We are the collective power of people working toward long-term solutions. Together, we create long-lasting community change by addressing underlying causes of the most significant local issues. We feel that opportunities for a better life are created by focusing on key areas such as helping children and youth achieve their potential, improving people's health, supporting citizens with special needs, and those who are aging. We believe that we all have a responsibility to help others in order to make our community a better place in which to live, work and raise families. Because underneath everything we are, underneath everything we do, we are all connected. When we reach out a hand to one, we influence the condition of all. We all win when a child succeeds in school, when a family becomes financially stable and when people have good health. Together we can inspire hope and create opportunities for a better tomorrow.

#### Organizational Highlights

Financially, UWFC finished out the year with a 10.3% increase in campaign income over the previous year. The Board of Directors and Staff continue to be guarded with spending like most United Way's across the nation. Our communities across America are suffering from a rise in human service needs and diminishing donations. Our conservative spending over the years and recognition that having a reserve will support our United Way programs through this tough economy. We had approximately 5,100 donors to our campaign. 88% of our pledges come from employees of corporations and corporate gifts. The other 12% of our pledges come from employees of schools, local government entities, professionals and individuals as well as small business owners.

#### Community Investment and Community Impact Highlights

Our United Way held 3 nonprofit seminars this year. The training was specific to officers of nonprofit boards; Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer as well as fraud prevention in nonprofits and grant writing. Our goal is to build the capacity of nonprofits in the community and encourage their success.

In 2011, United Way of Forsyth County invested \$1,291,154 in almost 60 health and human service agencies and programs. The dollars given reach all areas of our community. From the young to the old, the sick to the healthy, the employed to the unemployed, those with homes to those without, United Way dollars are making dreams come true. With the help of partners in the community, the organization is working hard to make a difference each day in our community! Our vision is to be a community where all people have the opportunity to engage, thrive and achieve a better quality of life. Areas of focus are:

Substance Abuse/Mental Health/Domestic Violence Services (11%)
Promoting Self-Sufficiency/Strengthening Families and Seniors (24%)
Therapeutic Services for At-Risk Children & Youth (17%)
Promoting Community Health, Safety, Leadership, Information & Referral Nonprofit Education (17%)
Services for Citizens with Special Needs (6%)
Strength-Based Support Services for Children & Youth (21%)
Miscellaneous designations outside our county (4%)

We collaborated with the Forsyth County School nurses and the volunteer efforts of local dentists to provide over 100 at-risk students with free dental services, including screenings, x-rays and cleanings.

The FamilyWize prescription cards were introduced into both Forsyth and Dawson Counties with great success in 2008. In 2011, over 6,400 FamilyWize claims were filed in Forsyth County for a savings of \$84,414.14. Dawson County had over 10,500 claims filed for a savings of \$120,266.86. This prescription card program helps those without insurance save on prescription costs.

Referrals to 2-1-1 totaled 1,110. Utility assistance accounted for 23.3% of the calls, mortgage/rent payment assistance accounted for 18.1% and 11.6% of the calls were for food. The Community Helplist distribution was 5,500 English Help lists and 1,250 Spanish Help lists. United Way and the Cumming Post Office teamed up for the Letter Carriers Food Drive in May. Approximately 26,000 lbs of non-perishable food items were distributed to local food pantries. United Way facilitated a collection of school supplies for distribution through the Stuff the Bus effort. Over 12,000 items were collected and approximately 1,200 children and youth benefited from the effort. School supplies were distributed through The Place, Family Haven and Forsyth County School Social Workers. The Holiday Giving Tree efforts provided 2,500 children with gifts.

United Way hosted the hospitality Suite at the 9th Annual Senior Expo, the largest event for seniors in the county. We collaborated with United Way of Metro Atlanta to bring Early Learning Substitute Teacher Training to Forsyth County. We also facilitated community conversations regarding food insecurity and homelessness.

#### Resource Development/Image Committee Highlights

2011 Campaign results (raised in fall of 2010 and distributed in 2011) - \$1,621,515 pledged. The Dawson County campaign raised \$102,836 in pledges on a goal of \$100,000. UPS continues to be the largest campaign, followed by Publix SuperMarkets, PCL Construction and Forsyth County Public Schools.

The 9<sup>th</sup> Annual Day of Caring event was held in conjunction with the campaign kick-off. Over 600 volunteers participated at 32 different locations throughout the county.

The Flavors of Forsyth event was held for the second year with proceeds to campaign tripling over the previous first year event.

#### Internal Operations Highlights

In 2011, United Way of Forsyth County conducted a board self-assessment which is a common practice among high functioning nonprofit boards. We conduct this self-assessment routinely and review the results in order to make improvements to our processes.

The board revisited the possibility of finding a permanent home for the United Way offices. It was felt that funds that were being held as a result of a bequest to the United Way back in 2006 would be used for this purpose. A search of property began in early 2011.

Strategic planning continued throughout 2011. New board members and new community investment members had orientation before year-end, 2010 for beginning their terms in 2011.
