The clerk shall act as secretary of the corporation and the board of directors. The clerk shall send or cause to be sent appropriate notices or waivers of notice regarding board meetings; shall prepare or cause to be prepared agenda and other materials for all meetings of the board of directors; shall act as official custodian of all records, reports and minutes of the corporation, the board of directors and committees; shall be responsible for the keeping and reporting of adequate records of all meetings of the board of directors; and shall perform such other duties as are customarily performed by or required of corporate secretaries, including the custody of the corporate seal. The clerk shall be a resident of Massachusetts unless the corporation has a resident agent appointed for the purpose of service of process.
- Section 4.10 **Duties of the Treasurer.** The treasurer shall have general charge of the financial concerns of the corporation. The treasurer shall ensure that a true and accurate accounting of the financial transactions of the corporation is made periodically and that reports of such transactions are presented to the board of directors. In the event of the absence or

disability of the chairperson of the board, the treasurer shall chair meetings of the board of directors and shall perform such other duties as may be delegated to the treasurer from time to time by the president or by the board of directors.

### ARTICLE V INDEMNIFICATION

### Section 5.1 **Definitions.** For purposes of this Article

- (a) An "Elector" or "Director" or "Officer" means any person serving as an elector or director or officer of the corporation or in any other office filled by election by the directors and also includes (i) an Elector or Director or Officer serving at the request of the corporation as a director or officer, employee, trustee, partner or other agent of another organization, and (ii) any person who formerly served as an Elector or Director or Officer.
- (b) "Expenses" means (i) all expenses (including attorneys' fees and disbursements) actually and reasonably incurred in defense of a Proceeding, in being a witness in a Proceeding, or in successfully seeking indemnification under this Article, (ii) such expenses incurred in connection with Proceeding initiated by an Elector or Director or Officer as may be approved by the board of directors, and (iii) any judgments, awards, fines or penalties paid by an Elector or Director or Officer in connection with a Proceeding or reasonable amounts paid in settlement of a Proceeding: and
- (c) A "Proceeding" means any threatened, pending or competed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, and any claim which could be the subject of a Proceeding.
- Section 5.2 Right to Indemnification. Except as limited by law, the corporation shall indemnify its Electors and Directors and Officers against all Expenses incurred by them in connection with any Proceedings in which they are involved as a result of their service as an Elector or Director or Officer, except that (i) no indemnification shall be provided for any Elector or Director or Officer regarding a matter as to which it shall be determined pursuant to Section 5.5 of this Article or adjudicated that he or she did not act in good faith and in the reasonable belief that his or her action was in the best interests of the corporation, or with respect to a criminal matter, that he or she had reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful, and (ii) no indemnification shall be provided for any Elector or Director or Officer with respect to any Proceeding by or in the right of the corporation or alleging that an Elector or Director or Officer received an improper personal benefit if he or she is adjudged liable to the corporation in such Proceeding or, in the absence of such an adjudication, if he or she is determined to be ineligible for indemnification under the circumstances pursuant to Section 5.5 of this Article; provided, however, that indemnification of Expenses incurred by an Elector or Director or Officer in successfully defending a Proceeding alleging that he or she received an improper personal benefit as a result of his or her status as such may be paid if and to the extent authorized by the board of directors.

- Section 5.3 **Settled Proceedings.** If a Proceeding is compromised or settled in a manner which imposes any liability or obligation upon an Elector or Director or Officer, (i) no indemnification shall be provided to him or her with respect to a Proceeding by or in the right of the corporation unless a court having jurisdiction determines that indemnification is reasonable and proper under the circumstances, and (ii) no indemnification shall be provided to him or her with respect to any other type of Proceeding if it is determined pursuant to Section 5.5 of this Article on the basis of the circumstances known at that time (without further investigation) that said Elector or Director or Officer is ineligible for indemnification.
- Section 5.4 Advance Payments. Except as limited by law, Expenses incurred by an Elector or Director or Officer in defending any Proceeding, including a Proceeding by or in the right of the corporation, shall be paid by the corporation to said Elector or Director or Officer in advance of final disposition of the Proceeding upon receipt of his or her written undertaking to repay such amount if he or she is determined pursuant to Section 5.5 of this Article or adjudicated to be ineligible for indemnification, which undertaking shall be an unlimited general obligation but need not be secured and may be accepted without regard to the financial ability of such person to make repayment; provided, however, that no such advance payment of Expenses shall be made if it is determined pursuant to Section 5.5 of this Article on the basis of the circumstances known at that time (without further investigation) that said Elector or Director or Officer is ineligible for indemnification.
- Section 5.5 **Determinations; Payments.** The determination of whether an Elector or Director or Officer is eligible or ineligible for indemnification under this Article shall be made in each instance by (a) a majority of the Directors or a committee thereof who are not parties to the Proceeding in question, or (b) independent legal counsel appointed by a majority of such Directors, or if there are none, by a majority of the Directors in office. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a court having jurisdiction (which need not be the court in which the Proceeding in question was brought) may grant or deny indemnification in each instance under the provisions of law and this Article. The corporation shall be obliged to pay indemnification applied for by an Elector or Director or Officer to the corporation in writing unless there is an adverse determination (as provided above) within sixty days after the application. If indemnification is denied, the applicant may seek an independent determination of his or her right to indemnification by a court, and in such event the corporation shall have the burden of proving that the applicant was ineligible for indemnification under this Article.
- Section 5.6 **Insurance.** The corporation shall have power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any agent, employee, elector, director or officer against any liability or cost incurred by him or her in any such capacity or arising out of his status as such, whether or not the corporation would have power to indemnify him against such liability or cost.
- Section 5.7 **Responsibility With Respect to Employee Benefit Plan.** If the corporation or any of its Electors or Directors or Officers sponsors or undertakes any responsibility as a fiduciary with respect to an employee benefit plan, then for purposes of indemnification of such persons under this Article (i) an "Elector" or Director" or "Officer" shall be deemed to include any Elector or Director or Officer of the corporation who serve at its request in any capacity with respect to said plan, (ii) such Elector or Director or Officer shall not

be deemed to have failed to act in good faith in the reasonable belief that his or her action was in the best interest of the corporation if he or she acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that his or her action was in the best interests of the participants or beneficiaries of said plan, and (iii) "Expenses" shall be deemed to include any taxes or penalties imposed on such Elector or Director or Officer with respect to said plan under applicable law.

- Section 5.8 **Heirs and Personal Representatives.** The indemnification provided by this Article shall inure to the benefit of the heirs and personal representatives of an Elector or Director or Officer.
- Section 5.9 **Non-Exclusivity.** The provisions of this Article shall not be construed to limit the power of the corporation to indemnify its Electors or Directors or Officers to the full extent permitted by law or to enter into specific agreements, commitments or arrangements for indemnification permitted by law. In addition, the corporation shall have power to indemnify any of its agents or employees who are not Electors or Directors or Officers on any terms not prohibited by law which it deems to be appropriate. The absence of any express provision for indemnification herein shall not limit any right of indemnification existing independently of this Article.
- Section 5.10 Amendment. The provisions of this Article may be amended or repealed only by the electors; provided, however, no amendment or repeal of such provisions which adversely affects the rights of an Elector or Director or Officer under this Article with respect to his or her acts or omissions at any time prior to such amendment or repeal shall apply to him or her without his or her consent.

### ARTICLE VI CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

- Section 6.1 **Conflict of Interest Policy.** The board of directors shall adopt a conflict of interest policy to address matters involving the corporation in which persons associated with the corporation may have an interest.
- Section 6.2. **Disclosure.** The conflict of interest policy adopted by the board of directors shall provide for persons associated with the corporation to file with the corporation on an annual basis a statement disclosing any interest such person may have in matters involving the corporation. A report on such disclosure statements, indicating any conflict of interest contained therein shall be made annually to the board of directors.

# ARTICLE VII MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 7.1 **Fiscal Year.** Except as otherwise determined by the board of directors, the fiscal year of the corporation shall be the twelve months ending as of the end of December of each year.

- Section 7.2 Seal. The board of directors shall have power to adopt and alter the seal of the corporation.
- Section 7.3 **Execution of Instruments.** The chairperson of the board of directors, the president and the treasurer and their designees shall be authorized to execute contracts on behalf of the corporation within the authority conferred by the board of directors. In addition, the board may authorize other officers or agents to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the corporation.
- Section 7.4 **Voting of Securities.** The president or treasurer may, upon the approval of the board of directors, waive notice of and act on behalf of this corporation, or appoint another person or persons to act as proxy or attorney in fact for this corporation with or without discretionary power and/or power of substitution, at any meeting of members or shareholders of any other corporation or organization in which this corporation has a membership or equity interest, or execute on behalf of this corporation a written action in lieu of any such meeting.
- Section 7.5 **Resident Agent.** The board of directors may appoint a resident agent upon whom legal process may be served in any action or proceeding against the corporation. Said resident agent shall be either an individual who is a resident of and has a business address in Massachusetts, a corporation organized under the laws of Massachusetts, or a corporation organized under the laws of any other state of the United States, which has qualified to do business in, and has an office in, Massachusetts.
- Section 7.6 **Corporate Records.** The original, or attested copies, of the Articles of Organization, Bylaws and records of all action by the members shall be kept in Massachusetts at the principal office of the corporation, or at an office of its clerk or resident agent, and shall be open at all reasonable times to the inspection of the members for any proper purpose.
- Section 7.7 **Articles of Organization.** All references in these Bylaws to the Articles of Organization shall be deemed to refer to the Articles of Organization of the corporation, as amended and in effect from time to time.
- Section 7.8 Amendments. The power to make, amend or repeal the Bylaws of the corporation shall be solely in the members, and the board of directors shall have no power to make, amend or repeal the Bylaws.
