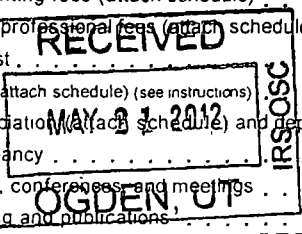

**PARTS IX-A and XV**

As general rule the Foundation does not accept grant applications. The Board of Directors makes expenditures only to carry out its specific exempt educational purposes. At the present time these expenditures are being made in support of programs that develop, promote and further the understanding of Japanese art, with particular attention to Japanese art from the Edo period.

The Foundation exhibits the art it owns at the Pavilion for Japanese Art, a wing of the Los Angeles County Museum of Art in Los Angeles, California, and at its exhibition facility in Corona Del Mar, California. The Pavilion for Japanese Art was built in large part with a \$5 million expenditure from the Foundation. In addition to exhibiting the art, the Foundation participates in the exhibition, scheduling and the manner in which the art is displayed.

Other activities include the Japanese/American workshop that brings together scholars who are interested in Japanese art from different universities in Japan and the United States. The scholars study the art that is owned by the Foundation and have the opportunity to exchange ideas with each other on educational projects and interest in Japanese art at the various universities. The Foundation also runs programs and participates with other institutions in introducing students to the understanding and appreciation of Japanese art.

Each year the Foundation brings colleges and graduate students to the Foundation for the purpose of studying Japanese art. The Foundation has developed a computerized digital imaging program to assist the students, scholars and others in the study of the Foundation's collection of Japanese art.

The Foundation's other major project involves the expenditures in furtherance of the understanding and appreciation of the architecture of Bruce A. Goff. Goff, now deceased, was a world-class architect and was the individual who designed the Pavilion for Japanese Art. The Foundation has supported a book that was published that describes the architecture of Goff and has also supported a museum show based on his drawings that was exhibited at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art and other museums throughout the United States. In addition, the Foundation is supporting an archival project so that architectural students and other persons interested can review in one place the work of Goff.
