

Mission: To develop a vision of how to achieve a democracy based on respect for every vote and every voice, FairVote researches, develops and highlights policies designed to increase voter participation, meaningful ballot choices and fair representation. We study elections and electoral rules, develop educational resources, convene strategic conferences, write extensively about our proposals, and engage with reformers, thought leaders and journalists.

Statement of Program Service Accomplishments

FairVote's program work in 2011 had a valuable impact on public understanding of the affect of electoral rules on our core value of promoting respect for every vote and every voice. This review of our program activities is organized within our three areas of focus, and compares our specific goals and projected indicators of success with actual outcomes.

- Fair Elections, including our work on presidential elections and alternatives to traditional plurality voting and runoff systems
- Fair Representation, including our work on proportional voting and balanced representation of our diversity of people and opinion
- Fair Access to Participation, including our projects on the right to vote, voter turnout and learning democracy initiative

Within these three areas of focus we engage in research, analysis, communications, education and advocacy. Here are highlights of our program work in 2011.

Fair Elections: Americans should have elections that: accommodate meaningful voter choice; create incentives for higher voter participation by making every vote equally meaningful; and enable voters to hold their elected officials more accountable by upholding majority rule. In 2011, our projects in this area of focus included:

- Engaging in extensive public education through research, media and new materials about the National Popular Vote plan for president and focusing attention on how the current Electoral College rules lead to most Americans being ignored in elections;
- Researching presidential nomination processes and proposing reforms to promote more participation;
- Establishing ranked choice voting (RCV, or "instant runoff voting") as a means to broaden voter choice and uphold majority rule, through research, education, advocacy (instantrunoff.com) and implementation assistance;
- Researching alternatives to RCV such as forms of the Top Two primary proposal adopted by voters in Washington State and California in recent years.

Spotlight: Research and Education on Presidential Elections: One of our era's most important electoral reform movements is the effort to have states join together in the National Popular Vote plan for president (NPV) to guarantee election of the presidential candidate who wins the national popular vote in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. By the end of 2011, the proposal had been backed by more than 2,000 legislators and been signed into law in states representing nearly half of the electoral votes necessary to enact it in the next election.

FairVote helped develop the National Popular Vote plan and has played a key role in introducing it to civic leaders and journalists. Its director was co-author of *Every Vote Equal*, the book detailing the proposal and addressing questions about it. In 2011 we were effective in explaining the proposal and researching problems with states' current laws to allocate electoral votes.

We regularly engaged in research with journalists and civic leaders interested in understanding presidential elections. We write several commentaries about the NPV proposal, including in 2011 in *Politico* and *Huffington Post* to explain to readers the significance of the plan's passage in California and Vermont. Our writings in publications and on our website highlight our research into how the presidential campaigns in the 2008 general election campaign devoted more than 98% of campaign resources and events to 15 states representing barely a third of Americans.

FairVote also enhanced understanding of the flaws in an alternative reform proposal. Frustrated by how Pennsylvania's close elections for years had resulted in all of Pennsylvania's electoral votes going to the same party, Pennsylvania's governor and key legislative leaders in 2011 indicated that the backed Pennsylvania allocating electoral votes by congressional district. FairVote had researched this proposal in the past and identified serious problems with its fairness. Executive director Rob Richie was invited to submit extensive written testimony to the state about the plan in which we clearly and objectively compared different approaches to reforming the Electoral College. In addition, Richie had a commentary in *The Nation* about the proposal. The proposal ultimately was not pursued.

In addition, FairVote researchers and interns in 2011 produced an ongoing series of about a dozen valuable research projects with important insights into presidential elections, including: updated analysis contrasting the state source of campaign contributions to presidential candidates with how that money was spent in the general elections; how states' current rules were leading to relative declines of turnout in most rural western states; how rural voters across the nation are disproportionately concentrated in "spectator states" that do not receive attention in presidential elections; and how patterns of neglect and attention have evolved in states over recent decades and the impact on voter turnout.

Spotlight Assistance with implementation and consideration of instant runoff voting. FairVote is widely recognized as the leading national authority on instant runoff voting (IRV, or "ranked choice voting"). IRV is a sensible voting method designed to accommodate increased voter choice in elections. It has drawn the support of many civic leaders and major politicians over the years, including both President Barack Obama and Sen. John McCain. Since 2002 it has been adopted in more than a dozen American cities, including Minneapolis (MN), San Francisco (CA), Memphis (TN) and Oakland (CA).

In 2010, voters in Maine's largest city of Portland had adopted IRV for mayoral elections. In the

fall of 2011, 15 candidates ran for mayor in this first-ever use of IRV. FairVote was an early and ongoing resource to city election officials preparing for the city's first use of IRV, and also was in touch regularly with local civic leaders like the League of Women Voters and *Portland Press Herald*. We created a simple flyer about the system that was printed as an ad in a local weekly and that was distributed by the thousands directly to voters. A FairVote staff member was on hand for direct assistance as well, conducted an exit survey on voters' reactions to the system during early voting and was a helpful resource to journalists and civic leaders during the election and subsequent ballot count.

Ultimately Portland's voter turnout was much higher than anticipated, more than 99.8% of voters cast valid ballots and more voters decided to rank al 15 candidates than only vote for one. The previously skeptical daily newspaper praised the election and the voting system, and the winner was widely seen as the strongest candidate and well-prepared for his new position.

In 2011, IRV also was used for the first time for a competitive election for mayor in San Francisco. FairVote was active before the election in providing information to journalist and after the election engaged in intensive study of the results and outreach about how voters handled the system, with local civic leaders using much of our research at the website SFBetterElections.com. This research and outreach not only increased public understanding of the election, but helped prepare San Francisco and three other Bay Area cities for their next round of IRV elections in 2012.

Telluride (CO) used IRV for the first time in mayoral elections in 2011, and FairVote had regular conversations with city election officials and others in the city about implementation options and voter education materials.

We also created new materials and multi-media presentations about IRV that were showcased on instantrunoff.com, FairVote.org and IRVFactcheck.com. FairVote revamped and improved the website *OscarVotes123.com* on the use of IRV in selection of the "Best Picture" Oscar. Students continued to show their interest in IRV, with our resources helpful to some 60 colleges and universities that now use IRV for student elections. New schools that adopted IRV in 20101 included Boise State and Washington State, with FairVote a resource to student leaders.

In addition, a FairVote legal intern from Yale Law School did an excellent report on the proposal to have military and other overseas voters use IRV ballots in elections where, due to runoff elections taking place soon after the first round of voting, these voters might not otherwise be able to participate. Already done in Louisiana, Arkansas and South Carolina in federal primary elections, this practice was used for the first time in Illinois localities in 2011. FairVote legal interns and staff also did valuable work explaining in detail the unanimous ruling of a ninth circuit panel unanimously upholding use of IRV in San Francisco elections.

We also studied the impact of traditional runoff elections on voter turnout, issuing a detailed report about how more than 95% of the last 150 federal primary runoffs had to lower turnout and about factors within runoff laws that might increate or mitigate those turnout declines. Our work was highlighted by electionline.org and featured in our oped on North Carolina that ran in four papers, including the *Charlotte Observer*.

Fair Representation: National, state and local legislatures ideally should fully reflect our nation's diversity, grounded in like-minded voters earning representation in proportion to their share of the vote. Our 2011 work in this area included:

- Engaging with community leaders and organizations to explain choice voting and other alternative voting methods as a remedy for Voting Rights Act cases;
- Pursuing public education about proportional voting systems, ranging from helping students review their elections on campus to introducing these systems as alternatives to contentious redistricting in states to writing about elections overseas;
- Conducting extensive analysis of 2011 redistricting, associated litigation and its impact on minority voting rights.

The year 2011 was particularly notable in American politics for the fact that congressional, state and local redistricting took place around the country. FairVote was particularly active in generating and sharing resources about redistricting and alternatives to current redistricting methods in 2011. For example:

- We published extensive resources on redistricting at a special page devoted to the subject at FairVote.org, including detailed analyses of the first wave of litigation about redistricting plans.
- We published a new report on the history and use of Section Five of the Voting Rights Act, the preclearance provision that often plays a role in redistricting cases.
- We developed and shared information on fair voting alternatives to winner-take-all districts, including widely circulated and discussed plans for California and Maryland. The Maryland plan was shared on the floor of the state senate and featured in a commentary co-authored by FairVote's director in the *Baltimore Sun*.
- We wrote commentaries about fair voting alternatives to current approaches to redistricting that appeared in leading newspapers around the country, including the *Christian Science Monitor, Roll Call* and ones developed specifically for Missouri, North Carolina, Ohio and Virginia.

FairVote also updated its guide to alternatives to winner-take-all voting systems that will help more communities consider proportional voting and developed, and we added new content on the subject at our website FairVote.org. FairVote also had a number of blogposts on the use of fair voting systems in the United States and overseas. On the latter, we did a number of pieces about the "Arab Spring," their efforts to establish fair elections and the importance of using forms of proportional representation in their elections.

Two of our six legal interns in the summer of 201 spent most of their internship developing templates for model amicus briefs to be ready to use in voting rights cases in which alternatives voting systems are introduced by one of the parties in the case. Their work, since reviewed and improved by FairVote's legal staff and allies, will be extremely helpful to judges and

jurisdictions considering alternatives to winner take all elections.

We regularly are asked to speak to groups and campuses about our reform proposals. In December 2011, FairVote's director Rob Richie was brought to Yale Law School to talk to students engaged in projects about alternative voting systems.

Fair Access to Participation: All Americans should have equal access to voting, grounded in policies that anticipate and encourage participation and a clear constitutional guarantee of the right to vote. We support expanded suffrage rights, universal voter registration and secure, transparent and accountable election administration. Our 2011 projects in this area included:

- Researching and providing information on youth voter pre-registration, our increasingly popular proposal that young adults be allowed to pre-register upon turning sixteen and be automatically added to the rolls upon reaching voting age;
- Improving our *Learning Democracy* curriculum on voting and democracy and conducting field research that tested the efficacy of the program on voter turnout of young eligible voters;
- Researching voter turnout and updating our widely-used website resources on turnout in the United States and other nations;
- Publishing a series of blogs and commentaries by our legal fellows Jo McKeegan and Else Helgesen about legal issues associated with the right to vote, including an important analysis of how state provisions protecting the right to vote led state courts may result in upholding the right to vote with greater level of scrutiny than federal courts.

General activity – work with young people: One of the ongoing values of FairVote is to provide a place for young people to learn more about their democracy and ideas for improving it. We have a vital intern program, taking interns throughout the year. In 2011, some two dozen volunteer interns engaged in substantive projects in our office and had regular opportunities to hear from speakers who come to FairVote. We also arrange for meetings outside the office, including meetings in 2011 with a Member of Congress and the head of the Department of Justice's civil rights division.
