HOW TO APPLY

May T. Henry was one of the most popular English teachers in the Oklahoma secondary school system. At the time of her retirement in 1957 she had taught for over 50 years in Tulsa and the surrounding area, primarily at Clinton and Daniel Webster High Schools. She was a graduate of the University of Oklahoma and held both B. S. and M. S. degrees in Education.

Her active role as a founding member of several PTAs helped nurture many of today's concepts in public education. In fact, a quotation of hers some 30 years later is still a profound comment on education today: "If parents are truly interested in what their children are doing, how they are coming along in class, and what kind of grades they're making, then students will also be interested in these things."

Before her death at the age of 93 on August 17, 1985, she established this trust to provide scholarships to the Oklahoma students she loved so much.

APPLICATION FOR SCHOLARSHIP MAY T. HENRY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

May T. Henry was a pioneer Oklahoma educator who believed no student should be deprived of quality education due to the lack of finances. For this reason, May established the scholarship fund which now bears her name.

Each scholarship of \$1,000 is granted directly to the student upon evidence of enrollment in an eligible institution. The scholarship may be renewed annually (for a maximum of four years) while the student remains in good academic standing.

ELIGIBILITY

Any student entering any field of study is eligible for the May T. Henry Scholarship. The student must meet these requirements:

- The student plans to attend a college, university or technical school supported by the state of Oklahoma.
- The student has graduated from an accredited high school or equivalent institution
- The student is not related to any member of the selection committee

CRITERIA

May T. Henry believed that students "who are deserving and show a willingness to work hard" should be the prime candidates for her scholarships. For these reasons, the selection committee tries to be flexible in its review of scholarship candidates. It not only considers need and scholastic performance, but also looks for those traits which May held in such high regard.

In addition to the above information, each Applicant should submit the following items:

- Three letters of recommendation: one of them should be from a teacher.
- A one-page letter which expresses the goals Applicant is working toward or what Applicant expects from their education, and explanation of financial need.
- A copy of the Applicant's most recent Transcript.




