The research and studies have established a number of scientifically validated best management practices (BMP's) for ecosystem carbon management that, if applied globally, could have far-reaching beneficial effects on our planet and its climate. The work has spawned, among other things, a local pilot program to enhance soil carbon through application of organic soil amendments as a means to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from landfills, enhance the carbon capture capacity of managed ecosystems, and mitigate GHG emissions from new development projects.

The purpose of CCI is to teach and disseminate educational material to the public, including but not limited to, developing and replicating working models and strategies which produce our food, fuel, and fiber while providing technical and economic support for agricultural practices that positively impact Earth's carbon cycles and climate.
