MISSION St. Luke's Episcopal Health System (SLEHS), serving all God's children as the health ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas, seeks to raise the quality of life by enhancing community health through the delivery of superior value health services. In collaboration with its medical staff, SLEHS is dedicated to excellence and compassion in caring for the whole person-body, mind and spirit. Core Values SLEHS also is committed to the growth and development of its employees, and to securing the health of future generations by creating, applying and disseminating knowledge through education and research. Integrity Being completely honest in everything we do is the basis of our actions. Valuing People Taking care of people, including patients and employees, is the reason we exist. Excellence Striving to enhance high quality is our constant pursuit. Goal Orientation Focusing on what we want to achieve helps design the best way to realize our vision. Stewardship Enhancing our stewardship through transparency, fiscal discipline, accountability, efficient management and maximization of resources. Core Purpose SLEHS's commitment to Faithful, Loving Care is the articulation of our duty to work at a sacred vocation in a faith-based environment where all beliefs are welcome. It embodies the concept of everyone caring every day, a concept open to all who are compassionate and willing to go the extra distance for patients. It relates to the faith-based reason we exist, encompasses all job classifications and speaks to employees, physicians, patients and their families. The Faithful, Loving Care promise is firmly rooted in an accountability framework to measure whether SLEHS is living true to its core purpose. Overview St. Luke's Episcopal Health System (SLEHS) is comprised of St. Luke's Episcopal Hospital in the Texas Medical Center, founded in 1954 by the Episcopal Diocese of Texas, St. Luke's The Woodlands Hospital, opened in 2003, St. Luke's Sugar Land Hospital, opened in 2008, St. Luke's Lakeside Hospital, opened in 2009, St. Luke's Hospital at The Vintage, opened in 2010, St. Luke's Patients Medical Center, acquired in 2010, and St. Luke's Episcopal Health Charities, founded in 1997 for the purpose of assessing and enhancing community health, especially among the underserved. SLEHS is organized to enable the Episcopal Diocese of Texas to carry out its mission of directly providing healthcare and related education and research services. SLEHS provides governance and administrative support for all SLEHS entities. In 2011, SLEHS expended approximately \$90 million in support of the delivery of healthcare services by the SLEHS entities. Services provided by SLEHS enable the efficient and effective operation of SLEHS entities, driving quality outcomes and ensuring the preservation of the mission of the SLEHS. SLEHS directly provides governance, management and financial support for each of the SLEHS entities. Services provided by the SLEHS include, but are not limited to the following: accreditation support, business development, cash and investment management, consultative arrangements, corporate communications, employee benefits, financial services, health system administration, human resource administration, information systems support, legal services, materials management, medical record coding, medical staff services, new construction administration, operations analysis, organizational development, patient financial services, patient safety and regulatory readiness, payroll services, quality and service excellence, telecommunications, internal audit and employee wellness services. Net Patient Revenues Total projected revenues for all SLEHS entities were expected to reach \$1.30 billion in 2011. Number of Employees More than 970 new hires joined the SLEHS Family in 2011, bringing the total number of employees to 6,884. Charity Care In 2011, SLEHS provided charity care through its six hospitals valued at total of \$82.3 million for services to patients who were unable to pay for healthcare services. Uncompensated Care Through its six hospitals, SLEHS also absorbed bad debt in excess of \$106 million as a result of services provided to patients who failed to pay their bills. Standard & Poor's Credit Rating Standard & Poor's affirmed AA-' rating, with stable outlook. The 'AA-' long-term rating reflects St. Luke's improved balance sheet and continuing improvements in operating margins. As noted by S&P, this long-term rating also reflects SLEHS's sound business position as one of Houston's most renowned institutions, with additional delivery locations in growing suburban metropolitan service areas that have bolstered market presence, and increased patient volumes across the system. Spirit of Wellness Program To encourage employees to become and remain healthier, the Spirit of Wellness program incentives were revamped to help offset the increase in medical premiums for 2012. Onsite health screenings were offered at SLEHS facilities at no cost to employees and their enrolled spouses. Each employee was eligible for a one-time \$100 reward for completion of the online CIGNA Health Risk Assessment. Employees can earn Wellness Credits, up to \$40 per paycheck, toward decreasing their medical coverage costs. Community Outreach In October 2011 SLEHS was the second-largest participating organization at the Komen Houston Race for the Cure. More than 230 employees, friends and family were volunteers and race participants. In addition to being a race sponsor, SLEHS personnel supported the breast cancer awareness cause by raising more than \$11,000 in donations. Information Technology In the evolving 21st century healthcare market, SLEHS executive and physician leaders are pursuing a fully integrated clinical software suite with the adoption of a new health information technology strategy. Information Technology Services hosted a two-day event in August for all SLEHS medical staff and employees to explore the benefits of EPIC, an integrated patient care environment. More than \$50 million will be required to achieve full implementation on SLEHS computers. St. Luke's Online SLEHS's Web Center continues to expand patient information available through its websites including a new video player feature and calendar of events. Videos available include patient stories, media interviews on health topics and patient and physician interviews. The calendars promote System-wide events, including free health screenings, seminars, healthy cooking demonstrations and support group meetings. Keeping up with the latest advertising and marketing strategies, SLEHS has incorporated Quick Response (QR) tags on various marketing ads. The tags allow the public to scan the code with their smartphones, which takes them directly to a SLEHS Web site to obtain additional information or register for an event. SLEHS continues to post daily Twitter updates, or "tweets," for all SLEHS facilities. Tweets include news, patient stories, upcoming events and general health-related articles.
