**GUIDELINES FOR SUBMITTING
PROPOSALS TO THE WISEHEART FOUNDATION**

1. The Wiseheart Foundation is a private foundation organized under the laws of the State of Florida and recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as an organization described in Sections 501(c)(3) and 509(2)(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. It was established in 1953 for the following purposes according to its Charter as amended:

"To give financial assistance to churches, Sunday schools, home and foreign missions, and other religious organizations preaching the Gospel; to promote Christian stewardship of money and possessions; to assist persons in obtaining an education; to assist the needy and unprivileged; to relieve the poor and distressed, to lessen the burdens of government, and to promote the social welfare by accomplishing the foregoing purposes; to lessen neighborhood tensions, to eliminate prejudice and discrimination by owning and operating, directly or indirectly, housing facilities which shall be made available to the poor and the distressed at a reasonable rate or which shall be sold to the poor and distressed in furtherance of the foregoing purposes; to render financial aid to charitable and benevolent organizations, and in general to be a benevolent corporation operating exclusively for benevolent and charitable purposes."

2. The Wiseheart Foundation is willing to provide financial assistance to other organizations sharing the same or similar charitable objectives, provided that such organizations are established for non-profit purposes and have been formally recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) and further provided that such organizations are not private foundations within the meaning of "Section 509(a)(2)." The Wiseheart Foundation does not make grants directly to individuals.

3. The Wiseheart Foundation does not solicit funds from the public and, except in unusual circumstances, does not accept grants from members of the public or from other organizations.

4. In accordance with applicable law and Internal Revenue Regulations, the Wiseheart Foundation makes available to members of the public copies of its three (3) most recent annual Returns of Private Foundations (IRS Forms 990-PF). Such documentation is provided without charge (other than a reasonable fee for copying and mailing). Persons seeking to obtain such documentation in person may do so by applying to the Foundation's office at 2840 S.W. Third Avenue, Miami, Florida, in which event only payment of copying charges is required. Twenty-four hours advance notice of an intended office visit is always appreciated but is not strictly required.

5. Strong preference is given to organizations which carry out their religious or charitable activities within Miami-Dade County, Florida, and grants are made to other organizations only in unusual circumstances.

6. The Wiseheart Foundation is not set up to grant interviews prior to or in connection with the submission of grant proposals. Accordingly, no interviews or site visits can be scheduled by the Wiseheart Foundation prior to or in connection with the submission of grant applications. Once a written proposal has been received and a preliminary decision has been made by our organization to approve a grant, personal interviews and/or site visits may be requested by the officers of the Wiseheart Foundation.

7. Neither the officers nor the directors of the Wiseheart Foundation are in a position to participate in, to grant interviews in connection with, or otherwise respond to, surveys, opinion polls or other polls, marketing, feasibility or other studies or research or academic projects, nor are they in a position to provide counsel, advice or other information with respect to local community needs, strategies for fund-raising or suggestions for contacting other potential donors.

8. The Wiseheart Foundation does not use grant application forms. A proposal should be submitted in writing on the letterhead of the organization requesting the grant and signed by its Chief Executive Officer on behalf of its governing body. The following information should be included:

(a) The need which would be met by the grant requested.

(b) The manner in which the need would be met by the project or program proposed.

(c) The reasons which would indicate that the organization requesting the grant is the logical one to carry out the project.

(d) The qualifications of the staff leadership of the organization.

(e) A proposed budget for the project including other potential sources of support which may be forthcoming.

(f) Proposed methods for evaluating the project.

(g) An indication as to how the program will be supported after the requested grant expires.

(h) Background information and evidence of eligibility of the requesting organization as follows:

(1) A brief background on the organization.

(2) Identification of its directors and its officers.

(3) A copy of the organization's current operating budget.

(4) A copy of the organization's most recently audited financial statement.

(5) Evidence of tax exempt status in the form of correspondence from the Internal Revenue Service indicating that the requesting entity is an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) and is not a "private foundation" within the meaning of Section 509(a)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code.

9. The Wiseheart Foundation responds to all written correspondence, except for unsolicited printed mailings. We do not respond to duplicative or repetitive requests for funding after an initial application has been declined or provide the reasons for which a proposal for funding was not accepted or approved.

10. The willingness of the Wiseheart Foundation to explain the procedure for requesting a grant from the Wiseheart Foundation should not be construed as willingness or commitment on our part necessarily to approve the application submitted or to fund the requested project. All grant applicants should clearly understand that the Wiseheart Foundation reserves the exclusive right to approve or not to approve a grant application in its sole discretion and that a grant application may be rejected by the officers of the Wiseheart Foundation for financial or for any other reason. The approval or the funding of any particular grant proposal in any one year should not necessarily be construed as willingness or commitment on the part of the Wiseheart Foundation to make additional or similar grants in the future.
