Part II. Section C#17B. In 2011, Alfanar, Inc., US secured 11.47% public support from 10 donors (from 7.76% in 2010); thus meeting the 10% test needed to secure its 501(c)3 public charity status. Plans to add 1-2 new Directors in 2011 were temporarily postponed due to the fluid political situation throughout the Arab region in 2011. In 2012, Alfanar, Inc., US is committed to growing the Board, strengthening its fundraising outreach, and growing the critical support it provides grassroots organisations working to improve lives in the Arab region. Alfanar, Inc., US aims to work with a professional fundraising consultant in 2012 to cultivate and solicit support from a more diverse group of individuals, corporations, and trusts in the hope of reaching beyond the 33 1/3% test in years to come.

Alfanar, Inc., US grants support innovative community-based organizations serving disadvantaged communities in Egypt to implement their social social projects (in education, health, women's empowerment, employment generation) in financially sustainable ways. In 2011, Alfanar, Inc., US grants supported the implementation of 2 development projects with Egyptian organizations: the Future Lights for Development Organization (FLDO) and Kelmetna Association for Dialogue and Development. Of the \$90,000 dispersed by Alfanar, Inc., US in grants, the \$10,000 donated by the Amjad and Suha Bseisu Family Foundation was restricted to fund Year 2 of FLDO's early childhood education supervisor training programme. This programme aims to strengthen the instructional capacity of 26 nursery school supervisors working in Cairo's slum areas to implement a Montessori curriculum. Remaining funds allowed Kelmetna to implement a multi-faceted resiliency-building programme benefiting 150 children at risk of abuse and violence living in El Marg, one of Cairo's informal settlements.

Additionally, Alfanar, Inc., US grants were used to screen and conduct due diligence on 2 new social projects in Cairo and Minia, which were approved in December 2011. Alfanar, Inc., US's grants also help maintain Alfanar's teams in London and Cairo, which provide critical support and guidance to all grassroots partners around strategic planning, budgeting, marketing, and monitoring & evaluation.

In 2012, Alfanar, Inc., US grants will support Alfanar's plans to broaden its impact on marginalized communities in Egypt and beyond, by supporting scoping efforts to identify promising social projects in Lebanon and Libya. By increasing the breadth, depth, and scale of its social impact in the Arab region, Alfanar, Inc., US strives to transform its image from successful start-up to institutional change agent for the Arab region. In turn, the Alfanar, Inc., US Board of Directors aims to support this ambitious social development programme by securing increasing levels of public interest and support.

In 2011, Alfanar, Inc , US's grants made to Alfanar (charity registered in England and Wales number 1105048) helped develop and strengthen

Alfanar's venture philanthropy portfolio and activities in Egypt. Alfanar, Inc , US's grants helped maintain an office in Egypt composed of

two full-time development specialists. The Egypt team is responsible for implementing Alfanar's venture philanthropy activities including

1) administering financial grants to social purpose organizations selected through a structured screening process against approved criteria,

2) providing regular guidance to charity grantees to improve project design, implementation, and management systems, and

3) sourcing professional volunteer expertise to assist partners in overcoming specific management challenges, especially those related to the

achievement of financial sustainability. In 2011, Alfanar, Inc , US grants helped grow the portfolio of local nonprofit grantees from 6 to 7

In 2011, Alfanar, Inc , US's grants were specifically used to support the development activities of the Kelmetna Association for Dialogue and

Development and the Future Lights for Development Organisation (FLDO) early childhood education training programme for supervisors. Kelmetna

works to build resiliency in children at risk of extreme violence and to treat victims of child abuse in El Felaha, a densely populated area within

El Marg, one of Cairo's largest informal slum settlements. Kelmetna is working with schools in El Marg to combat child abuse and other

forms of violence directed towards children. In 2011, 124 children were given counseling and the opportunity to channel their energies into

beneficial activities. 13 youth leaders and 6 teachers were trained by Kelmetna to undertake the above-mentioned activities. 9 school

teachers from schools not associated with the programme were also trained to deliver resilience-building activities to children in their

respective schools. Additionally, 77 parents benefited from awareness-raising sessions regarding children's health and psychological

needs, child rights, and abuse. Kelmetna identified 12 cases, which were referred to a psychologist for further counselling.

Alfanar, Inc , US's grants helped Kelmetna impact the lives of 124 children, 13 youth, 15 school teachers and 77 parents in 2011.

Alfanar, Inc , US's \$10,000 grant to FLDO's early childhood education training programme for supervisors allowed FLDO to provide 18 days of training

to 26 supervisors covering critical topics within the Montessori curriculum such as design and management of the Montessori curriculum, daily life and

sensorial enhancement, negotiation & planning skills, geography, history, science, pronunciation of letters and words and using games & activities to

develop hand-eye coordination.

Finally, the remaining funds were directed to screening and conducting due diligence on 2 new projects in Cairo and Minia which were

approved in December, 2011. Alfanar, Inc , US's grants also helped maintain Alfanar's offices in Cairo and London, which works intensively with all grass-

roots partners to strengthen their project designs and budgets, to develop sustainable strategic plans, and to effectively implement and evaluate them.
