

Note 1 - Organization and Significant Accounting Policies

Organization

Community Memorial Hospital, Inc. (Hospital) is a 16-bed acute care hospital and medical clinic located in Burke, South Dakota and a medical clinic located in Bonesteel, South Dakota. The hospital is organized as a South Dakota nonprofit corporation and is exempt from federal income tax.

Management services are provided to the Hospital by Winner Regional Healthcare Center and Sanford Regional Health Network under a management services agreement (Note 10).

Income Taxes

The Hospital is organized as a South Dakota nonprofit corporation and has been recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Service Code Section 501(c)(3). The Hospital is annually required to file a Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax (Form 990) with the IRS. In addition, the Hospital is subject to income tax on net income that is derived from business activities that are unrelated to its exempt purpose.

The Hospital believes that it has appropriate support for any tax positions taken affecting its annual filing requirements, and as such, does not have any uncertain tax positions that are material to the financial statements. The Hospital would recognize future accrued interest and penalties related to unrecognized tax benefits and liabilities in income tax expense if such interest and penalties are incurred.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include highly liquid investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

Patient Receivables

Patient receivables are uncollateralized customer and third-party payor obligations. Unpaid patient receivables, excluding amounts due from third-party payors, with invoice dates over 90 days old have interest assessed at 1.25 percent per month. Interest income is recognized at the time it is charged to the account.

Payments of patient receivables are allocated to the specific claims identified on the remittance advice or, if unspecified, are applied to the earliest unpaid claim.

The carrying amount of patient receivables is reduced by a valuation allowance that reflects management's estimate of amounts that will not be collected from patients and third-party payors. Management reviews patient receivables by payor class and applies percentages to determine estimated amounts that will not be collected from third parties under contractual agreements and amounts that will not be collected from patients due to bad debts. Management considers historical write off and recovery information in determining the estimated bad debt provision.

Notes Receivable

The notes receivable is stated at the principal amount plus accrued interest and is collateralized. Payments of notes receivable is allocated first to accrued and unpaid interest with the remainder to the outstanding principal balance. Management reviews the notes receivable periodically and estimates a portion, if any, of the balance that will not be collected.

Supplies

Supplies are stated at lower of cost (first-in, first-out) or market.

Interest Income

Interest income is included in revenues in excess of expenses unless the income or loss is restricted by donor or law

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment acquisitions in excess of \$5,000 are capitalized and recorded at cost. Depreciation is provided over the estimated useful life of each depreciable asset and is computed on the straight-line method. The estimated useful lives of property and equipment are as follows:

Land improvements	3-15 years
Buildings and improvements	5-30 years
Equipment	5-20 years

Gifts of long-lived assets such as land, buildings, or equipment are reported as unrestricted net assets, and are excluded from revenues in excess of expenses, unless explicit donor stipulations specify how the donated assets must be used. Gifts of long-lived assets with explicit restrictions that specify how the assets are to be used and gifts of cash or other assets that must be used to acquire long-lived assets are reported as restricted support. Absent explicit donor stipulations about how long those long-lived assets must be maintained, expirations of donor restrictions are reported when donated or when acquired long-lived assets are placed in service.

Temporarily and Permanently Restricted Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use by the Hospital has been limited by donors to a specific time period or purpose. Permanently restricted net assets have been restricted by donors to be maintained by the Hospital in perpetuity. At December 31, 2011 and 2010, the Hospital did not have any permanently restricted net assets.

Revenue in Excess of Expenses

Revenues in excess of expenses excludes unrealized gains and losses on investments other than trading securities, transfers of assets to and from related parties for other than goods and services, and contributions of long-lived assets, including assets acquired using contributions which were restricted by donors.

Net Patient Service Revenue

The Hospital has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the Hospital at amounts different from its established rates. Payment arrangements include reimbursed costs, discounted charges and per diem payments. Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payors, and others for services rendered, including estimated retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payors. Retroactive adjustments are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted in future periods as final settlements are determined.

Charity Care

The Hospital provides health care services to patients who meet certain criteria under its Charity Care Policy without charge or at amounts less than its established rates. Since the Hospital does not pursue collection of amounts, they are not reported as patient service revenue. The estimated cost of providing these services was \$11,000 and \$20,000 for the years ended December 31, 2011 and 2010, calculated by multiplying the ratio of cost to gross charges for the Hospital by the gross uncompensated charges associated with providing charity care to it patients.

Donor-Restricted Gifts

Unconditional promises to give cash and other assets are reported at fair value at the date the promise is received. Conditional promises to give and indications of intentions to give are reported at fair value at the date the gift is received. The gifts are reported as either temporarily or permanently restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When donor stipulated time restriction or purpose restrictions are met or accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified as unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of operations as net assets released from restrictions. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met within the same year as received are reflected as unrestricted contributions in the statements of operations.

Advertising Costs

The Hospital expenses advertising costs as incurred.

Reclassifications

Reclassifications have been made to the December 31, 2010 financial information to make it conform to the current year presentation. The reclassifications had no effect on previously reported operating results or changes in net assets.

Subsequent Events

The Hospital has evaluated subsequent events through April 18, 2012, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 2 - Net Patient Service Revenue

The Hospital has agreements with third-party payers that provide for payments to the Hospital at amounts different from its established rates. A summary of the payment arrangements with major third-party payers follows:

Medicare: The Hospital is licensed as a Critical Access Hospital (CAH). The Hospital is reimbursed for most acute care services at cost plus one percent with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Hospital and are subject to audits thereof by the Medicare intermediary. The Hospital's Medicare cost reports have been audited by the Medicare fiscal intermediary through the year ended December 31, 2009. Clinical services are paid on a cost basis or fixed fee schedule.

Medicare – **Clinic:** The Burke clinic is designated as a Certified Provider Based Rural Health Clinic by the Medicare program. As a result, clinical services rendered to Medicare program beneficiaries are reimbursed at cost based on a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of the Hospital's annual cost reports and audits thereof by the Medicare fiscal intermediary.

Medicaid: Inpatient acute care services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries are paid on a percentage of charges basis. These rates currently are 95% for inpatient and 90% for outpatient. Clinical services are paid on a fixed fee schedule or on a cost related basis for rural health clinic services.

Blue Cross: Services rendered to Blue Cross subscribers are reimbursed under a prospectively determined percentage of charges methodology.

The Hospital has also entered into payment agreements with certain commercial insurance carriers and other organizations. The basis for payment to the Organization under these agreements includes prospectively determined rates per discharge, discounts from established charges, and prospectively determined daily rates.

Revenue from the Medicare and Medicaid programs accounted for approximately 67.2% and 9.1% of the Hospital's net patient service revenue for the year ended December 31, 2011 and 69.7% and 7.1% for the year ended December 31, 2010. Laws and regulations governing the Medicare, Medicaid, and other programs are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. As a result, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates will change by a material amount in the near term.

In 2011 and 2010, net assets were released from donor restrictions by incurring expenditures satisfying the restricted purposes in the amounts of \$23,580 and \$11,700. These amounts are included in net assets released from restrictions in the accompanying financial statements.

Note 7 - Pension Plan

The Hospital has a defined contribution pension plan under which employees become participants upon reaching age 21, completion of one year of service and work a minimum of 1,000 hours per year. Employer contributions of 3 percent for 2011 and 2 percent for 2010 of annual compensation are deposited with the plan trustee who invests the plan assets. Total pension expense for the years ended December 31, 2011 and 2010, was \$41,025 and \$26,219.

Note 8 - Concentration of Credit Risk

The Hospital grants credit without collateral to its patients, most of whom are insured under third-party payor agreements. The mix of receivables from third-party payors and patients at December 31, 2011 and 2010, was as follows:

The Hospital's cash balances are maintained in various bank deposit accounts. At times, the balances of these deposits may be in excess of federally insured limits.

Note 9 - Functional Expenses

Note 10 - Contingencies

Equipment Purchases

The Hospital ordered equipment related to the Sanford One Chart system conversion which was not received until after December 31, 2011. The total purchase commitment outstanding for the equipment totaled \$18,731.

Management Agreements

The Hospital's management agreement with Winner Regional Healthcare Center and Sanford Regional Health Network (Sanford) to manage the Hospital and provide certain management advisory services expired on March 31, 2010. On April 1, 2010, the Hospital entered into a similar agreement with Sanford Health Network. On March 22, 2011, the agreement was amended to add information system services. The agreement shall continue through July 31, 2022; however either party may cancel this agreement without cause by providing 180 days written notice. Under the terms of the management agreements, the Hospital is to reimburse Sanford for the salary and benefits of the Hospital's Chief Executive Officer, who is an employee of Sanford, plus an annual base amount which totaled \$35,761 and \$36,139 for the years ended December 31, 2011 and 2010, for management services provided. The information system fees were not incurred during 2011.

Malpractice Insurance

The Hospital has malpractice insurance coverage to provide protection for professional liability losses on a claims-made basis subject to a limit of \$1 million per claim and an annual aggregate limit of \$3 million. Should the claims-made policy not be renewed or replaced with equivalent insurance, claims based on occurrences during its term, but reported subsequently, will be uninsured.

Litigations, Claims, and Other Disputes

The Hospital is subject to the usual contingencies in the normal course of operations relating to the performance of its tasks under its various programs. In the opinion of management, the ultimate settlement of litigation, claims, and disputes in process will not be material to the financial position of the Hospital.

The health care industry is subject to numerous laws and regulations of federal, state, and local governments. Compliance with these laws and regulations, specifically those relating to the Medicare and Medicaid programs, can be subject to government review and interpretation, as well as regulatory actions unknown and unasserted at this time. Federal government activity has increased with respect to investigations and allegations concerning possible violations by health care providers of regulations, which could result in the imposition of significant fines and penalties, as well as significant repayments of previously billed and collected revenues from patient and resident services.
