Note 1: Nature of Operations and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of Operations

Olathe Medical Center, Inc ("OMCI") operates an acute care hospital in Olathe, Kansas OMCI primarily earns revenues by providing inpatient, outpatient, emergency care, hospice and home health care services to residents in Johnson County and Miami County, Kansas and the surrounding area OMCI is controlled by Olathe Health System, Inc ("OHSI"), its sole member

OMCI is the sole member of Miami County Medical Center, Inc ("MCMCI"). Olathe Medical Services, Inc ("OMSI"). Olathe Medical Center Charitable Foundation ("OMCCF") and Health Access, Inc ("HAI") All of the entities are collectively referred to as the "System" in the accompanying consolidated financial statements

MCMCI is an acute care hospital located in Paola, Kansas, and earns revenue by providing inpatient, outpatient and emergency care services to patients in Miami and Linn County. Kansas, and the surrounding area

OMSI provides physician services in various clinic locations within its service area

OMCCF was organized for the purpose of providing support services to advance or support the provision of health care services for the System's not-for-profit entities and the communities in which they serve

HAI is a provider-sponsored organization that contracts with other health care providers, insurers and consumers in the System's service area in order to increase the quality and efficiency of health care services for their community. HAI was dissolved as a Kansas Corporation on December 30, 2011

Principles of Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements include the accounts of OMCI and its controlled subsidiaries. Olathe Medical Services, Inc., Miami County Medical Center, Inc., Olathe Medical Center Charitable Foundation and Health Access, Inc. All significant intercompany accounts and transactions have been eliminated in consolidation.

Investment in and Advances to Affiliates

OMCI has an investment in Cedar Lake Village, which operates an assisted living, senior housing and skilled nursing facility located on OMCI's campus This investment is reported using the equity method of accounting

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2011 and 2010

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates

Excess of Revenues Over Expenses

The consolidated statements of operations include excess of revenues over expenses. Changes in unrestricted net assets which are excluded from excess of revenues over expenses, consistent with industry practice, include unrealized gains and losses on investments other than trading securities, the change in fair value of highly effective interest rate swap agreements, permanent transfers to and from affiliates for other than goods and services and contributions of long-lived assets to be used in providing health care services (including assets acquired using contributions which, by donor restriction, were to be used for the purpose of acquiring such assets)

Temporarily and Permanently Restricted Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use by the System has been limited by donors to a specific time period or purpose. Permanently restricted net assets have been restricted by donors to be maintained by the System in perpetuity.

Temporarily restricted net assets are available primarily for specific program and department activities and the purchase of equipment and buildings at December 31, 2011 and 2010

During 2011 and 2010, net assets were released from donor restrictions by satisfying the restricted purposes in the amounts of \$56,984 and \$173,999, respectively

Net Patient Service Revenue

The System has agreements with third-party payers that provide for payments to the System at amounts different from established rates. Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payers and others for services rendered and includes estimated retroactive revenue adjustments. Retroactive adjustments are considered in the recognition of revenue on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and such estimated amounts are revised in future periods, as adjustments become known. Laws and regulations governing Medicare and Medicaid are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. Compliance with such laws and regulations are subject to government review and interpretation as well as significant regulatory action, including fines, penalties and exclusion from the Medicare and Medicaid programs. As a result, there is a possibility that the recorded estimates may change by a material amount in the near term.

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2011 and 2010

Cash Equivalents

The System considers all liquid investments, other than those limited as to use, with original maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents. At December 31, 2011 and 2010, cash equivalents consisted primarily of money market accounts

Patient Accounts Receivable

The System reports patient accounts receivable for services rendered at net realizable amounts from third-party payers, patients and others. The System provides an allowance for doubtful accounts based upon a review of outstanding receivables, historical collection information and existing economic conditions. The System bills third-party payers directly and bills the patient when the patient's liability is determined. Patient accounts receivable are due when billed. Accounts are considered delinquent and subsequently written off as bad debts based on credit evaluation and specific circumstances of the account.

For receivables associated with services provided to patients who have third-party coverage, the System analyzes contractually due amounts and provides an allowance for doubtful accounts and a provision for bad debts, if necessary (for example, for expected uncollectible deductibles and copayments on accounts for which the third-party payer has not yet paid, or for payers who are known to be having financial difficulties that make the realization of amounts due unlikely)

For receivables associated with self-pay patients (which includes both patients without insurance and patients with deductible and copayment balances due for which third-party coverage exists for part of the bill), the System records a significant provision for bad debts in the period of service on the basis of its past experience, which indicates that many patients are unable or unwilling to pay the portion of their bill for which they are financially responsible. The difference between the standard rates (or the discounted rates if negotiated or provided by policy) and the amounts actually collected after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against the allowance for doubtful accounts.

Assets Limited as to Use

Assets limited as to use include (1) assets held by bond trustees. (2) assets restricted by donors, and (3) assets set aside by the Board of Trustees for future capital improvements over which the Board retains control and may at its discretion subsequently use for other purposes. Amounts required to meet current liabilities of the System are included in current assets.

Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements December 31, 2011 and 2010

Investments and Investment Return

Investments in equity securities having a readily determinable fair value are carried at fair value. Other investments are valued at the lower of cost (or fair value at the time of donation, if acquired by contribution) or fair value. Investment return includes dividend, interest and other investment income, realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments carried at fair value, and realized gains and losses on other investments. Other investment return is reflected in the consolidated statements of operations and changes in net assets as unrestricted, temporarily restricted or permanently restricted based upon the existence and nature of any donor or legally imposed restrictions. The investment in Cedar Lake Village is reported on the equity method of accounting.

Supplies

The System states supply inventories at average cost for perpetual inventories and last purchase price for non-perpetual inventories

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and depreciated on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful life of each asset Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the respective estimated useful lives

Donations of property and equipment are reported at fair market value as an increase in unrestricted net assets unless use of the assets is restricted by the donor. Monetary gifts that must be used to acquire property and equipment are reported as restricted support. The expiration of such restrictions is reported as an increase in unrestricted net assets when the donated asset is placed in service.

Estimated Self-Insurance Costs

The provision for estimated self-insured employee health, dental and workers' compensation claims includes estimates of the ultimate costs for both reported claims and claims incurred but not reported, including related administrative costs

Estimated self-insurance costs also include amounts for estimates related to medical malpractice and general liability claims which are covered by insurance

Charity Care and Uncompensated Costs

The System's mission is to improve the health of all individuals in the communities we serve by providing compassionate, quality healthcare in an environment of trust and collaboration. The System provides health care to individuals who have inadequate resources to afford the services, are uninsured or underinsured or participate in governmental health programs for the poor or disabled.

Uncompensated care to the poor includes the cost of providing care to patients who meet the guidelines of the System's charity care program and the cost of providing care in excess of reimbursement to participants in the Medicaid program and other indigent public programs such as free clinics. The uncompensated care provided to the community under these programs in 2011 and 2010 are as follows.

Charity care is not included in net patient service revenue. In addition to the above programs, the System grants discounts for uninsured individuals who do not qualify for the charity care program. Discounts for services are excluded from net patient revenues.

In addition to providing uncompensated care for patients in need, the system provides other health care related benefits to the communities it serves by subsidizing health care services, as well as providing 24-hour emergency rooms open every day to the public regardless of ability to pay. The System also provides education for a variety of medical professionals, health care screenings, educational programs, and support group sponsorships. The cost of providing these community benefit services is reported on Schedule H of the System's IRS Form 990.

Income Tax Status

Olathe Medical Center, Inc , Olathe Medical Services, Inc , Miami County Medical Center, Inc and Olathe Medical Center Charitable Foundation are not-for-profit organizations within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and are exempt from taxes on their business income

HAI is considered a for-profit corporation for federal income tax purposes

The System is no longer subject to U S federal, state and local income tax examinations by tax authorities for years before 2007

Insurance and Litigation

Medical malpractice insurance is purchased under claims-made policies. Under these policies, only claims made and reported to the insurer that occurred subsequent to July 1, 1976 are covered during the policy term. Under Kansas law, the Kansas Insurance Department provides excess liability insurance through the Kansas Healthcare Stabilization Fund. Excess liability insurance coverage is also purchased under a claims-made policy. Under this policy, only claims made and reported to the insurer that occurred subsequent to January 2, 1985 are covered during the policy term.

The System accrues the expense of its share of asserted and unasserted claims occurring during the year by estimating the probable ultimate cost of any such claim. Such estimates are based on the System's own claims experience. The System's management does not expect any claims to exceed the insurance coverage limits. However, because of the risk involved in providing health care services, it is possible an event has occurred that will be the basis of a future material claim. In the normal course of business, the System is, from time to time, subject to allegations that may or do result in litigation. Some of these allegations are in areas not covered by the System's commercial insurance. The System evaluates such allegations by conducting investigations to determine the validity of each potential claim. Based upon the advice of counsel, management records an estimate of the amount of ultimate expected loss, if any, for each of these matters. Events could occur that would cause the estimate of ultimate loss to differ materially in the near term.

In 2011, the System adopted the provisions of Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2010-24. Health Care Entities (Topic 954) Presentation of Insurance Claims and Related Insurance Recoveries, which eliminates the practice of netting claim liabilities with expected insurance recoveries for balance sheet presentation. Claim liabilities are to be determined without consideration of insurance recoveries. Expected recoveries are presented separately. Prior to the adoption of ASU 2010-24, accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America required a health care provider to accrue only an estimate of the malpractice claims costs for both reported claims and claims incurred but not reported where the risk of loss had not been transferred to a financially viable insurer. There was no material impact of the ASU adoption to the System's financial statements.

Based upon the System's claims experience, an accrual had been made for the System's portion of medical malpractice and general liability costs related to its deductible under its malpractice and general liability insurance policies, amounting to approximately \$785,000 and \$225,000 as of December 31, 2011 and 2010, respectively. These amounts are included in estimated self-insurance costs on the accompanying Consolidated Balance Sheets. It is reasonably possible that this estimate could change materially in the near term.

Contributions

Unconditional promises to give cash and other assets are accrued at estimated fair value at the date each promise is received. Unconditional gifts expected to be collected within one year are reported at their net realizable value. Unconditional gifts expected to be collected in future years are initially reported at fair value determined using the discounted present value of estimated future cash flows technique. The gifts are reported as either temporarily or permanently restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reported as net assets released from restriction. Receipt of contributions that are conditional are reported as liabilities until the condition is eliminated or the contributed assets are returned to the donor.

Deferred Financing Costs

Deferred financing costs represent bond issuance costs incurred in connection with the Health Facilities Revenue Bonds. Costs associated with the debt outstanding for each year are being amortized over the term of the respective bond issue using the bonds outstanding method.

Bond Premiums (Discount)

The bond premiums and discount arose from the issuance of the Health Facilities Revenue Bonds. Series 2000A. Series 2008A. Series 2008B and Series 2010A and, when combined, result in a net bond premium. This unamortized net bond premium is recorded as an adjustment of long-term debt in the accompanying consolidated financial statements. The bond premiums and discount are being amortized over the life of the related bonds using the bonds outstanding method.

Derivative Financial Instruments

As a strategy to maintain an acceptable level of exposure to the risk of changes in future cash flows due to interest rate fluctuations, the System entered into interest rate swap agreements for a portion of its floating rate debt in September 2002 and July 2004. The 2002 agreement provides for the System to receive interest from the counterparty at 70% of LIBOR and to pay interest to the counterparty at a fixed rate of 3.18% on notional amounts of \$13,760,000 at December 31, 2010. The notional amount declines annually. The 2004 agreement provides for the System to receive interest from the counterparty at 70% of LIBOR and to pay interest to the counterparty at a fixed rate of 3.83% on notional amounts of \$5,225,000 at December 31, 2010. The notional amount declines annually. The Bonds under which the swap agreements were initiated were fully refunded and redeemed during 2008 but the swaps remain in place and as such became disconnected to the debt and are now treated as investments. At the date of refunding, the cumulative loss in fair value of the swap agreements (recorded in Unrestricted Net Assets) was \$639,305 and until the swap agreements were terminated in 2011, this amount was being amortized through the scheduled termination date of the swap agreements in 2016 and 2024. For the year ended December 31, 2010, amortization of the loss in fair value at the date of refunding of \$60,019 has been recorded as

an unrealized loss in fair value of interest rate swap agreements in Other Income (Expense) on the accompanying Consolidated Statements of Operations—At December 31, 2010, the unamortized cumulative loss in fair value of the swap agreements (recorded in Unrestricted Net Assets) at the date of refunding was \$476,975 and at December 31, 2011, this amount was included in the loss from termination of interest rate swap due to the swap settlement payment on March 28, 2011 as discussed below

Under the swap agreements, the System pays or receives interest amounts monthly and, as the swap is classified as an investment, payments of interest of \$98,984 in 2011 and \$598,010 in 2010 are included in net realized gain on sale of investments in Other Income (Expense) on the accompanying Consolidated Statements of Operations

The changes in the fair value of such agreements since the date of refunding of the debt are recorded as unrealized gain or loss in fair value of interest rate swap agreements in Other Income (Expense) on the accompanying Consolidated Statements of Operations—For the years ended December 31, 2011 and 2010, a change in fair value of \$1,115,078 and \$(366,016), respectively, was recorded for the derivative instruments—At December 31, 2010, the fair value of the swap agreements was a liability of \$1,592,053, recorded in deferred liabilities on the accompanying Consolidated Balance Sheets

On March 28, 2011, the 2002A and 2004A swap agreements were terminated resulting in a settlement payment of \$1,431,100. This loss on termination of interest rate swap is included in Other Income (Expense) on the accompanying Consolidated Statements of Operations. The 2011 change in fair value of the interest rate swap agreements of \$1,115,078 represents the cumulative unrealized losses from the prior periods change in fair value of the interest rate swap agreements which reversed in 2011 due to the settlement payment of the swaps

Variable Rate Bonds and Related Agreements

OMCI has issued daily variable rate demand bonds as part of the 2008C bond issue and the 2010B bond issue (*see Note 6*) As part of the indenture agreement. OMCI entered into a remarketing agreement to remarket the bonds on a daily basis OMCI also entered into a Letter of Credit and Reimbursement Agreement (LOC) with a bank to purchase bonds that are tendered but not remarketed. Under the LOC, the Letter of Credit is a direct obligation of the bank to pay to the Trustee until such time as the bonds are remarketed. The current LOC expires October 29, 2015.

Note 2: Net Patient Service Revenue

The System has agreements with third-party payers that provide for payments at amounts different from established rates. These payment arrangements include

- Medicare. Inpatient acute care and outpatient services rendered to Medicare Program beneficiaries are paid at prospectively determined rates. These rates vary according to a patient classification system that is based on clinical, diagnostic and other factors
- Medicaid. Inpatient hospital and outpatient services rendered to Medicaid patients are reimbursed at prospectively determined rates
- Other Third-Party Payers. The System has entered into payment agreements with certain commercial insurance carriers, health maintenance organizations and preferred provider organizations. The basis for payment under these agreements includes prospectively determined rates per discharge, discounts from established charges, case rates, fee schedules and prospectively determined daily rates.
- Uninsured. The System provides discounts from charges for patients who do not have health insurance coverage and also provides assistance to those who qualify for the System's charity care program

Approximately 31% of net patient service revenues are from participation in the Medicare and state-sponsored Medicaid programs for the years ended December 31, 2011 and 2010

The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) approved an amendment to the Kansas Medicaid State Plan that incorporates legislation enacted by the Kansas State Legislature establishing an annual tax assessment on certain hospital providers and health maintenance organizations and created the Health Care Access Improvement Fund The System's tax assessment for both 2011 and 2010 was approximately \$1.280,200 and is included in expenses in the consolidated statements of operations

Debt Service Fund – This account contains the required lease payments for interest and principal payments on bonds

Debt Service Reserve Fund – This account is to be funded only in the event that certain financial ratio requirements are not met. No funding was required at December 31, 2011 and 2010

Project Fund – This account includes the proceeds of bond issues to be used for qualified capital expenditures

The System issued \$16,000,000 of Fixed Rate Mode Series 2010A Health Facilities Revenue Bonds and \$16,000,000 of Daily Rate Mode Series 2010B Variable Rate Demand Health Facilities Revenue Bonds during 2010 \$10,940,000 of the proceeds of the 2010B Bonds are being used to acquire, install, construct and/or equip medical equipment and other ongoing capital expenditures at or adjacent to the System campus. The balance of the proceeds of the 2010B Bonds and all of the proceeds of the 2010A Bonds, were used by the System to refund and redeem \$20,835,000 of its 2000A Bonds. This refinancing resulted in a Loss from Extinguishment of Debt in 2010 of \$682,951, which is recorded in Other Income (Expense) in the accompanying Consolidated Statement of Operations.

The System has available lines of credit totaling \$4,895,000 and expiring throughout 2012 subject to renewal. The purpose of the lines are for financing working capital requirements and possible funding of self-insured workers compensation and unemployment claims. At December 31, 2011 and 2010, there were no amounts outstanding on these agreements.

Note 7: Concentration of Credit Risk

The operations of the System are primarily located in Johnson County and Miami County. Kansas The System grants credit without collateral to its patients, most of whom are area residents and are insured under third-party payer agreements. Note 11: Fair Value of Financial Instruments

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 820, Fair Value Measurements, defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Topic 820 also specifies a fair value hierarchy which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The standard describes three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value.

- Level 1 Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities
- Level 2 Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities
- Level 3 Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets and liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis and recognized in the accompanying consolidated balance sheets, as well as the general classification of such assets and liabilities pursuant to the valuation hierarchy

Investments and Financial Instruments Included in Cash

Where quoted market prices are available in an active market, securities are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. Level 1 securities include exchange traded equity securities and money market mutual funds. If quoted market prices are not available, then fair values are estimated by using pricing models, quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics or discounted cash flows. Level 2 securities include institutional pooled finds.

Interest Rate Swap Agreement

The fair value is estimated using inputs that are observable or that can be corroborated by observable market data and, therefore, are classified within Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy

The fair value of other long-term debt is estimated using discounted cash flow analyses, based on the System's current incremental borrowing rates for similar types of borrowing arrangements. The carrying amount of long-term debt approximates its fair value.

Note 12: Related Party Transactions

In 2011 and 2010, OMCI had transfers to OHSI, the sole member of OMCI, of \$28,293 and \$29,114, respectively

At December 31, 2011 and 2010, Cedar Lake Village, Inc (CLVI), an equity investee, had outstanding loan balances to OMCI of \$3,757,624 and \$3,897,375, respectively, at an interest rate of 7%, subordinated with a bank as part of a letter-of-credit arrangement. Semiannual interest payments and annual principal payments are required with the final payment on the loan due in December 2026.

Note 13: Subsequent Events

On February 28, 2012, the System issued \$19,865,000 of Fixed Rate Mode Series 2012A Health Facilities Revenue Bonds and \$15,525,000 of Long-Term Rate Mode Series 2012B Health Facilities Revenue Bonds. The proceeds from the bond issuances are being used to refund and redeem \$36,400,000 of the Series 2008A Bonds. The 2012A Bonds mature serially at varying amounts through September 2030, semi-annual interest payments at rates ranging from 3 00% to 5 00%, and are collateralized by System revenues. The 2012B Bonds are subject to scheduled mandatory redemption commencing on September 1, 2031, in each year through September 1, 2037, with a mandatory tender of the Bonds on March 1, 2017, with semiannual interest payments at 2 00% through the tender date.

Subsequent events have been evaluated through the date of the Independent Accountants' Report, which is the date the financial statements were issued
